2019/2020 Annual Report and Annual Electors Meeting

At the Council meeting held 28 September 2021, Council adopted the 2019/2020 Annual Report subject to some minor amendments. The Report will be available for downloading from the website from Friday 1 October 2021. Now that the report has been adopted, the Annual Electors Meeting will be held on Tuesday 12 October 2021 at the Kojonup Sporting Complex commencing at 6.00pm.

Auditors are now progressing the 2020/2021 interim report and the Council is working with the Office of Auditor General (OAG) in completing the audit in a timely manner compared to the previous financial year. The OAG is aware of the impact the delay has on local governments and interaction with the community but are working with us to make the process more efficient.

Other items on the Agenda which were progressed by Council are as follows:

Kojonup Bowling Club Inc. - Grant Application

The Bowling Club made contact with the Shire of Kojonup (Shire) in early 2021 to begin discussions on the need to expand their existing main green from a 7 rink green to a 10 rink green, given an increase in competitive and social playing members.

Council have subsequently considered supporting the Kojonup Bowling Club Inc. (Bowling Club) Grant Application through the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) for the expansion of bowling green facilities.

A requirement of the CSRFF grant process is to obtain support from the Bowling Club's relevant local government and to verify proposed funding sources. This is a very valuable project with a high community need and the officer recommendation to support the application, including a 2022/2023 budget allocation of \$114,500.00 was endorsed by council.

Moonies Hill Energy Pty Ltd Request to Amend Conditions of Approval for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm. Moonies Hill Energy Pty Ltd has applied to the Shire to amend specific conditions of their development

approval for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm as follows:

- Change the 'substantial commencement' date to reflect the WA Government State of Emergency planning exemptions issued in April 2020 that extended approval dates for projects to commence;
- Include a new 7 turbine site layout; and
- Include a new wind turbine model (Vestas V150 4.2MW).

Council has approved the amendment to Turbines located in its shire.

> Early voting is open and continues until 4pm Friday, 15 October 2021. Election Day voting commences 8am and concludes at 6pm Saturday, 16 October 2021.

Successful in Aged Care Grant application

In March of this year, the Shire of Kojonup applied for ACAR grant funding on behalf of Springhaven Lodge Aged Care. We have been successful in our application and will receive approximately \$282,000 for renovations to the facility. The upgrade plans include new vinyl flooring throughout the facility corridors and bedrooms, widening of all bedroom doorways with new "cat and kitten" style doors, built in wardrobes in every bedroom, wood-effect fibreglass handrails throughout the facility, and renovation of the Treatment room including new flooring, shelving and wider doorway.

We are very excited for these upgrades, which we expect to commence in the coming months, and will endeavour for minimal interruption to our residents' everyday lives.



- ✓ And most importantly encouraging visitation into the Kodja Place and tourists to come back to Kojonup.





Wildflower season

The White Spider Orchid (Caladenia longicauda) is now flowering at Farrar Reserve and Myrtle Benn Flora and Fauna. Fourteen subspecies are currently recognised and all have predominantly white flowers, with long filamentous petals and sepals.

The White Spider orchid is one of West Australia's most common and well-known orchid. During spring it is often seen in bushland near Perth and is particularly common in jarrah forests of the Darling Range. A single green hairy leaf, 10 - 25 centimetres long and 0.5 - 2 centimetres wide, is marked with reddish-purple spots and suffusions near the base.

The flower stem can grow between 25 – 60 centimetres tall and nears one to four creamy white flowers. The orchid grows in deep sandy soil in banksia and jarrah woodlands on the Swan Coastal Plain, in well-drained gravelly loams and sands of the jarrah forest and in clay barns further inland.



The Red Beaks (Pyrorchis nigricans) is now flowering at Kojonup's Myrtle Benn Flora and Fauna Sanctuary. Red Beaks is readily distinguished by its leaves and flowers, with their distinctive beaked dorsal sepal and prominently fringed labellum.

Red Beaks has a ground-hugging, fleshy oval leaf, three to fifteen centimetres long and three to four centimetres across. The flowers emit a strong, sweet fragrance that is almost overpowering on warm still days.

Red Beaks is one of the State's most widespread orchids. In WA, it grows north to Shark Bay, east to Israelite Bay and inland to Hyden.

LANDCARE

Incorporating Nature into Farming Systems

On Sunday the 19th of September an enthusiastic group of 20 attended a property in Kojonup for the Incorporating nature into farming systems event. We were lucky to have some Kojonup local plant and bird specialists to guide the group through the remnant bushland and wetlands on the property. There were over 35 birds identified on the walk including a number of breeding and nesting birds. The range of plant species were well over 120 different trees shrubs and groundcovers with standouts being stands of 100+ old swamp paperbark (*Melaleuca rhaphiopylla*), rare and endangered Conostylis species, and hundreds of - Green Spider Orchids (*Caladenia falcata*). The purpose of the event was to showcase how retaining and building on existing vegetation through revegetation, planting for shelter belts, fencing remnants with controlled grazing and installation of drainage systems can many on farm benefits.

These practices are in line with the current Enhanced Remnant Pilot program through the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment and the Australian National University which is aiming to see farmers supported through private investment for the protection, enhancement and management of biodiversity on their properties.

Supporter of the event South West Catchment Council are participating in the development of processes for the Pilot in this region. 


AWESOME ARTS ARTIST IN RESIDENCY PROGRAM
