Did you know?


The International Booker Prize has revealed the 'Man Booker Dozen' of 13 novels in contention for this year. This Prize celebrates the finest works of translated fiction from around the world.

The Man Booker International Prize is awarded every year for a single book, which is translated into English and published in the UK. The work of translators is equally rewarded, with the £50,000 prize divided between the author and the translator of the winning entry.

The shortlist of six books will be announced on 2 April, with the winner to be revealed on 19 May.

What should I read next?

Of ashes and rivers that run to the sea – Marie Munkara:




A heartbreaking, darkly funny and deeply moving memoir from a fearlessly talented writer. (This is truly a book worth taking the time to read, and is my reading choice this month.)

Delivered on the banks of the Mainoru River by her two full-blood grandmothers, Marie Munkara was born with light skin which meant one thing - it would only be a matter of time before she would be taken by the authorities and given to a white family to be raised. Then twenty-eight years later an old baptismal card falling out of a book changed the course of her life forever. It was a link to her past. Knowing that she had to follow her heart or forever live to regret it Marie set out to find the family that she had lost, leaving her strict white Catholic parents aghast - why dig up the past? With devastating honesty, humour and courage, the award-winning author

of Every Secret Thing shares her extraordinary journey of discovery to find her origins.

Golden in Death (#50) – J.D.Robb:



When Kent Abner - baby doctor, model husband and father, good neighbour - is found dead in his town house in the West Village, Detective Eve Dallas and her team have a real mystery on their hands. Who would want to kill such a good man? They know how, where and when he was killed but why did someone want him dead?




The Widow of Ballarat – Darry Fraser:



A compulsively readable story of passion, adventure and a woman's quest for independence set against the colourful backdrop of 19th century Bendigo and the goldfields of Ballarat. 1854, Ballarat, Victoria When Nell Amberton's husband is shot dead by a bushranger, there are few who grieve his passing, and Nell least of all. How could she miss the monster who had abused her from the day they wed – the man who had already killed his innocent first wife? But his death triggers a chain of events that seem to revolve around the handsome bushranger who murdered him – a man to whom Nell, against her better judgement, is drawn. But Nell has far more than a mysterious stranger to worry about. With a mess of complications around her late husband's will, a vicious scoundrel of a father trying to sell her off in matrimony, and angry relatives pursuing her for her husband's gold, she is more concerned with trying to ensure her safety and that of her friend, goldfields laundry woman Flora, than dealing with the kind of feelings that led her

astray so catastrophically before. After the violence on the goldfields, Nell's fate also hangs in the balance. It seems that, after all, she might need to do the one thing she has avoided at all costs ... ask for the help of a man.

Field of Poppies – Carmen Bird:



Keen to escape the pressures of city life, Marsali Swift and her husband William are drawn to Listowel, a glorious historic mansion in the seemingly tranquil small town of Muckleton. There is time to read, garden, decorate, play chess and befriend the locals. Yet one night Listowel is robbed, and soon after a neighbour is murdered. The violent history of the couple's adopted Goldfields town is revealed, and plans for a new goldmine emerge. Subtle and sinister details unnerve: the novels that are studied at book club echo disappearances and colonial transgressions, a treasured copy of Monet's Field of Poppies recalls loves and dreams but also times of war.

Atmospheric and beguiling this is a novel that seduces the reader with mysteries and beauties but also speaks of something much larger. The planet is in trouble, but is the human race up to the challenge? Are Marsali and William walking

blindfold into a hostile world?

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEWS



The Magic Coat is a tool to help create confident, calm and caring kids who know how to problem solve, feel safe and manage their emotions appropriately so that they have good mental health and well-being.

The Magic Coat program helps children learn to take control and responsibility for their own world and to create positive relationships with adults and children around them. Focusing on prevention rather than cure, it provides children with social and emotional strategies from a young age, which can have a significant impact on mental health in later years.

Di holds a Bachelor of Social Science in Women and Children Studies, and a Diploma of Education. After teaching both nationally and internationally, Di was astounded at the number of children who were unable to focus at school. After some research, Di discovered that most of these children loved school but could not focus because of all the worries that they had going on in their lives. This is when The Magic Coat Program was developed.


