COUNCIL BRIEFS

Medical Centre

The announcement by Federal Member for O'Connor, Rick Wilson MP on Friday 1 March that the Federal Government would contribute \$750k towards a new Medical Centre under the Community Health and Hospitals Program was very welcomed by Council and the Kojonup Community. Katanning is to receive \$505k under the same Program for a Medical Centre as part of the conversion of the Old Council Building.

It is essential that Council receives and executes the Commonwealth Financial Funding Agreement allowing these funds to be released on or before 31 March as the impending Federal Election in May 2019 may see government business suspended from 1 April until after the election.

Any pledges made up until 31 March that is not formerly executed by way of signed agreements will not be recognised. Kojonup and other Great Southern Shires were subject to this disappointment when the previous State Government pledged \$11M towards the Great Southern Housing Initiative Project because the Funding Agreements were not signed off by all parties prior to the State Election, and the new state government did not recognise the pledge. It took more than 12 months for the State Government to allocate \$2.6M under the Regional Aged Appropriate Project.

The application lodged by Council with the Federal Health Minister indicated the dollar value of community support to be in excess of \$200k. The George Church Community Medical Centre Inc. work group advised Council at the 5 February 2019 Briefing Session that this amount can be achieved. Aligned with the building works is the preparation of tenancy/management agreements which clearly articulate the terms and conditions attached to the Medical Centre to attract and retain Medical/Health Services as occupancy of the building is critical to sustainable service provision.

Council looks forward to progressing these and other matters with the George Church Community Medical Centre Inc.

Sports Complex

Works at the Complex are 90% complete with sealing of internal roadway, extension of footpaths, bollards, lighting, battering of cul de sacs, paving, balustrade and pedestrian access to be finalised over the next 2-3 weeks. Community comments received form part of the work specifications and are included in the final components of the project.

OPPORTUNITY TO PROMOTE KOJONUP IN PERTH

UPCOMING GRANTS

Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR)

The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) has made \$440,000 available for <u>Strengthening Rural Community – Small & Vital grants</u> to support the broad needs of small rural, regional and remote communities across Australia.

The grants include \$299,000 targeted to focus areas and geographic regions. Funds are aimed at helping in education, capacity-building, poverty and disadvantage, health, culture, the arts, tourism and heritage, healthy ageing and Indigenous wellbeing.

Applications from not-for-profits in communities of fewer than 15,000 people have priority.

Applications close Tuesday, 26 March 2019.

Registrations open WA State Heritage & History Conference, 29-30 April, Westin Hotel

The conference theme for 2019 is 'Handle with Care'. Custodians and curators are generally familiar with conservation and care in the physical context of places, stories and collections that can face many threats including environment, time, misuse, neglect or even misguided good intent that can unfortunately corrode, corrupt or devalue what needs to be protected.

The conference seeks to also explore other elements of heritage, history and collections that may get overlooked which need to be 'handled with care'.

'Dark Heritage' is the concept that recognises the need to reflect on all elements of the past no matter how uncomfortable or those that may have been hidden from view when attempting to understand and interpreting a place. However, knowing how to

handle these elements with care and sensitivity requires proper guidance to avoid the risk of sensationalism and shock tactics that trivialise historical events whose impact may still be felt within current generations.

If treated carefully, these darker elements of our past have the potential to enhance and build the understanding of the visitor with a balanced and informed history, whilst respecting and acknowledging the impacts of past acts.
