#### **COUNCIL BRIEFS**

The Council meeting was held on 17 November and proceedings commenced with a presentation to Mrs Michelle Dennis in recognition of the 6 years of service Michelle has given to the Shire of Kojonup and the community.



Continuing with the formalities, some of the outcomes are as follows:

#### 10.1 - The Kodja Place

That Council:

- Continues to work collaboratively with all stakeholders to address each of the Master Plan/Curatorial Audit recommendations and other suggestions in order to rank and prioritise what can realistically be achieved short/medium/long term;
- 2. Upon recommendations being ranked/prioritised determine funding options available and prepare submissions/applications;
- 3. Requests the Chief Executive Officer to prepare draft Memorandum of Understanding with
  - I. Kojonup Aboriginal Corporation
  - II. Kodja Place Community Fund Inc.
  - III. Kojonup Historical Society

incorporating collaboration, roles, functions, responsibilities and reporting requirements regarding the Storyplace/Gallery and Kodja Place Precinct;

4. Appoint Cr Cindy Wieringa to the Storyplace/Gallery Work Group as an additional Council representative.

#### 11.1 Bush Fire Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes 29 October 2020

Council received the minutes of the meeting and resolved to agree to review the 20/21 Fire Break Order at the April 2021 Council meeting.

#### 11.2 - Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) Minutes 26 October 2020

Council received the minutes of the LEMC meeting held 26 October 2020 and endorsed the Standalone Bushfire Plan 2020-2021 for the Kojonup District High School Farm.

#### 11.3 - Bushfire Management Plan – Kojonup Waste Transfer Station

Council adopted a Bushfire Management Plan for the Kojonup Waste Transfer Station.

#### 11.4 – Great Southern Treasures – Strategic Plan 2020-2023

The Great Southern Treasures (GST) Committee has been reviewing its governance arrangements and long term plans. The development of a strategic plan for GST represents an excellent opportunity for GST to focus its efforts on the bigger picture in a more coordinated manner.

Council resolved to endorsed the GST Strategic Plan and Forward Directions 2020 – 2023

#### 12.3 - Annual Meeting of Electors - 2018/2019 Financial Year

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic the WA Government released the Local Government (COVID-19 Response) Order 2020 which essentially deferred Annual Electors Meeting. This order has now been amended and the Annual Electors Meeting will be held on Tuesday 8 December 2020, at the Sporting Complex on Benn Parade, commencing at 1.00pm.

#### 12.4 - Occupational Health and Safety Audit Report 2020

Council received the Local Government Insurance Service Tier 2 Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Audit report. The inaugural OSH Annual Management Review took place over two days in August 2020, with all Managers in attendance for both or one of the days. This review highlighted the noted improvements from all departments, which is reflected in the results of the 2020 LGIS OSH Audit being 98%. An excellent result.

#### 12.6 - Kojonup Saleyards

Council resolved to close the Saleyards as of 1 January 2021 however, the truckwash will be retained for use and will be maintained by the Shire. Council also endorsed the CEO commencing the process to call for Expressions of Interest for the Management of the Saleyards (as is), closing April 2021.

#### 15.1 - Housing - George Church Community Medical Centre Inc.

Given the joint public notification by GCCMC Inc. and St Luke's Family Practice that the new Medical Centre will be leased to St Luke's Family Practice, Council resolved that it will give due consideration to disposal (Lease/Sale) options for 34 Katanning Road, including self-supporting loan considerations on or before 16 March 2021.




**The Golden Key – Marian Womack:** An extraordinary, page-turning Gothic mystery set in the wilds of the Norfolk Fens from a BSFA-shortlisted author London, 1901.

After the death of Queen Victoria the city heaves with the uncanny and the eerie. Séances are held and the dead are called upon from darker realms. Samuel Moncrieff, recovering from a recent tragedy of his own, meets Helena Walton-Cisneros, one of London's most reputed mediums. But Helena is not what she seems and she's enlisted by the elusive Lady Matthews to solve a twenty-year-old mystery: the disappearance of her three stepdaughters who vanished without a trace on the Norfolk Fens.

But the Fens are a liminal land, where folk tales and dark magic still linger. With locals that speak of devilmen and catatonic children found on the Broads, Helena finds the answer to the mystery leads back to where it started: Samuel Moncrieff.

Using the latest research and a wealth of personal experiences, this is the fact-based, no-nonsense approach to birth, child health, and shared child-rearing you have been waiting for. Many expectant parents will be surprised and relieved to hear the following-breastfeeding doesn't protect against allergies; sterilising bottles and dummies is unnecessary in most countries; and if you think you shouldn't drink alcohol when breastfeeding, you've been taken in by plain moralism and not scientific evidence. And by the way, you can forget the housework and prescribed routines- as long as you attend to your baby's basic needs and maintain your social and work connections, you'll be doing just fine.



#### **Remember to Watch Around Water**

Please remember with the summer season getting into full swing that the following supervision rules apply at the Pool.

- Children under 5 must have a Swimming Adult in the water with them at all times.
- Parents and guardians with children under 10 must be dressed and ready to enter the water.
- Children under 10 must be actively supervised by a responsible person over the age of 16.

#### **Aqua Aerobics**

Our fantastic Aqua Aerobics classes are held on Monday's and Thursday's from 5:30pm to 6:30pm. Cost is \$10.00 per session which includes pool entry or \$8.00 for holders of a season pass. Come down and give this enjoyable exercise class a try, you will be amazed how great a workout it really is.

#### **Be Alert for BEES**

As we have had a pretty dry winter we are getting more activity from BEES this year at the pool than in the past. If your child is allergic please keep a close eye on where they are and if there are any Bees in the water around them. The best thing to do is to get a leaf, pick them up with it the take them over to the trees to recover. If you or any of your children do get stung I have tweezers and cold packs available for use.



If you want a great day out for your child's birthday party then don't hesitate to book in to the pool and have a great time splashing around with family and friends in the sparkling Kevin O'Halloran Memorial Swimming Pool. Please let the pool staff know in advance if possible as then if anything comes up we can notify you. Also please remember that whilst having parties at the pool is great all children must still be actively supervised by parents and guardians as parties can also be at time where parents gather and chat and forget to keep watch.
