COUNCIL BRIEFS

Recruitment

Chief Executive Officer

The position has been advertised and full Council is now in the process of assessing applications. The implementation of the Local Government (Administration) Amendment Regulations, Model Standards for CEO Recruitment, Performance and Termination 2021, requires that as part of the recruitment and selection process, Council must appoint an "independent person" to the selection panel. This person should have experience in the recruitment and selection of CEO's and/or senior executives however cannot be, a human resources consultant or employee of the local government. On 23 February via a Special Council Meeting, Council appointed Mr Bruce Manning as the independent person in order to prepare a short list for interview.

Manager Regulatory Services

Interviews are being conducted and it is hoped that an appointment will be made within the next few weeks.

Environmental Health Officer - Resource Sharing Arrangement

Interviews have been conducted and it is hoped that an appointment will be made within the next two weeks.

Registered Nurse

After an extensive recruitment search, Council welcomes Tandin to our team.

Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF) - Round 5

A submission has been lodged seeking funds to improve infrastructure at the Kodja Place and Sports Complex.

BBRF is a \$1 billion federal fund which is heavily subscribed but Kojonup's projects meet all the criteria.

An application for \$150,000 has been lodged under the "Driver Reviver" Program to increase the capacity of the existing public toilets at Kojonup Park.

BIG RBDIGITAL and LIBBY NEWS!

As of February 23, all RBdigital magazines (46,000 of them!) will move to the *Libby* app (part of Overdrive). RBdigital won't close down straight away: it's going to remain available for a few weeks, so after the move you'll still be able to finish anything that you've already borrowed, but you'll need to use *Libby* for anything new.

- Use *Libby* already? Lucky you, you don't need to do anything else!
- New to *Libby*? All you need to get started is your library card number and PIN number (default is 6395).
- You can find the *Libby* link on our website or if you're using a smart phone or tablet, download the award-winning *Libby* app in the Apple App Store and on Google Play.

Libby App User Guide

Libby allows access to a large collection of eAudiobooks and eBooks from Overdrive on your mobile device.







- Download **Libby App** from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store for Android.
- Open the Libby App.
- Click **Yes**, you have a library card.
- Under the search for Library type in and select Western Australia Public Libraries.
- Enter your library card barcode to sign in.
- Tap on the magnifying glass to search for a title or tap on the Library or Explore buttons to browse collections.
- Find a title you wish to borrow or reserve. You can borrow up to 10 titles at one time and reserve up to 5 titles.
- Tap **Borrow** to loan a title.
- Or, tap on **Place a Hold** to reserve a title that is currently out on loan.
- You will be prompted to **manage notifications**, these will tell you when your loan is due and when your holds are ready. Once you have done this select **Hide**.
- Tap **Keep Browsing** if you wish to look for more titles, or click **Open Book / Open Audiobook** to download the title.
- Titles can be returned early by selecting **Manage Loan**, otherwise they will be automatically deleted at the end of their 14 day loan.

A new coordinator has commenced as of this week.




New Books to our Library:



The Secret-Code Breakers of Central Bureau – David Duffy: A ground breaking work of Australian military history, *The Code-Breakers of Central Bureau* tells the story of the country's significant code-breaking and signals-intelligence achievements during the Second World War. It reveals how Australians built a large and sophisticated intelligence network from scratch, how Australian code-breakers cracked Japanese army and air force codes, and how the code-breakers played a vital role in the battles of Midway, Milne Bay, the Coral Sea, Hollandia, and Leyte.

The book also reveals Australian involvement in the shooting down of Admiral Yamamoto near Bougainville in 1943, and how on 14 August 1945, following Japan's offer of surrender, an Australian intelligence officer established the Allies' first direct radio contact with Japan since the war had begun.

This is a rich historical account of a secret and little-understood side of the war, interwoven with lively personalities and personal stories. It is the story of Australia's version of Bletchley Park, of talented and dedicated individuals who significantly influenced the course of the Pacific War.



Black Wave – Kim Ghattas: For decades, the question has haunted the Arab and Muslim world, heard across Iran and Syria, Saudi Arabia and Pakistan, and in the author's home country of Lebanon. Was it always so? When did the extremism, intolerance and bloodletting of today displace the region's cultural promise and diversity?

In *Black Wave*, award-winning journalist and author Kim Ghattas argues that the turning point in the modern history of the Middle East can be located in the toxic confluence of three major events in 1979: the Iranian revolution; the siege of the Holy Mosque in Mecca; and the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. Before this year, Saudi Arabia and Iran

had been working allies and twin pillars of US strategy in the region - but the radical legacy of these events made them mortal enemies, unleashing a process that transformed culture, society, religion and geopolitics across the region for decades to come.

Drawing on a sweeping cast of characters across seven countries over forty years, Ghattas demonstrates how this rivalry for religious and cultural supremacy has fed intolerance, suppressed cultural expression, encouraged sectarian violence, birthed groups like Hezbollah and ISIS and, ultimately, upended the lives of millions. At once bold and intimate, Black Wave is a remarkable and engrossing story of the Middle East as it has never been told before.




Shuggie Bain – Douglas Stuart: It is 1981. Glasgow is dying and good families must grift to survive. Agnes Bain has always expected more from life. She dreams of greater things: a house with its own front door and a life bought and paid for outright (like her perfect, but false, teeth). But Agnes is abandoned by her philandering husband, and soon she and her three children find themselves trapped in a decimated mining town. As she descends deeper into drink, the children try their best to save her, yet one by one they must abandon her to save themselves. It is her son Shuggie who holds out hope the longest.

Shuggie is different. Fastidious and fussy, he shares his mother's sense of snobbish propriety. The miners' children pick on him and adults condemn him as no' right. But

Shuggie believes that if he tries his hardest, he can be normal like the other boys and help his mother escape this hopeless place.

Douglas Stuart's Shuggie Bain lays bare the ruthlessness of poverty, the limits of love, and the hollowness of pride. A counterpart to the privileged Thatcher-era London of Alan Hollinghurst's The Line of Beauty, it also recalls the work of Édouard Louis, Frank McCourt, and Hanya Yanagihara, it is a blistering debut by a brilliant novelist with a powerful and important story to tell.




The Road to Ironbark-Kaye Dobbie: 1874, The Victorian Goldfields. In the town of Ironbark, Aurora Scott faces ruin as the railways supplant the Cobb & Co coach line, the lifeline of her hotel. Aurora is no stranger to adversity; the formidable publican has pulled herself from a murky past to build a respectable life in Ironbark. But when bushrangers storm the hotel, taking hostages as leverage for the Starburst Mine's payroll, Aurora has more trouble on her hands than she can handle. This is no random act, but a complex scheme of revenge. The gang turn on each other. Shots ring out. And when the dust settles, the money has vanished, and so has Aurora Scott... After 150 years, the mystery of the missing payroll has passed into


folklore. And when journalist Melody Lawson helps her brother prepare for the town's annual Gold Hunt Weekend, she is just as drawn into the past as the tourists. But with a surprise inheritance her own family history becomes a puzzle, bound up with the fabled payroll - and as Melody follows the clues, danger mounts...



Kevin O'Halloran Memorial Swimming Pool has put up a list of upcoming bookings on the notice board to keep you all up to date on the activities that have been booked, so please have a look and come down and see some of the activities occurring here at the pool.

New World Record Sign

To provide further information on the Kojonup Olympian that our pool is named in honour of, Mr Kevin O'Halloran, a large sign has been erected showing the progression of the 4 x 200m Freestyle Relay World Record. From the first world record in 1908 with a time of 10:55:6 by Great Britain, through to today's current record of 06:58:06 by the United States, this sign shows how much the times have gone down over the years as well as all teams involved in achieving a new World Record. Importantly, the year Kevin and the Australian team broke the World Record winning gold at the Melbourne Olympics in 1956 is highlighted in bold lettering, so come on down and have a look at this great sign and how this has evolved through the ages.

Corporate Swim Challenge – Swim to Albany

Is your company up for the challenge?? We have started a 6 week swim challenge to finish off the swimming pool season and ask you and your team to come down and complete some laps. All you need is 4 swimmers and the effort to get into the water and move from one end to the other. There are really no other rules so if you want to wear fins or a snorkel you can - all we ask is you touch each end of the pool to complete 1 lap. So far we have 5 teams up and swimming and we look to add more teams in the near future.

The CHALLENGE SO FAR: Team Shire Sirens are well and truly out in front with 45.85K's swum due to being the most consistent swimmers, followed Leitch's Lobsters on 31.25K with Precise Trecise 29.7K coming in

So far after recording laps we have seen the swim club kids also record a combined total distance swum of 219.7K's which is an amazing distance and I will continue to keep track of how far they can go for the rest of the season.

Uncover the secret lives of the pests that live in your pantry!

Participants like you are important to the success of this onemonth surveillance program.

By taking part, you will be undertaking general biosecurity surveillance and assisting to protect our vital food industry.

Many unwanted pests are expert hitchhikers, making their way past WA's borders unseen, hidden inside shipping containers, furniture, and even the food you eat!

Your pantry could be a pit stop along their journey!

The next stop could be your backyard fruit and vegetables, your garden, local park or supermarket – on their way to cause devastation to our forests, paddocks and orchards.

Anyone who signs up for the program will receive a pack in the mail with a trap, assembly instructions and reporting tips.



Instructions for assembling the traps may be found on a detailed information sheet online and via an instructional video which will soon be available on this site, to guide you through the set up.

Participants will be asked to provide an initial set-up report, and then to report once a week for four weeks (five reports in total) about any pests found in the trap, via the MyPestGuide™ Reporter app.

DPIRD experts will identify pests and respond back to you via the app with findings. The app is free, easy to use and can be installed on any android smartphone or iPhone.

Even if no pests are found, program participants are still asked to take photos and send in reports.


