COUNCIL BRIEFS

At the Council meeting held 20 April 2021, recreation featured heavily as outlined below.

10.1 GREAT SOUTHERN 2050 CYCLING STRATEGY

The Great Southern Regional 2050 Cycling Strategy planning commenced in 2019, as part of the Western Australia Bike Network (WABN) being managed by the Department of Transport (DoT). As part of the works being completed by the DoT for the Great Southern Regional 2050 Cycling Strategy, DoT have requested representation from the Shire of Kojonup to be involved in the working group for this Strategy and this was supported by Council with the Shire of Kojonup's representative being the Sport and Recreation Officer.

10.2 KOJONUP SPORTS ALLIANCE – MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

The KSA was established with assistance from the Shire in late 2019, early 2020 following numerous workshops between the user groups of the Kojonup Sporting Complex and the KSA constitution states the following:

Vision: A supportive, connected Kojonup through sport and recreation Purpose: To have a positive impact on a happy, inclusive Kojonup

This proposed MOU is a first for the governance and operations of sport in the Shire of Kojonup and represents an important opportunity to evolve the management model of the Kojonup Sporting Complex.

Council agreed to "enter into the attached Memorandum of Understanding with the Kojonup Sports Alliance Inc. to promote a climate of mutual co-operation, professional respect and goodwill between parties".

10.3 KOJONUP SPORTING COMPLEX – RELOCATION OF NETBALL FACILITIES TO BOWLING CLUB

The proposal for two clubs to share facilities represents a 'once in a lifetime opportunity' in the development of Kojonup sporting facilities. The Shire has undertaken numerous workshops and planning sessions to encourage this sharing to occur and an opportunity to implement this concept has now arisen. As such, this agenda item sought a formal Council decision to move the netball facilities to enable sharing with the Kojonup Bowling Club.

Council's decision is as follows:

That:

1. The request from the Kojonup Netball Association and the Kojonup Bowling Club to move the netball facilities to the lawn bowls facilities be supported as per the following indicative plan;





- 2. The Council and Shire staff assist the Kojonup Netball Association and the Kojonup Bowling Club to begin sharing facilities and aligning their operations;
- 3. The current budgeted project Sporting Complex Netball Court Resurface & Roof (account C274) be amended by relocating the project in accordance with point 4 below; and
- 4. The Kojonup Sporting Precinct Master Plan be amended by the inclusion and/or relocation of the following points and diagram:
 - a) Four Netball Courts (two with roof cover, and two with a provision for future cover) to be located as illustrated below by red squares;
 - b) Extension of bowling green "B" westwards to increase green from a seven (7) rink green to a ten (10) rink green (as illustrated by green rectangle);
 - c) New Car Park (as illustrated by grey area) including kitchen/bar loading area on south west corner of Bowling Club House building; and
 - d) Two large water tanks (illustrated by blue circles) to manage storm water of netball roof area and provide water for "B" Bowling Green.

10.4 KOJONUP TRAILS MASTER PLAN

The development of the Great Southern Regional Trails Master Plan during 2019 and 2020 identified existing trails within the Shire that form part of the Shire of Kojonup Trails Master Plan.

Outdoor recreation is an integral part of creating a liveable region with thriving communities. Successful implementation of Trails Master Plans can result in an increased length of stay by visitors, promote repeat visitation and drive tourism dollars to local businesses. It will also entice locals and visitors to explore different values and experiences. Council's decision is as follows:

That:

- 1. The Shire of Kojonup Trails Master Plan be accepted; and
- 2. Council consider the implementation plan in future budget decisions.

Much easier keeping things healthy with an abundance of rain in the winter.



What's Flowering Now

The Common Bunny Orchid (Eriochilus dilatatus subsp. Multiflorus) is flowering now at Myrtle Benn Flora and Fauna Sanctuary. The majority of Eriochilus species flower in Autumn, well before most other WA Orchids have emerged from their summer dormancy. It is one of the first Orchids to appear each year and under ideal conditions it will bloom in large numbers.

The Hare Orchid (Leporella fimbriata) is flowering at Farrar Reserve. Leporella is Latin for hare and refers to the unusual flowers that resemble a hare. The Hare Orchid flowers between March and June however, individual flowers persist long after fertilisation and are still recognisable as late as August or September. Hare Orchids are widespread throughout the southwest, from Kalbarri to Israelite Bay and also extends through South Australia to Victoria.

Enter the Griffin!







No Spray Register

Town site Spraying - Applications to No Spray Register

The Shire is preparing the town site spraying program for 2021.

Applications are invited for road reserves frontage and for the frontage of Council land directly abutting a person's land, to be placed on the "No Spray Register".

To make an application, complete the No Spray Application Form located at the Shire office, Depot office and website, and lodge with the Council no later than Thursday 13 May 2021. An application is only be applicable to the entire frontage of resident's immediate property and for the area parallel to a distance of no greater than 10m.

In completing an application, the resident agrees to take over responsibility for:

- Controlling all National, State and Locally-listed pest plants;
- Keeping the road frontage clear and/or tidy;
- Keeping drainage and/or paths free of obstruction and fully operational at all times; and
- Ensuring kerbs, footpaths and gutters are free of vegetation growth.

In considering an application, the following shall be taken account:

- Whether the adjoining land is used for certified organic vegetable/fruit/cereal production;
- Existence of a medical condition in the household which may be exacerbated by exposure to herbicides or associated additives;
- The applicant has other mitigating circumstances that would warrant an area not being exposed to the use of herbicide chemicals.

Council reserves the right to reject any applications on the grounds that it is not within the overall interest of Council to include the area within the No Spray Register. Upon refusal of an application for the No Spray Register, Council Staff will reply in writing to the resident with the outcome. Where the application is approved, Council Staff will add the property onto the No Spray Register. Applications are non-transferrable.


