COUNCIL BRIEFS

At the Council meeting held 18 May 2021 Council considered 15 items. Some of the highlights are repeated below.

11.2 Bushfire Control Officer Recommendation 2021/2022

Council appointed the following positions for the 2021/2022 year.

- a) Tony Fisher Chief Bushfire Control Officer and Fire Weather Officer,
- b) Roger House Deputy Chief Bushfire Control Officer and Deputy Fire Weather Officer,
- c) Ross Fryer-Smith and Nick Trethowan Senior Bushfire Control Officers,

d) The Chief Bushfire Control Officer and the Deputy Chief Bushfire Control Officer be appointed as authorised officers to issue permits to burn for the collection of clover seed in the Shire,

e) The Chief Bushfire Control Officer, Deputy Chief Bushfire Control Officer and the two Senior Bush Fire Control Officer's be authorised to recommend to the Chief Executive Officer on the imposition of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans

11.3 Fire Break Order 2021/2022

Council adopted the 2021/2022 Fire Break order which includes new dates for firebreak inspections within the gazetted town site boundaries of Kojonup and Muradup.

Community members are advised that the date has now been moved forward by four weeks to 2 November 2021.

11.4 Bushfire Structure 2021/2022

The Bushfire Structure for the Shire of Kojonup as it relates to the 21/22 financial year given changes to nominated officers and Fire Break Inspection dates within the gazetted townsites, has now been updated.

12.4 Kojonup Historical Society Inc. – Machinery Shed

Council considered the Kojonup Historical Society's position to have a portion of part of Lot 2 Soldier Road owned by Jim and Robyn Potter subdivided as this was the original intent of the Historical Society in 2004.

Councils decision was to consider a financial contribution of \$12,000 within the 2021/2022 Annual Budget to progress the subdivision of the Machinery Shed located on part of Lot 2 Soldier Road owned by J & R Potter as it was believed that such an allocation would allow Council to commence the subdivision process in 21/22 financial year and clearly establish full costs of the process as a separate title owned by the Shire of Kojonup.

12.5 Model Code of Conduct for Elected Members, Committee Members and Candidates – Adoption

Council adopted the "Shire of Kojonup Code of Conduct for Elected Members, Committee Members and Candidates" (the Code) as required in *Division 9 Section 5.104 Adoption of model code of conduct,* of the *Local Government Act 1995*.



The Code has been developed to guide the decisions, actions and behaviours of members, in council, on council committees and candidates running for election as a council member. Members must comply with the provisions in the Code in fulfilling their role and responsibilities, as set out in the *Act*.

The Code is based on three overarching principles, separated into divisions, being:

Division 1 - Personal integrity: act with reasonable care and diligence; with honesty and integrity; act lawfully; identify and appropriately manage any conflict of interest; and avoid damage to the reputation of the local government.

Division 2 - Relationship with others: respect, courtesy and fairness; respect and value diversity in the community; contribute to a harmonious, safe and productive work environment

Division 3 - Accountability: base decisions on relevant, factually correct information; make decisions on merit, in the public interest and in accordance with statutory obligations and principles of good governance and *procedural fairness*; read all agenda papers in relation to council or committee meetings; and be open and accountable to the community.

Clause 11 provides a mechanism for a person to make a complaint about an alleged breach of the Code and clause 12 outlines the process for dealing with complaints regarding the conduct of elected members and candidates.

Council Elections October 2021 and Becoming a Councillor

Local government ordinary elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. The next ordinary elections are scheduled for Saturday 16 October 2021. Councillors are elected for terms of four

years in Western Australia. Elections are held every two years for half of the council, and candidates are elected using the first-past-the-post voting system.

Electors who wish to nominate as a candidate in a local government election must complete a valid nomination application and present it to the Returning Officer before nominations close. Prior to nominating all candidates must complete the online "candidate induction" from the <u>Department of Local Government</u>, <u>Sport & Cultural Industries</u> website.

Being a council member is a big commitment. This induction course has been developed to assist your understanding of what your obligations and commitments will be if you are elected and it is compulsory to complete this induction before you nominate. The induction should take approximately one hour to complete. At the end of the course, you must complete the online registration to ensure there is a record of your completion of the induction.

You will be asked to declare that you have completed the induction when you submit your candidate nomination form. It is an offence to make false or misleading statements on the nomination form, and penalties may apply.

Nominations for a local government election open 44 days before polling day and close at 4.00 pm, 37 days before polling day. Use the Commission's Nomination Builder to electronically complete the nomination form and candidate profile.

On 27 June 2019, changes to the Local Government Act 1995 were passed by Parliament which require all council members to undertake training within the first 12 months of being elected. The Council Member Essentials course has five foundational units. All council members will be required to complete:

- ✓ Understanding local government
- ✓ Serving on council
- ✓ Meeting procedures
- ✓ Conflicts of interest
- ✓ Understanding of financial reports and budgets

Rabbit-scan

Farmers, governments and communities are working together to manage the problems that rabbits cause. RabbitScan is a **Free** valuable community resource that can be used to help people work together to manage rabbits.

RabbitScan is a free resource for farmers, community groups, Landcare groups, pest controllers, local councils, biosecurity groups and researchers. Anyone can use RabbitScan to record and view information about local rabbit populations. You can use RabbitScan to monitor and record rabbit activity (such as rabbit warren hot-spots), map areas where damage is most severe (such as erosion gullies), and document where you are controlling rabbits on your property or throughout your local area. You may also be able to assess the scale of the problem, seek support for coordinating and implementing control, and monitor rabbits after control programs.

Did you know, the "Online bookings for COVID-19" vaccinations was launched this week

The new online COVID-19 vaccination booking system opened for appointments on Tuesday (May 25). The VaccinateWA booking system,

can be accessed at <u>Roll up for WA</u>, and provides an online process for booking and confirming vaccination appointments at community and hospital-based vaccination clinics around the State.

Search results will display relevant clinics and dates based on information entered by the user, along with the recommended vaccine and timing between doses. Check your eligibility <u>here</u>.

The launch of the online bookings this week coincides with a new cohort of eligible people - including younger adults with specified underlying medical conditions and people with disability, as part of the Phase 1B cohort, who will now have increased opportunities to be vaccinated through WA's State-run clinics.

In addition, selected clinics - starting with Claremont Showgrounds in early June - will soon start providing the Pfizer vaccine to eligible people aged under 50 on Thursdays to Sundays each week, strictly by bookings only via 13 COVID (13 26843) or via the online booking system at <u>Roll up for WA</u>.

The Claremont Showgrounds clinic will administer the AstraZeneca vaccine through pre-booked appointments on Mondays to Wednesdays from May 31.

Vaccination appointments are still available at GP and GP Respiratory Clinics.
