## COUNCIL BRIEFS

### Shire of Kojonup – Fire Mitigation 2021-2022

We have now entered our Prohibited Burning Period. Permits can be issued between 05 November 2021 and 15 December 2021 for protective burning only.

As residents are aware, The Shire of Kojonup Regulatory Services has commenced its annual Fire Inspections within the gazetted town site to ensure its residents comply with the Shire of Kojonup Fire Notice.

All land within the gazetted town site are to ensure that their property already complies and that adequate fire hazard reduction measures have been taken.

For the surrounding rural area, you have until the 12<sup>th</sup> of December 2021 to ensure your properties comply.

If you have identified a property with overgrown vegetation that you think may pose a risk or be non-compliant, feel free to contact us on 9831 2400 to report it.

*What can I do to reduce the risk of fire at my property?*

You can reduce the fire risk around your home by clearing out anything that could fuel a fire.

Things you can do to help include:

- Regularly mowing the grass and raking up leaves
- Removing weeds and pruning bushes and trees
- Keeping garden beds moist through mulching or other non-flammable ground covers like pebbles
- Regularly clearing leaves from gutters, roofs, downpipes and around the base of trees
- Maintaining a well-watered lawn (complying with water restrictions)
- Storing flammable or combustible materials such as woodpiles and rubbish away from your house

You can further prepare by:

- Ensuring that your garden hoses are long enough to reach all areas of your property
- Making sure that any fire hydrants near your home are accessible and unobstructed
- Creating a personal protection kit (goggles, gloves, hat, boots and cotton trousers and long sleeved shirt)

And remember to ask the important question – Are you Bushfire ready?




### Environmental Activities



**52 Weeks of Socks** is a modern collection of sock patterns from Nordic knitting experts Laine.






**The Bibbulmun Track** is a World class walking trail that runs just over 1000km through the forests and across the coastal heaths of South West, Western Australia, from the towns of Kalamunda the North to Albany in the South. *Naturalist on the Bibbulmun* is the story of one man's journey with his son through this ancient and extraordinary corner of the world. The biodiversity is so extensive that it is impossible to provide a comprehensive field guide to the Bibbulmun Track. Nevertheless, the author musters his expertise in ecology and evolutionary biology to document the animals and plants found during the Noongar seasons of kambarang and birak, from November to January, with colour photographs throughout. In so doing we learn how evolution has shaped the extraordinary diversity of animals and plants in this corner of the World, the important roles


biodiversity plays in providing the stable ecosystem in which we live and prosper, and the serious impacts to that stability imposed by our increasing overexploitation of what is an ancient and fragile landscape. *Naturalist on the Bibbulmun* is both a witness statement of the current state of the natural regions of southwestern WA, and a call to arms to protect for our future generations what little remains of one of the world's most extraordinary natural habitats.






