Budget Adoption – 2022/2023 Fee's & Charges

The 2022/2023 List of Fees and Charges were adopted and available on the Shire of Kojonup Website.

Budget Adoption - 2022/2023 Property Rates

That:

- 1. The following rate levels was adopted for the 2022/2023 financial year:
 - a) For all rateable properties where Gross Rental Valuations are applied a rate of 13.815 cents in the dollar with a Minimum Rate of \$780 is to apply.
 - **b)** For all rateable properties where Unimproved Valuations are applied, a rate of 0.7420 cents in the dollar with a Minimum Rate of \$780 is to apply.
- 2. Where payments are received after the due date, penalty interest at a rate of seven percent (7%) per annum, to be calculated on a daily basis will be imposed on all outstanding rates and service charges. Pensioners who are registered in accordance with the *Rates Rebates and Deferments Act 1993* are to be exempt from this provision.
- 3. The following rate instalment payment options be offered:

Option 1 - Payment in full.

Total amount of rates and charges included on the rate notice to be paid in full by 9 September 2022.

Option 2 - Payments to be made by two (2) instalments as detailed on the rates notice, with the following dates:

First Instalment 9 September 2022 Second Instalment 16 January 2023

Option 3 - Payments to be made by four (4) instalments, as detailed on the rate notice, with the following dates:

First Instalment 9 September 2022 Second Instalment 11 November 2022 Third Instalment 16 January 2023 Fourth Instalment 22 March 2023




Budget Adoption – 2022/2023 Rates Incentive Prize Draw

That a Rates Incentive Prize Draw Program will be conducted for 2022/2023 financial year to encourage the payment of rate accounts in full or by instalment by the due date and the Terms and Conditions.

Budget Adoption – 2022/2023 Annual Budget

The 2022/2023 Annual Budget was adopted with the following amendments:

- 1. average interest rate in the CEO report be reviewed and reflect a weighted average interest rate based on the value of each loan; and
- 2. the term of all current loans to be included in the CEO report; and
- 3. in Section 6. Unspent Borrowings in the Budget document, adjust dates in the statement line from 2021 to 2023; and
- 4. adjustments as required in the CEO report and budget document updating identified dates from to 2022/23 year.






Regulatory Services - Health:

Ranger:

ROAMING LIVESTOCK

Regulatory Services have recently noted in increase of roaming livestock in the area, mostly Lambs and Ewes after the recent lambing season. It is vital that together we make our roads as safe as possible for all motorists.

If you see stray livestock on verges, roads or reserves, please report this to the Shire of Kojonup on 9831 2400 immediately. It's important that you don't place yourself at risk while you're waiting for Regulatory Services to arrive.

INFORMATION FOR STOCK OWNERS

It is the responsibility of all landowners to ensure that when placing stock into paddocks adjacent to any roads that the fencing is of an adequate standard to keep the stock enclosed. Under the *Highways (Liability for Straying Animals) Act 1983*, Owners and occupiers of grazing properties are liable for any damages or injuries that may occur as a result of stock wandering outside the property boundary.

It is an offence under Section 484 of the *Local Government Act (Miscellaneous Provisions) 1960* for livestock to stray. The penalty for straying stock is currently \$200.00 per animal. If the stock is impounded by the Shire, additional impound fees are also payable upon release.

The Shire of Kojonup also has a Fencing Local Law that lists the certain specifications fencing must be constructed to depending on how the land is zoned. For lots zoned Special Rural or Rural, the fencing requirements are as follows:

Non-electrified fence

- (a) wire shall be high tensile wire and not less than 2.5mm. A minimum of 5 wires shall be used, generally with the lower wires spaced closer together than the higher wires so as to prevent smaller stock passing through, and connected to posts in all cases.
- (b) posts shall be of indigenous timber or other suitable material including—
 - (i) timber impregnated with a termite and fungicidal preservative;
 - (ii) standard iron star pickets; or
 - (iii) concrete;
- (c) cut not less than 1 800mm long x 50mm diameter at small end if round or 125mm x 60mm if split or sawn.
- (d) posts to be set minimum 600mm in the ground and 1 200mm above the ground; and
- (e) strainer posts shall be not less than 2 250mm long and 150mm diameter at the small end (tubular steel to be 50mm in diameter) and shall be cut from indigenous timber or other suitable material. These shall be placed a minimum of 1000mm in the ground.

Electrified fence

An electrified fence having 4 wires is a sufficient fence if constructed generally in accordance with a nonelectrified fence.

These specifications are outlined in Schedule 4 of the *Shire of Kojonup Fencing Local Law 2020*. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in a fencing notice being issued to the landowner for rectification or a modified penalty of \$250.00.

State nrm project

Blackwood catchment habitat, water quality improvements through fencing revegetation Through funding from the state nrm office land holders in the shire of Kojonup have collectively planted a proximity 50,000 plants in creek lines and remnant bush land aimed at improving habitat and water quality reducing salinity. Recent rains have given the seedlings a great start to their establishment. This is part of a 3-year project with another 30,000 plants to be planted in 2023 and in 2024 we are really looking forward to the condition of the sites improving over time.



Updated Fire Break Order Requirements 2022/2023

The Shire of Kojonup have made changes to the firebreak requirements for urban areas under the 2022/2023 Fire Break Order.

Landowners and occupiers are urged to read and understand the below new changes to ensure they comply with the new requirements.

The new requirements made under Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 for the Kojonup area are:

1. Urban Land (Land within a gazetted town site)

During the period from the 2nd November 2022 to 31st May 2023 inclusive, you shall have the following firebreaks:

- On all land, regardless of size or how the land is zoned, a Building Protection Zone (BPZ) of 20 meters surrounding all buildings must be established. A BPZ is a reduced fuel load zone. Living standing trees, remnant vegetation, maintained gardens and lawns are exempt from BPZ.
- On all land that is 4,000 square metres or less, all remaining flammable material to be reduced to a height of less than 50mm.
- On all land in excess of 4000 square meters, clear a 3 metre wide firebreak immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and maintain all flammable material to a height of less than 150mm.
- Woodpiles are permitted on any land providing a 3 metre wide firebreak is installed and maintained immediately surrounding the woodpile.
- Where chemical spraying is the method chosen as the means by which firebreaks are constructed, this is to be completed to the Shire's satisfaction by 15th September. Firebreaks must be maintained throughout the dates of this notice. If not, the Shire may complete any works necessary, at the landowners' expense.
- The Chief Executive Officer may instigate a Fire Compliance Notice on any property with specifications listed to reduce any potential hazard as he deems applicable.

No other changes have been made to the Fire Break Order from previous years in relation to Rural or Plantation/Tree Farmland requirements.

These changes have been made to improve the safety to our community and ensure landowners and occupiers are fire ready.






LIBRARY





Railway eleepers cut by saw mills in the Kojonup district are being stockpiled at Midland Junction for use on the £41,000,000 standard, 4' 82" gauge railway line between Kalgoorlie and Perth.

Mr Frank McKenzie of Manolini, said on Monday Government's furadup, who won the contact for loading all the leepers cut at Kojonup, said of Monday he had loaded the past ten years.

Manolini, said on Monday Government's gauge project. The State promote the main source of interest t Mr Frank McKenzie of Muradup, who won the con-tract for loading all the sleepers cut at Kojonup, said on Monday he had loaded about 25,000 sleepers since December last year.

He said 13,000 sleepers for the standard gauge project had been railed out of Kojonup between February and April and there was now another 4,000 to be moved from the depot near the Kojonup C.B.H. bin.

Mr McKenzie estimated that during the period be-teween February and April, 13,000 sleepers for the standard gauge had been railed from Farrar and 3,000 each from Muradup and Qualeup.

The 8' x 9" x 5" sleepers are being cut from Jarrah and Whitegum.

The mills are also busy fulfilling orders for the Aus-tralian Commonwealth Rail-ways and the South African Railways.

Mr McKenzie said two boatloads of 15,000 sleepers had been cut by Kojonup mills for the South African

railways since Christmas.

However, he said, the demand was expected to last for only another two years and that when the contracts

The State Government paid 10/- a load less than the Commonwealth Government for its sleepers, which were larger and of better quality timber, he said.

He said there was a very small margin of profit on sleepers cut for the State

1 Sleepers for the W.A. project were 8' x 9" x 5" whereas sleepers cut for Commonwealth railways were 8' x 9" x 4½". The State Government also set stricter standards for the quality of timber used.






