

Special Council Meeting – 13 September 2022

Grant Thompson (CEO)

Moonies Hill Energy Pty Ltd – Assessment of management plans

Council:

- 1) Approved the following management plans for Moonies Hill Energy Pty Ltd for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm as outlined in Attachments 9.4.1.2 to 9.4.1.6:
 - Construction Management Plan (Condition 18) except for Appendix A (Development Layout Plan)
 within the Construction Management Plan. See point 2 below for the approval of Development
 Layout Plan;
 - Fire Management Plan Bushfire Management Plan incorporating the Emergency Management Plan (Condition 19) amended as follows:
 - o incorporate changes from a 1000 litre fire appliance (slip on unit) to a minimum 2,400 litre unit; and
 - o the 2,400 litre fire appliance unit be retained at the operations building and maintenance compound to attend maintenance site works during operation at all times; and
 - o That fire units, with a minimum capacity of 1000 litres of water, be added as a requirement at all hot worksites (that is; one per hot worksite) located in the Shire of Kojonup during the fire season, with the 2,400 litre fire unit on standby at the main compound for all worksites located within the Shire of Kojonup during the fire season; and
 - Traffic Management Plan incorporating the Pre-Construction Road Condition Report and the Route Study. This is subject to addressing Main Roads Western Australia advice and modifying the Traffic Management Plan to the satisfaction of the Shire's Chief Executive Officer (Condition 20).
- 2) While noting point 1, it is highlighted that approval of the management plans:
 - Does not include the Development Layout Plan included with the documents; and
 - Does not override the need to obtain any relevant approvals that may be separately required from other agencies.

Budget Amendment – Regional Road Group Funding 2022/2023

That:

- 1. Council approves a budget amendment to delay three (3) x construction projects: Spring Street, Boscabel Road, Town Ramps and part Signage (total value \$140,000); and
- 2. Council funds be allocated towards Jingalup Road widening for 2022/23 being brought forward a year with a 1/3 Council funding contribution of \$140,000.

Administration office, Library and Depot Closure

That approval is granted for:

- 1. The closure of the Administration Office, Library and Depot on Friday, 23 September 2022 to reopen at usual opening times on Tuesday, 27 September 2022; and


Reserve 51937 (Purpose: Tourist Railway and the Kodja Place Cultural, Heritage and Tourism Precinct) – Management Order

Council:

- 1. Authorised the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to seek from the Department of Planning, Housing and Lands (DPLH) a Power to Lease (to a third party) Reserve 51937 for a period up to 21 years; and
- 2. Authorised the CEO to request from the DPLH, if necessary, expansion of the purpose of Reserve 51937 to include the location of Electric Vehicle Charging Station/s.

Attention: From Kojonup Police

Firstly I just want to remind everyone about the Kojonup Police and Community Golf Day which is taking place on the 29th of October 2022, this is a great community day, with all funds raised going directly back to the Kojonup Community. If you need any further information about the Golf Day in regard to playing or being a sponsor, please give us a call.

In relation to traffic around town, with the school holidays approaching, please take care on the busy roads and look after yourself and your family. There are always going to be people that drive when tired, affected by drugs or alcohol, or who exceed the speed limit. Please be aware of these people, keep a safe distance and report unsafe drivers so we can do our job and keep you safe.



There will be a large contingent of police on the roads over the next few weeks, with a focus on alcohol, drugs, inattention, and other main causes of fatalities. There will also be stationary speed detection radars so do the right thing, stick to the speed limit, and keep your money in your pocket where it belongs.

One other thing to be mindful of is every long weekend, double demerits come into force, so if your licence

is carrying a few demerit points, speeding could mean the end of your licence which can impact on your livelihood and add further stress to your life.

On the crime front, we've had a busy few weeks with people breaking into sheds and farm houses looking for items to steal and swap for drugs. As most of you are aware drugs continue to be a driving factor for this type of offending and if we keep drugs out of Kojonup the related offending stops.

If you know who is bringing drugs in and destroying our town, please let us know. A number of people have been charged with serious offences and there will be more people charged over the next few weeks. In regards to drugs, if you have family or friends that are using Methylamphetamine, it is a slippery slope and they might start using it on the weekends, but this can quickly turn into a full blown habit. This can cause issues for your family, friends and the damage it can cause is unbelievable. Please do not ignore this, speak to them and seek help.

In regards to offences around town, when you see something or someone that is suspicious please let us know by phone or email so we can follow it up. There has been an increase in people not letting us know things until days or weeks after the event, which has impacted on our ability to prevent and investigate offences.

We are particularly interested when people attend farming properties and when they are confronted, they make up excuses like asking for fuel, asking to shoot, collect firewood, or looking for friend. If someone attends your property that you do not know, please record as many details as possible, ask them for their name and obtain registration numbers of vehicles. This information can be given to us via email or with a simple phone call.

I have some very recent examples where lighting, CCTV and alarm systems have prevented offences from occurring on farms and we have used to them charge a number of persons with committing offences in neighbouring properties. There are also other ways to improve your security such as better locks, security screens or actually locking your doors and windows.

For those of you that own farms and regularly have people attend, I would recommend keeping a register, which records who is on the farm completing work and the area they are accessing. Unfortunately, some people have been given employment which involves them working on farms for varying reasons and they have returned, sometimes weeks or months later to steal property.

We are continuing to conduct checks on firearm cabinets and firearms so reach out to us so we can attend at a convenient time. On another note, if you or any one you know, no longer wishes to hold a firearms

licence, for any reason, which can include changes to your living arrangements, you don't use them, or you simply no longer have a genuine need, please get in touch and we can provide you a number of options which can assist you.

I wish to remind people that we have an ongoing firearm amnesty, so if you have come into possession of an unlicenced firearm that has been in the family for years or sitting around the farm. You can hand it in without fear of punishment as long as the firearm has not been used to commit an offence. We do not want to see or hear of firearms being stored incorrectly which normally means hidden under a bed, in the cupboard or in the back of Ute for weeks at a time so please be mindful of firearm safety.

This community has been very welcoming from the time we arrived here, and I lost count of home many people have dropped into my house for a chat when I have been out the front gardening or playing with the kids.



I would like to make a special mention of the volunteers in this town. I would have to say you are all a great bunch of people and the fact you give up your own time to attend some very dangerous and challenging incidents on a regular basis, shows how much you care about the community and your character as a person. The volunteers in Koji are the best I have worked with both in being a great bunch of people and also in regards to your professionalism. I can say that with a fair bit of experience from working in several

towns of varying sizes in all parts of the state.

The schools have been great to work with and provided us with some great artwork in the front entrance of the police station and we had the pleasure of attending each school to spend time with students and we have also had several school visits at the police station with some hilarious moments with the kids and some great questions.

Now for those of you that are not aware, there is a fantastic group in Kojonup called SPARK. This group name means Suicide Prevention Around Regional Kojonup and SPARK was started after a few discussions with some passionate people in the community. This led onto a large community forum where we quickly formed the group which is completed some fantastic work in the space of Mental Health with support from Kojonup Shire, Rotary, Palmerston and Wesley Life Force just to name a few and there is numerous other groups and individuals that I would name but you know who you are and you are not in this for prestige but rather to make a difference.

SPARK is about creating awareness of the support available in regards to suicide prevention and mental health and have organised a number of learning events and stalls at community events, most recently at the footy grand final.

If you see the crew from SPARK out in the community giving up their spare time to give back to this community, please say hello and thank them for what they are doing. I would like to I want to thank everyone that has had some involvement in SPARK. The work you are doing is amazing and I can personally say it has made a huge difference in Kojonup.




Dear Jayden and Sarah

One-month renewal option reduce financial burden on WA drivers

- Monthly car registration renewal direct debit option available from 27 September 2022
- Eligible vehicle owners can apply using their DoTDirect account
- New scheme enables families to manage household budgets more effectively

The State Government will introduce a one-month renewal payment option for vehicle registrations to help reduce the financial burden on Western Australian households.

From 27 September 2022, the Department of Transport will offer a monthly direct debit payment option for eligible light vehicle licence renewals that will allow people to manage their household budgets more effectively.

The direct debit option will apply to monthly licence payments for light vehicles only for new and existing DoTDirect customers.

The new payment option is available in addition to the current 3 month, 6 month and 12 month payment options.

Customers will enter into a direct debit agreement with the Department of Transport and their financial institution to enable monthly payments to be debited from their account.

Under the system, customers will receive a reminder five days prior to a direct debit transaction on their nominated bank account, to ensure they have sufficient funds in their account.



Comments attributed to Transport Minister Rita Saffioti:

"We know cost of living pressures are impacting a lot of people right now, and by offering the option of a monthly recurring payment, it makes the cost of car registration much more manageable.

"The monthly direct debit option offered by the Department of Transport allows families more flexibility to manage their finances and keep their vehicles licenced and on the road.

"Direct debit will be available to new and existing DoTDirect customers to help reduce the burden on household budgets."

Visit to SWCC (South West Catchments Council) Pollinator Project

On Wednesday 14th of September KDHS Work experience Student Manny Fleay and Landcare officer went to a property in Boscabel to assist with the monitoring of the SWCC Pollinator project.

SWCC is working with six canola farmers and orchardists to develop revegetation programs aimed at improving pollination rates. By identifying and attracting beneficial pollinators like insects and birds, farm businesses can become more productive and resilient to changing conditions, as well as enhancing habitat for native species.

We set up insect traps along the edge of the pasture which were left overnight to capture insects. While we were there, we walked around the revegetation adjacent to the pasture which was planted in 2020 and was in full flower. This will support the pollinators during times when crops or pasture aren't in flower.

In 2020, after the longest and most expensive trial in Western Australian history, Bradley Robert Edwards was convicted of two of the Claremont Serial Killings, a series of unsolved murders that had haunted the state since the mid-1990s. Not only did Edwards keep his job at Telstra, but he was convicted only of common assault for the attack, a minor charge that left him off the police radar during their desperate hunt for the sexual predator responsible for the Claremont murders. Begun as way to deal with the resurgence of trauma after Edwards' arrest, this memoir looks at the pressure on women to minimise

and excuse certain behaviours in others, and demonstrates the devastating consequences of not making a fuss.



The prodigal, the bounder, is home again

THE prodigal has returned — only in this case, the pet kangaroo, not the son.

For one long month our two-yearold pet stayed away and we grew accustomed to watching our seedlings grow unhindered, leaving the back door open at night without fear of trespassers and seeing shoots begin to sprout from the lower branches of trees and shrubs.

We even stopped searching the bush and peering at each fence line, terrified that we would see a still shape entangled in the wire.

Then one night my husband heard along the efficient district grapevine that a tame kangaroo had turned up at a property about 15km to the south

The owner had been driving home one evening when he had been intrigued to notice he had a "tail"—a solemnly hopping kangaroo.

When he stopped, the kangaroo came right up to the car with the grateful air of a successful hitchhiker and did its best to climb in.

He took it home and spread the news of his find around the district.

My husband's main problem was transportation. While it is no trouble to retrieve straying dogs, cats, sheep, and white mice — full grown boomers are somewhat of a worry.

Not that Cassidy was a recluse; he travelled extensively in his younger days, tucked up in a bag or squash-

ed cosily on someone's knee.

But now there was no knee for him to be squashed upon (I was in the city and the three children away) and my husband felt a strange reluctance to embark on a car journey with a hefty kangaroo leaping lightly from seat to seat.

Eventually he took off somewhat



self-consciously with the horse crates (capable of holding nine fullgrown horses) on the eight-tonne truck.

Cassidy climbed aboard with all the aplomb of a much-travelled veteran polo pony, the boss slammed the door shut and took off.

"I felt a right twit," he recalled,
"travelling up the main road with
just one small kangaroo rattling
around in the back."

At home Cassidy disembarked at the horse loading ramp, chased the pet lamb in an ecstasy of delight and did a frenzied speed trial around the house, finishing with a spectacular leap over the garden fence just to show he was back.

When I returned next day he was thoroughly at home again — clothes were pulled from the drying line, dog pellets spilt on the back verandah, new shoots nibbled away from all his favourite plants — and he showed no signs of missing his roving life.

Of course the entertainment offered at home is of a high standard at present.

There are shearers' cars to chase each morning, musterers' motocycles to follow each evening, mobs of sheep to terrify, penned lambs to annoy and sheepdogs to entice from duty.


