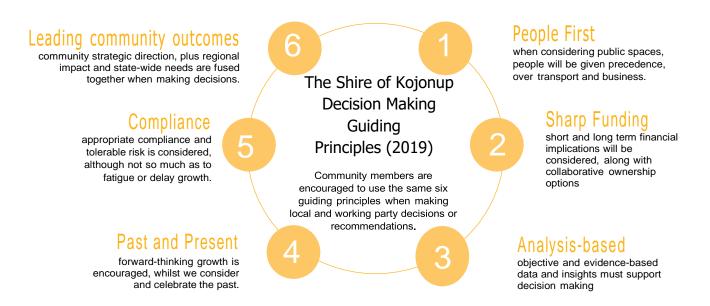

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Council to consider a variation received from the successful Tenderer SAPIO for the installation of anti-climb brackets on the Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) solar poles.

BACKGROUND

As a part of the Local Roads Community Infrastructure Phase 4 (LRCIP 4), a CCTV project was approved as a compliant project for use of the funds.

The Council approved the project in 2023/24 budget as a capital project funded through the LRCIP 4.

COMMENT

Closed Circuit Television is a valuable tool for Council to utilize for the management of our services, assets and facilities. The Shire has been in discussion with the local police for the past two and half years regarding the need for CCTV network in the Shire. The local police have shown their support in writing to assist the process.

Included in the original manufacturers scope is a "light" protection unit attached to the poles to ensure people cannot climb the pole and interfere with the cameras.

SAPIO have approached the Shire and recommended that it upgrade the protections from the standard unit to a heavier duty spike. The obvious value is the deterrent factor of heavier spikes.

The following site locations are all solar powered and will have the anti-climb brackets installed:

- 1. Showgrounds entrance from Blackwood Road
- 2. Coner of Blackwood Road / Pensioner
- 3. Broomehill Kojonup Road
- 4. Kojonup Katanning Road
- 5. Corner of Albany Highway and Kojonup-Katanning Road
- 6. Corner of Soldier and Tunney Road
- 7. Loton Close Road
- 8. Corner of Albany and Stock Road

It is the authors recommendation that Council consider funding the variation of eight (8) Anti Climb units for a total variation cost of \$2189.00 inc. of GST.

Policy 2.1.2 Purchasing & Creditor Control outlines the processes to follow when purchasing goods. Due to the anticipated value of this project, proposals were called in line with this policy and legislative requirements for tenders – r.11 of the *Local Government (Functions and General Regulations)* 1996.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The 2023/2024 Annual Budget contained an allowance of \$267,000.00 for this project.

Funding of \$219,411.00 is confirmed in the LRCIP Phase 4 funding. The RFP Proposals received through the tender process was more than the confirmed funding.

The successful tenderer quoted an amount of \$226,256.21 which will increase with the variation of \$2,189.00 to the total amount of \$228,445.21.

This variation is still within the approved budget of \$267,000.

- 4. The Council direct the Chief Executive Officer to complete the Annual Report compilation and:
- present the finalized 'Electors Annual Report' for consideration to the March Ordinary Council Meeting held at 3.00pm, Tuesday, 25 March 2025; and
- schedule an Annual Electors Meeting to be held at 6.00pm, Wednesday, 9 April 2025 at the Kojonup Sporting Complex."

The purpose of this report is to note the Monthly Financial Statement for the month ending 28 February 2025.

BACKGROUND

In addition to good governance, the presentation to the Council of monthly financial reports is a statutory requirement, with these to be presented at an ordinary meeting of the Council within two (2) months after the end of the period to which the statements relate.

COMMENT

The attached Statement of Financial Activity for the period 1 February 2025 to 28 February 2025 represents eight (8) months, or 66% of the year.

The following items are worthy of noting:

- Closing surplus position of \$3,504,960.
- Capital expenditure achieved 35.3% of budgeted projects.
- Cash holdings of \$4,467m of which \$1,168m is held in cash backed reserve accounts and \$3,299 is unrestricted cash.
- Rates debtors outstanding equate to 13% of total rates raised for 2024/2025.
- Page 11 of the statements detail major variations comparing year to date (amended) budgets to year-to-date actuals in accordance with Council Policy 2.1.6.

SUMMARY

To consider and adopt the Budget Review Report, and authorise amendments to the Adopted Budget, based on projection outcomes to 30 June 2025.

BACKGROUND

The Local Government Act provides for local governments, including regional local governments, to prepare an annual budget.

- 6.2. Local government to prepare annual budget
- (1) During the period from 1 June in a financial year to 31 August in the next financial year, or such extended time as the Minister allows, each local government is to prepare and adopt*, in the form and manner prescribed, a budget for its municipal fund for the financial year ending on the 30 June next following that 31 August.

The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 require local governments to undertake a review of the Annual Budget.

33A. Review of Budget

- (1) Between 1 January and the last day of February in each financial year a local government is to carry out a review of its annual budget for that year.
- (2A) The review of an annual budget for a financial year must
 - (a) consider the local government's financial performance in the period beginning on 1 July and ending no earlier than 31 December in that financial year; and
 - (b) consider the local government's financial position as at the date of the review; and
 - (c) review the outcomes for the end of that financial year that are forecast in the budget; and
 - (d) Include the following-
 - (i) the annual budget adopted by the local government;

^{*}Absolute majority required.

- (ii) an update of each of the estimates included in the annual budget;
- (iii) the actual amounts of expenditure, revenue and income as at the date of the review;
- (iv) adjacent to each item in the annual budget adopted by the local government that stated an amount, the estimated end-of-year amount for the item.
- (2) The review of an annual budget for a financial year must be submitted to the council on or before 31 March in that financial year.
- (3) A council is to consider a review submitted to it and is to determine* whether or not to adopt the review, any parts of the review or any recommendations made in the review.
- *Absolute majority required.
- (4) Within 14 days after a council has made a determination, a copy of the review and determination is to be provided to the Department.

A detailed analysis at account level incorporating year to date actual results and budget projections to 30 June 2025, for the period ending 31 December 2024, is presented for consideration. A Statement of Financial Activity, at Nature/Type level, has been prepared to provide a summarisation of the budget review results, as well as a Statement of Closing Funds detailing the projected surplus as at 30 June 2025.

COMMENT

The budget review has been prepared to include the information required by the Local Government Act 1995, the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, and the Australian Accounting Standards. Council adopted a 10% or \$10,000 threshold minimum for the reporting of material variances to be used in the Statement of Financial Activity and the annual Budget Review Report.

In summary, based on current trends, it is anticipated that a small surplus can be achieved as at 30 June 2025.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider an Expression of Interest received for the lease of Lot 162 Blackwood Road, Kojonup.

BACKGROUND

Lot 162 Blackwood Road, Kojonup, represents approximately 34 hectares of agricultural land situated between Kojonup's industrial estate and the Showgrounds/Sporting Precinct on Blackwood Road. Previously, this land has been leased by the Kojonup Football and Cricket Clubs for farming purposes to provide funding for the Clubs' ongoing operations.

The most recent lease over this land expires on 27 March 2025.

At its 29 November 2022 Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved as follows:

"That Council:

- 1. calls for public expressions of interest for the lease of lot 162 Blackwood Road, Kojonup with the following conditions applying:
- a) Term of lease to be for a period of three (3) years;
- b) The lessee accepts the property on an 'as is' basis;
- c) The lessee is to maintain perimeter fences at the current standards;
- d) The Shire of Kojonup will not be liable for any issues arising from fencing and/or containment of stock;
- e) The lessee is responsible for managing and minimising any fire hazard and complying with any relevant conditions of the annual fire break order; and

f) Any stocking rates will be agreed by both parties on an 'as needs' basis to respond to any animal welfare, fire hazard reduction, and land quality preservation issues that may arise.

and

2. applies the following grading criteria to each expression of interest for this lease:

Community Value Creation 50%
 Price 40%
 Proposed Property Improvements 10%"

A call for Expressions of Interest (EOI) was subsequently advertised at the end of 2022 for the leasing of 162 Blackwood Road, Kojonup, and closed on 20 January 2023.

At its 21 March 2023 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved as follows:

- 5. To fund future strategic initiatives and the provision of new services and facilities to future residents;
- 6. To buffer against unpredictable events;

 When preparing the annual budget each year, consideration will be given to establishing reserve accounts for major projects as contained within the Community Strategic Plan.

Quote received:

The author recommends using Subsurface Water Management as they specialise in this type of drainage replacement and irrigation solutions with the least amount of impact and quickest recovery on the hockey oval.

It is recommended that funds from the Sporting Complex Reserve is transferred to fund this emergency purchase.

Council to consider updated Terms of Reference (ToR) for its Audit and Risk committee.

BACKGROUND

The Local Government Amendment Act 2024, which advances a range of reforms to the Local Government Act 1995 and associated regulations, became law on 6 December 2024. This new legislation affects local government audit committees as follows:

- 1. A local government must establish a committee of its council to be called the Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee (ARIC). Audit committees to have an improved focus as 'audit, risk and improvement' that are independently chaired, with greater clarity on how council committees should operate.
- 2. An employee of the local government is not to be a member of the ARIC, nor is a member to be nominated by, or is to be appointed to represent, any employee of the local government.
- 3. The presiding member of the ARIC cannot be a council member of the local government or of any other local government.
- 4. Any deputy presiding member of the ARIC cannot be a council member of the local government or of any other local government.
- 5. Two or more local governments may agree to establish a single committee to be the audit, risk and improvement committee of each of their councils (a shared committee).

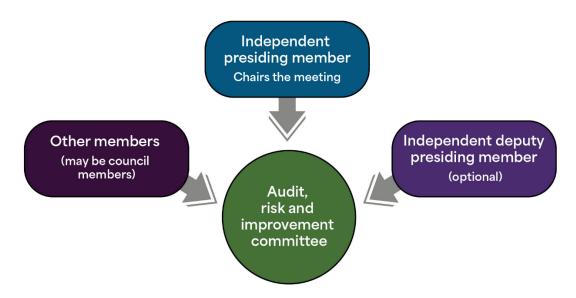
The legislation, while in force since 6 December 2024, has transitional provisions relating to the establishment of ARIC's and will be implemented over 2025. A separate agenda item will be completed for the Council to appoint a community presiding and deputy presiding member to the Committee and amend its name and functions.

The introduction of an independent presiding member provides an opportunity for increased community confidence in the Shire's financial and risk management. Operations may also benefit through appointing an independent chair with risk and financial management expertise that may otherwise be unavailable.

In relation to the current Act, an audit committee is required to be established comprising 3 or more persons appointed by absolute majority by a local government.

Most of the members must be Council Members. The CEO or a local government employee cannot be a member.

Audit, risk and improvement committee model;



The new Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee comprises the following roles, with a total of 3 or more members.

Under the proposed amendments in the Bill, an ARIC now requires an independent presiding member. A local government can choose to appoint an independent deputy presiding member to chair the meeting if the independent presiding member is unable to do so.

If a local government chooses not to nominate a deputy presiding member, the council will need to appoint an independent proxy to chair the meeting should the need arise.

Smaller local governments may also now choose to share an ARIC to reduce the burden on their resources.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST

Edge Planning & Property receive payment for planning advice to the Shire and declare a Financial Interest (section 5.70 of the *Local Government Act 1995*).

SUMMARY

To consider an application for development approval for a workshop/maintenance shed (transport depot use) at Lot 9999 Thornbury Close, Kojonup.

BACKGROUND

The application site is owned by the Shire, is 21.5746 hectares in area, is vacant and is generally cleared. There are plans to extend the industrial estate southwards including an extension of Thornbury Close via a loop road (see Attachment 9.2.1.1).

Proposal

The applicant seeks approval to construct a shed for storage, workshop, and maintenance (transport depot use). The proposed shed is $496m^2$ in floor area (32m long, 15.5m wide, 6.6m wall height) and will consist of Trimdek Zincalume cladding for the roof and walls. Details provided by the applicant are set out in Attachment 9.2.1.2.

The plans show the proposed shed will be setback 113m from the western boundary (to Thornbury Close), 44m to the northern property boundary (Roche Street) and 99m to the eastern property boundary.

The proposed shed is partially located within the designated bushfire prone area.

COMMENT

Following an assessment of the Development Application against the planning framework, it is recommended that Council conditionally approve the Development Application given:

- It is consistent with the planning framework;
- The shed has generous setbacks from property boundaries;
- The shed's location has taken account of the proposed road extension to the south, in the completion of the Thornbury Close loop (or to the east of the proposed shed);
- The proposed storage, workshop and maintenance shed (transport depot use) will have minimal off site impacts;
- The proposed shed and uses are not considered to create any significant amenity impacts;
- There are manageable bushfire risks;
- There are expected to be minimal environmental impacts;
- It assists to diversify and grow the local economy;
- There are no objections from other Shire officers/units; and
- Recommended development conditions and advice can assist to control the use, address amenity, limit off-site impacts and seek effective management of the development.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS AND THEIR IMPLICATIONS

The Council has a number of options available to it, which are discussed below:

1. Not approve the proposal

The Council can choose to not approve the application and advise the proponent giving reasons. If this option were chosen, the shed would not be able to be constructed.

2. Approve the proposal

The Council can choose to approve the application, with or without conditions. If this option were chosen, the development can proceed subject to gaining a Building Permit.

3. Defer the proposal

The Council can choose to defer the matter and seek additional information from the applicant before proceeding to make a decision.

This is a discretionary decision and the applicant has a right to request a review of any decision and/or condition made by the local government to the State Administrative Tribunal if aggrieved by the decision and/or any condition.

For instance, TPS3 sets a landscaping standard of 10% of the site area associated with industrial development. This standard can be modified if it addresses clause 5.6 of TPS3.

- The development hereby approved must be carried out in accordance with the submitted plans and specifications (addressing all conditions) or otherwise amended by the local government and these shall not be altered and/or modified without the prior knowledge and written consent of the local government.
- 2. The provision of details with the Building Permit application as to how stormwater and associated earthworks will be addressed for the proposed development to the satisfaction of the local government. The local government will require that all stormwater from the building and other impervious areas are collected and detained on site to the satisfaction of the local government prior to occupation. Connection to the Shire's drainage system is at the applicant/owner's cost to the specification and satisfaction of the local government. The stormwater facilities provided in accordance with this condition shall be permanently maintained in an operative condition to the satisfaction of the local government.
- 3. The development is connected to the reticulated water system prior to occupation.
- 4. The development is connected to an on-site sewage disposal system, to the satisfaction of the local government, prior to occupation.
- 5. An access and parking plan is provided to the satisfaction of the local government prior to the issue of a Building Permit. The vehicle access ways, vehicle manoeuvring areas and car parking spaces are then designed, constructed (unsealed standard other than the crossovers) and drained to the satisfaction of the local government prior to occupation. These areas shall be permanently maintained for vehicle parking, access and manoeuvring areas to the satisfaction of the local government.
- 6. The vehicle crossovers are suitably designed, drained, constructed (sealed) and maintained to the satisfaction of the local government.
- 7. A Dust Suppression Plan for the unsealed internal roadways and car parking bays must be prepared and submitted to the satisfaction of the local government prior to the

- commencement of proposed development works. Following this, the plan is to be suitably implemented to the satisfaction of the local government.
- 8. The provision of details, with the Building Permit, which show a Landscaping Plan to the satisfaction of the local government. The site is then landscaped in accordance with the approved Landscaping Plan prior to occupation. Following this, the landscaped area shall be suitably maintained to the satisfaction of the local government at all times.
- 9. A Bushfire Attack Level Assessment is to be submitted with the Building Permit Application. The development is to be constructed in accordance with AS3959 Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas. The Asset Protection Zone is to be permanently maintained around the building in accordance with the Bushfire Attack Level assessment.
- 10. An Emergency Evacuation Plan is to be prepared and/or updated to the satisfaction of the local government and then implemented prior to occupation. All measures contained in the Plan are to be maintained to the satisfaction of the local government. The Emergency Evacuation Plan is to be prominently displayed at all times in the approved building.
- 11. The location and design of the building, servicing, associated improvements, vehicle access and parking do not impact the planned extension of Thornbury Close as a loop road, including the road construction of a public road to the east of the proposed shed.

Advice:

- A) This is not a Building Permit. A Building Permit must be obtained before any building works commence.
- B) The applicant is advised that the approved development must comply with all relevant provisions of the of the *Public Health Act 2016*, the *Health (Miscellaneous Provisions)*Act 1911, the Shire of Kojonup Health Local Law and the National Construction Code.
- C) The level of noise emanating from the premises shall not exceed that prescribed in the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, and the *Environmental Protection (Noise)* Regulations 1997.
- D) Any lighting device shall be positioned and shielded so as not to cause any direct, reflected or incidental light beyond the property boundaries. Lighting should be designed in accordance with AS 4282-2019 Control of the Obtrusive Effects of Outdoor Lighting.
- E) With regard to signage the applicant is advised that any sign affixed to the approved building wall does not require development approval. However, any form of freestanding signage may require a further application for development approval to be submitted and determined by the local government.

- F) The applicant is responsible for meeting the cost of power provision to the development. Unless an alternative on-site power supply is provided, any works should address Western Power requirements.
- G) If the applicant is aggrieved by this determination, there is a right of review by the State Administrative Tribunal in accordance with the *Planning and Development Act 2005* Part 14. An application must be made within 28 days of the determination.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider the 2023/2024 Audited Annual Financial Report, incorporating the Audit Report and associated correspondence and consider whether to recommend to the Council to adopt the 2023/2024 Audited Reports.

BACKGROUND

Each local government is to prepare an annual financial report for each financial year. The report is a record of the Shire of Kojonup's (Shire) activities for the financial year and is an integral part of the accountability principles established for local governments in Western Australia.

COMMENT

The Audit Report and Annual Financial Report will be considered by the Council at its 25 February 2025 Ordinary Meeting. The Auditor's Management Letter is provided as additional information to the Committee and Council for transparency and full disclosure. It is suggested that the Audited Annual Financial Report, incorporating the aforementioned documents, be considered by Council at an Ordinary Council Meeting to be called for 3.00pm, Tuesday, 25 February 2025.

The Annual Electors Meeting must be held within 56 days of the Council accepting the Annual Financial Report, with appropriate time being allowed after adoption to give notice of the meeting, say 14 days. This effectively means that the Annual Electors Meeting needs to be held by 22 April 2025. In previous years, the Annual Electors Meeting has been held in the evening following the Ordinary Council Meeting (OCM). However, as the OCM is in late April it is recommended that the Annual Electors Meeting be held on Wednesday 9 April 2025 at the Kojonup Sporting Complex.

The Annual Electors Meeting will be publicised in the Great Southern Herald, on the Shire website and Shire Facebook page as soon as possible after the date is set, and in the next available Kojonup News and Shire mediums.

Key to ratings

The Ratings in this management letter are based on the audit team's assessment of risks and concerns with respect to the probability and/or consequence of adverse outcomes if action is not taken. We give consideration to these potential adverse outcomes in the context of both quantitative impact (for example financial loss) and qualitative impact (for example inefficiency, non-compliance, poor service to the public or loss of public confidence).

Significant - Those findings where there is potentially a significant risk to the entity should the finding not be addressed by the entity promptly. A significant rating could indicate the need for a modified audit opinion in the current year, or in a subsequent reporting period if not addressed. However, even if the issue is not likely to impact the audit opinion, it should be addressed promptly.

Moderate - Those findings which are of sufficient concern to warrant action being taken by the entity as soon as practicable.

Minor - Those findings that are not of primary concern but still warrant action being taken.

Contained within the 2023/2024 Audit Report were matters identified as significant by the Auditor. The matters raised as significant by the Auditor were as follows:

1. Employee related provisions

Finding

This issue was first raised in 2023.

From our review of employee long-service leave provisions at 30 June 2024 we noted provisions balances still exist for 76 employees that are no longer employed by the Shire. The estimated overstatement of the Shire's long service leave provision was \$162,721 at 30 June 2024. Subsequently this finding was corrected in the financial report.

Rating: Significant (2023 Significant)

Implication

Where inaccurate employee data is used to estimate the Shire's employee related provisions, there is an increased risk of material errors occurring in the annual financial report.

Recommendation

The Shire should review the employee data used to develop and recognise employee related provisions and ensure this is current and up to date each year. Adjustments should be recognised to reduce the liability balances for any entitlements paid or where the entitlement is no longer required to be recognised.

Management comment

The Shire will enforce an exit process and checklist when employees leave the Shire to ensure their entitlements are removed from the payroll system. In 2025 the Shire intends to hire a Human Resource Coordinator to coordinate with payroll on exiting the employee from the Shire.

2. Credit card transactions not reported to council

Finding

During our review of the minutes from the Shire Council meetings, we observed that the accounts paid listing presented to the council did not include transactions made using credit cards or purchasing cards. This omission is not in compliance with Section 13A of the Local Government Act (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, which mandates that all accounts paid, including credit card transactions, must be listed. We did not identify any fraudulent transactions in our review of credit card or purchasing card transactions.

Rating: Minor

Implication

The exclusion of credit card and purchasing card transactions constitutes a Non-compliance with the Local Government (financial management) Regulations 1996 requirements and limits visibility into these transactions, increasing the risk of undetected errors, misuse, or fraud.

Recommendation

All corporate credit and purchasing card transactions be submitted to the council for review and approval at the meeting immediately following the payment of these cards. This practice will ensure compliance with the Local Government Financial Management Regulations and enhance transparency and accountability to both the council and the public.

Management comment

The Shire recognises that more information is required to be reported and will improve the reporting process to include the data in the agenda report for Council at the same time the monthly payment listings are provided.

3. Asset register – land & buildings

Finding

During our review asset records and the asset register we noted the following:

- We were unable to identify or locate the following properties in order to confirm ownership via Landgate online enquiry:
 - LB0097 Harper Road Townsite (\$38,000)
 - o LB0236 Lot 19 Bowler Place Townsite (\$14,000).
- The following properties are included in the Shire's asset register, but are not owned by the Shire:
 - LB0221 33 Newstead Road Townsite (\$35,000)
 - o LB0235 Lot 107A Albany Highway Townsite (\$500).
- Land additions totalling \$10,661 that were included in the general ledger were not reflected in the additions to the asset register.

The lots identified above have been reported as uncorrected errors in the management representation letter and should be subject to further review & adjustment if required in 2024-25.

Rating: Moderate

Implication

Asset transactions that are not recorded correctly or in a timely manner can result in the misstatement of asset values in the financial report.

Recommendation

Management should ensure that asset records and registers are regularly reviewed and movements during the period have been appropriately reflected on the registers. Where assets that are not owned by the Shire are identified, they should be removed from the asset register using the appropriate accounting treatment. We also recommend that adequate detail be included for all assets in order to enable these assets to be identified easily.

Management comment

The Shire will implement a verification process of ownership. Once ownership determined the Shire will either remove them from the asset register or confirm Shire ownership. Secondary the Shire will implement a review process for the asset register to verify the Shires assets at least once per financial year or as required when assets are purchased or disposed of.

It should be noted that all of the above matters were dealt with accordingly. A policy dealing with Councillor and CEO attendance at events was adopted by Council at its 12 December 2023 Ordinary Meeting (CM 141/23).

The purpose of this report is to review the Shire of Kojonup's (Shire) Volunteer Handbook.

BACKGROUND

The Shire's Volunteer Management Handbook (Handbook) was originally produced in 2016 in line with Council's adoption of its Volunteer Management Policy (Policy 2.3.8). Significant changes were made in November 2018 to form a less cumbersome and more user friendly Handbook and further reviews have been undertaken on an annual basis.

With the exception of volunteer firefighters who are recognised and supported via the Bush Fire Advisory Committee and relevant legislation, the Handbook represents a detailed point of reference for other Shire volunteers, provides guidance to managers overseeing volunteer programs and recognises volunteers as an integral part of our organisation. The provision of a Handbook for volunteers is also in keeping with Work Health and Safety best practice principles, working to protect the employer and the volunteer.

The Shire has many different activities that volunteers engage in (mainly at the Kodja Place precinct, the Kojonup Library and as Friends of Myrtle Benn) working alongside staff to deliver and enhance services and initiatives offered by the Shire. Without the support and contribution provided by volunteers, some of these services and initiatives would be difficult to sustain into the future.

The main suggested updates as of this review are to remove references to Springhaven Lodge as a place to volunteer for the Shire, as this is now directly through Hall and Prior (attachment 9.4.7.1).

SUMMARY

To consider a variation in capital request to transfer funds from the Sporting Facility Reserve Account (which includes the Swimming Pool) for an emergency asset maintenance request to electrically bond all metal items within 1.25m from the pool to the main earthing system of the premises.

BACKGROUND

Council Policy 2.1.8 – 'Financial Governance' has a section relating to reserve accounts, which states as follows:

'In addition to grant funding, the Shire's reserve accounts are one of the primary funding sources for major projects and will be prioritised in the annual budget.

Cash reserves are to be established and maintained to accumulate funds for the following purposes:

- 1. To smooth funding allocations over future years;
- 2. To offset liabilities in respect of previously earned employee entitlements to the extent they require an outflow of funds not allocated in the annual budget;
- 3. To meet statutory obligations;
- 4. To fund renewal of existing physical/built assets;
- 5. To fund future strategic initiatives and the provision of new services and facilities to future residents;
- 6. To buffer against unpredictable events;
- 7. To hold unspent grants and contributions; and
- 8. Other purposes as determined by the Council from time to time.

When preparing the annual budget each year, consideration will be given to establishing reserve accounts for major projects as contained within the Community Strategic Plan.

In September 2024 the Projects Manager and Regulatory Services requested Council to approve withdrawing \$7,453.60 from the Sporting Facility Reserve to fund urgent earthing of metal structures at the swimming pool to ensure safety of the Community and Team Members.

This was approved by Council.

COMMENT

This report is seeking a variation in the cost of earthing the pool facility as required by regulation. An additional \$9,299.04 is required to bring the earthing up to the revised standards.

Since the original quote to undertake this work the standards for the earthing have been revised and the cost to execute the standards has increased.

The original quote each metal structure was expected to be earthed next to the metal assets. New Regulations state all structures earthing needs to go into an underground earthing cable conduit leading to the main switchboard.

The scope was changed and revised quotes were requested from Contractors and established that an additional \$9299.04 would be needed to complete the work to standard. This comes down to the total of \$ 16,752.64 to be withdrawn from the Sporting Reserve.

It requires an urgent correction for the safety of our community members and Shire staff.

Quotes received for replacement equipment:

- 1. BK Thomson Quote 00003307
- 2. Salty Creek Electrical Quote QT00198 \$19473.63

Quotes received for variation Earthing around Swimming Pool:

- 1. BK Thomson Quote 00003384 \$16752.64
- 2. Salty Creek Electrical Quote QT00198 \$19473.63

The author recommends using BK Thomson as it is a less expensive option, and BK Thomson is a local contractor used by the Shire for many years.

It is recommended that the variation funds be sourced from the Sporting Facility Reserve and transferred to fund this work.

Cr Mathwin: Provision of medical services, in the submission that was put together and discussed there is an item that talks to \$100,000 for expenditure on health. 6 of the Shires received the \$100,000. What has Kojonup claimed?

Cr Bilney: Kojonup has not been eligible for the Grant as previous costs were being expended by a separate organisation, not the Shire. Now the Shire is funding the medical facility it will now be able to make a claim against the medical facilities adjustor. Kojonup has not detailed any expenses that surround the medical provision. In the ALGA report, the Shires are advocating to increase the cap. Mechanism is perfectly in place, this year we have claimed the rent forgone for the provision of the house. Next year the shire will claim \$250,000 it pays directly for the services, the vehicle and house costs.

Cr Mathwin: 54 governments received the maximum amount of \$100,000. Only 5 of the 6 Local Governments received medical facilities cost adjuster and the Shire of Kojonup was not granted the cost because the shire work with a local not for profit to engage a General Practitioner (GP). Other Shires who have equal and similar expenditure, because they are directly paying the medical centre, can Kojonup apply for the \$100,000.

Grant Thompson, CEO: For clarity, 54 Shires received a portion of the adjustor, only 6 received the whole amount of \$100,000. The issue here is that in previous years Kojonup has not directly expended the funds. However, in previous years the Shire has not allocated the loan toward the adjustor and it had been missed as a medical facility cost, mainly due to the fact the Shire has not incurred the majority of the medical services costs. It was the George Church Community Medical Centre providing the funds. Now the Shire is directly funding the services it can now make the claim in subsequent years.

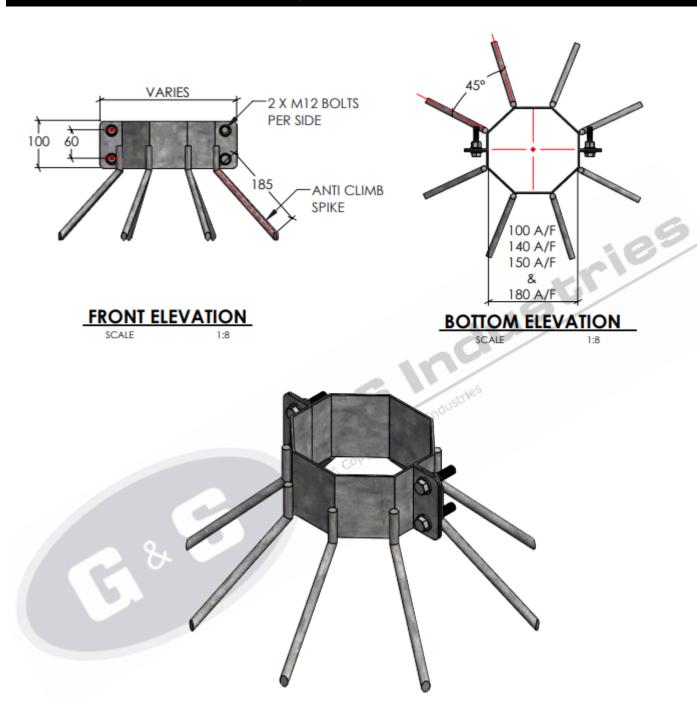

A Word from the Shire President



I am pleased to present to the Community, the Shire of Kojonup Annual Report for the 2023/24 financial year. 2023/24 has been a challenging year with the Council being internally focused on governance, performance and finalising the growth phase of the Federal Government Local Road and Community Infrastructure Programs (LRCIP).

It is fair to state that in this 23/24 financial year the Council's focus has been on two key governance areas;

- 1. Internal financial and management controls; and
- 2. Improving the financial decisions of the Council.

The Council relies on an established Audit & Risk Committee providing insight into the risks of the Shire and advising Council on potential governance threats to our organisation.

It has come to pass that many of the financial control issues that Auditors have previously identified have been rectified and improved over the past three years. This is reflected in the outcome from the recent audited finances and the meetings your Council has had with both Lincolns, the Shire auditors, and Office of the Auditor General. Both these organisations stated the Shire has improved materially over the past few years with transparent financial management and oversight of its governance and risk.

As a community resident you should also be aware that this audit was not just about financial controls and management, but covered a cross section of governance across the whole organisation, including risk management, contracts leases and agreements management, compliance audit to regulations, records and ICT controls, financial decisions by Council and other areas of strategy, workplace plans and the implementation of the corporate business plan. Overall, the Shire has been provided with positive feedback about its management and compliance frameworks. This doesn't mean we are perfect, far from it and we still have a long way to go.

The Council is currently in a cultural and organisational change phase that will continue for a few years yet and it is not time to be complacent. The Council takes its obligations to regulatory compliance very seriously. There are still many areas to improve upon. The Council has faced difficult decisions this year, and I can assure you each councillor takes their responsibility very seriously.

Change does not come to fruition without a plan or the right people to implement the plan. As a result, I would like to thank our Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Grant Thompson, and the Management Team for the work it has undertaken throughout the year on the Community's behalf. It is they who ensure the organisational frameworks are managed and controlled to improve our organisational processes and build our workforce.

It is not an easy job to implement change but have no doubt the Council is focused on continuous improvement to create value the Shire needs to be sustainable and improve liveability over time.

The Council appreciates that some key positions have remained vacant over the course of this year and this places an increased workload on others around the Shire. To all our Team Members the Council recognises your input and thanks you for your efforts.

I must also extend my gratitude to all my fellow councillors for their contributions and effort within the Council. To support the changes required and steady the ship has not been easy so thanks to all the Councillors who were involved during the 2023/24 period.

Councillors' dedication and hard work are invaluable to the direction of the Shire, and I urge Community Members to consider standing for Council at some point to contribute to the future of your Shire.

I would also like to acknowledge and thank the many incredible volunteers in our Shire, particularly our bushfire and emergency responders, who selflessly dedicate countless hours each week to serve the community and contribute to the culture in Kojonup. Your commitment, professionalism and sacrifice are noticed and very much appreciated by everyone.

There are many decisions in this year that have created value but may be unseen by everyone.

- In 2023/24 the Council was able to finalise the construction of the Men's Shed;
- Built an EV Charging station;

- in conjunction with the George Church Community Medical Centre agreed on a pathway to secure, and for Council to fund, Medical services in Kojonup, provide a house, a vehicle and cash funding to secure the services of Livingston Medical Services. The community has clearly expressed the importance of having a full-time Medical Service and the Council has listened.

Chief Executive Officer's Report



The Kojonup Community deserves much from its Shire, particularly value for the money it provides through the collection of rates. We call this Community Return on Capital. As the CEO, I am committed to best practice and continuous improvement for the Shire of Kojonup to increase the Community Return on Capital.

This entails a strong focus on improving all the required management controls and regulatory requirements, which are many. Have we got it perfect yet, no, but we are on the path of improvement.

The Kojonup Shire is a medium sized organisation and it needs to be run efficiently to maximise value creation. It is not a large Shire nor is it a small Shire. In fact, compared to its peers it is the middle child of Shires in this Region. It has to operate like a larger Shire but with scarcer resources to implement projects and activities.

Even before the Shire can focus on capital projects, it has obligations to provide certain services as part of its regulatory functions:

- 1. Roads and Infrastructure;
- 2. Waste Management Services;
- 3. Regulatory functions such as:
 - a. Environmental Health,
 - b. Emergency services,
 - c. Town Planning and
 - d. other regulatory building services supporting growth.
- 4. Financial and risk management;
- 5. Climate and community resilience;
- 6. Asset management;
- 7. Stakeholder relationships;
- 8. Community Development;

and more. These are but a few of the services that the Shire must fund from the pool of monies it receives from the community.

Over the past ten years, during the Shires build phase, the Shire has attracted significant external funds and has seen the build of a few great assets; new and renewed staff housing, resident housing for community, netball courts & sports complex renewals, Harrison Place toilets, new emergency services tower and more.

As a result of this growth the Shire borrowed matching funds to Grants, accumulating in a high debt level. What this means is that over the past two years the Shire has had to implement austerity measures and cost management to ensure the cost of borrowings (interest and principal) can be serviced and the principal debt reduced over time ensuring positive cashflow.

Furthermore, the budget process is regulated such that a zero sum budget is required, that is all monies coming in must be spent or placed in a reserve account for a specific future use. It is important that community members appreciate any budget requests they are seeking should be presented in the months of March or April for Council to consider them for the subsequent year.

I tell you this because the Shire receives a lot of requests for funding or maintenance and other requests from community during the budget year and this sometimes causes angst amongst members that the Shire "has no money". This is not the case, but what it does mean is the Council has already allocated the money it is responsible for and doesn't have discretionary money to undertake additional projects or tasks.

As the President stated it has been an internally focused year for the Shire, working on finalising the capex program that had been previously funded from the build phase and commencing focus on the strategic Pillar of a High Performing Shire. Performance of financial controls, of people and roles, project management and regulatory functions and other important functional aspects within the organisation.

Driven by the Strategic Community Plan Pillars, our focus remains on the overall performance of the Shire, ensuring roads are improving with the resources we have at our disposal, community asset management remains a high priority, and subdivisions related to housing and economic growth is on the development radar, all aligned to the strategy.

The following list are the main Shire Managed capital projects in 2023/24:

- 1. Roads to Recovery (RTR) program of roads to the value of \$299,262.07
- 2. Soldier Road Footpath \$298,900.67 (RTR)
- 3. Regional Road Group (RRG) construction to the value of \$3,447,832.63
- 4. Major Works Rural Trees (Hubbe Road) \$138,747.17 (Council funded)
- 5. New town furniture up to \$44,000
- 6. Completed the Emergency Services Tower circa \$300,000
- 7. Purchased new Plant and Equipment up to \$150,000
- 8. Completed the Menshed \$425,000
- 9. Renewed Staff Housing \$200,000
- 10. Old School re-roofing \$100,000
- 11. Cat Pound \$6,500

This coming year the Team will be focusing on implementing new Information Communication Technologies, an electronic document and records management system (EDRMS), upgrading the operating systems and cyber security, and a new Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System to improve our financial management and reporting, human resource management, customer relationship management, complaints and praise management, infringement management and many other functions that the Shire needs to operate.

The Shire has gone to market and identified its preferred technology partners through the required procurement processes. These systems will drive productivity, a better experience for our community and easier access to information for our Team Members. This is an 18 month program so please be patient with the Team as we roll this out.

The Council is constantly directing the Administration Team that Community Consultation and communication is a priority. Therefore, this coming year you will start to see a change in tack on how we communicate to you and a re-fresh of community development. We are currently reviewing our social media platforms to determine how we can better communicate with community.

I would like to acknowledge the great team at the Shire. We couldn't do this without the right people. Attracting and retaining the people with the right skills is extremely important and a challenge. We are introducing a program of Community First, Safety Always. We want our Team Members to focus on good community service and at the same time go home safe every day to their families.

Although you may not see as much activity outside the organisation, internally the Team is actively implementing new ways of working through systems, processes and better controls to support a more efficient and high performing Council. Do we always get it right? No, but we will always strive to do so.

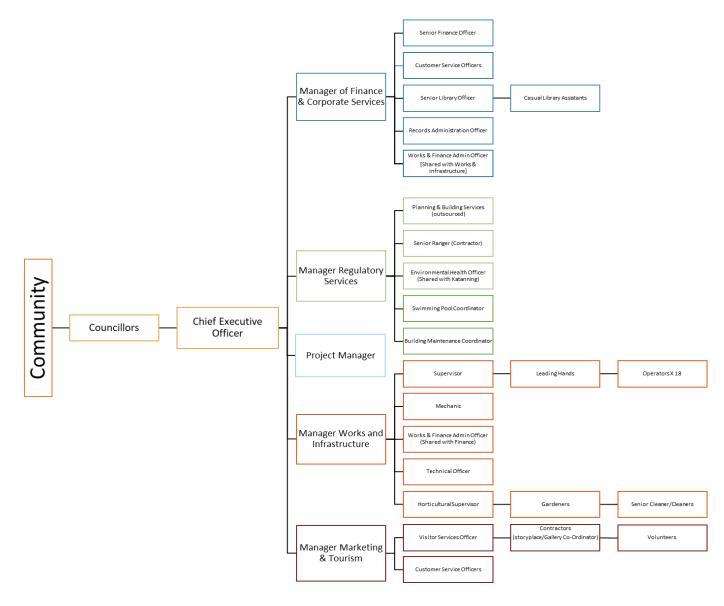

Plan for the Future - Strategic Community Plan (SCP)
In accordance with the local government integrated planning requirements the Shire of Kojonup has reviewed its Strategic

Community Plan (SCP) and adopted a new SCP, titled *Placemaking*, which sets the strategic direction for the organisation for ten (10) years from 2023 – 2033. It is the community's plan and is based primarily on the feedback from the Community.

Long Term F

From this feedback, a 10-year, Strategic Community Plan was formed. This SCP was named 'Placemaking' and focused on building the liveability in Kojonup around enhancing cultural experiences and asset planning.

The Council has since formed its operating plan, the Corporate Business Plan (CBP), which lays out the implementation and execution of the Strategic Community Plan, all aligned to the feedback received.

The initiatives are prioritised based on the community needs and targets a sustained level of services to support a desired **population of 2250.**

It should be noted that 30% of community members wanted high population growth (i.e. greater than 2400 by 2032) while another 30% of community members partaking in the survey wanted a slight increase in population (i.e. near 2000 by 2032). This is a stretch target.

The number one mentioned key issue potentially **inhibiting** population growth was housing and accommodation. This features heavily in the new SCP. Many community members sited the lack of a district high school going through to year 12 as being another issue for holding population down.

Community members expressed pages of highlights when considering Kojonup's **point of difference**. 27% of all responses related to Kojonup's central location, while 11% of responses highlighted Kojonup's significant history and culture as the point of difference.

Focusing on 'living in Kojonup', 11% of respondents noted that high school education (not having yr.11 and 12) was a limiting factor, another 11% said that lack of housing options was a concern, while a further 11% cited the poor quality of roads as an issue. It is also worth noting that 9% of the responses related to improving crime and safety. There was much positivity on the character and culture of Kojonup people.

With regards **visitation**, community members strategically highlighted that focus should be on increasing or improving the short-term experiences of visitors, rather than multi-day stop-overs. This is because Kojonup is considered 'on the way' to other places and all roads lead through Kojonup. Many comments were received regarding the main road/town site in regard to safety, beautification, signage and off-street parking.

Regarding **business development**, respondents suggested encouraging a diverse economy, including catering for those who 'work-from-home', supporting new business but also importantly supporting the current businesses to grow. Feedback was gathered on ways existing businesses can thrive.

Telecommunications also was a trigger for business growth, thus population growth.

One other aspect the Community informed the Council on, they want a high performing Shire. This became a pillar of the community plan and is reflected heavily in the current execution phase because we need to

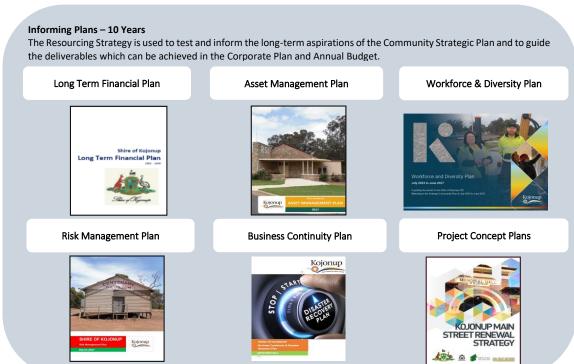
get the base right first and then grow as a community. Community members created a 'north star' vision when they created the SCP, a placemaking vision that goes to the heart of Kojonup, its culture, growth and liveability. The updated Corporate Business Plan (CBP) was created and adopted by Council and sets the direction and priorities for Kojonup until 2027. The CBP is the first step towards achieving the community targets and sets out key initiatives for the first four years of the strategy.

Strategic Direction









The four (4) 'key pillars' established in the *Placemaking* strategy are as follows:

- 1. **Lifestyle** (supporting the lifestyle and liveability in Kojonup);
- 2. **Economics** (Kojonup invests in its own prosperity and drives economic growth);
- 3. **Visitation** (supporting lifestyle activities and experiences in Kojonup)
- 4. **Performance** (supporting the social responsibility, Civic duty, Community relationships and the Shires obligation to operational excellence).

The community's aspirations in each theme are described, followed by a commitment from the Shire of Kojonup to work towards realising these aspirations. Each commitment by the Shire includes an implementation timeframe that relates to the Shire's four year corporate business planning cycle.

There is a reason these are 10 year plans. Change takes time to plan, fund, develop, embed and complete. When you add culture on top of growth it can take longer.

The following commentary outlines actions taken or about to be commenced for each objective within the CBP. You will see that the Shire has been steadily working toward execution in the following dashboard reports and the strategy timeline is on par with the benchmark. Anything above 2 at this point in time is on track.

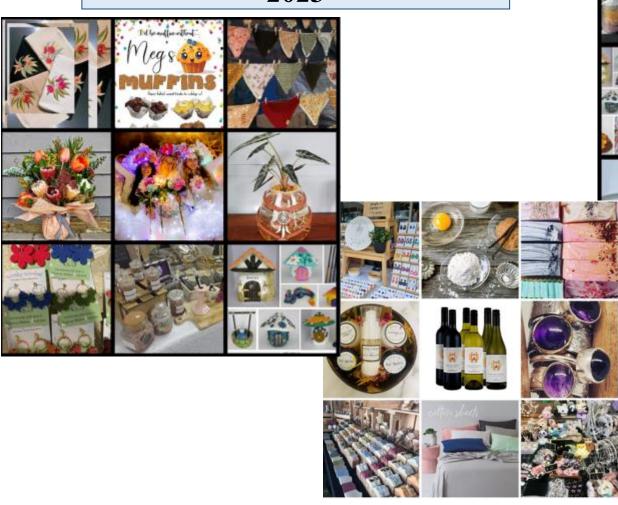

Statutory Statements

National Competition Policy

Local Governments are required to report their progress in implementing National Competition Policy in their annual report. There are a number of specific requirements placed on local government in the areas of competitive neutrality, legislation review and structural reform. We are conscious of this obligation when interacting and discussing with other local governments related to shared platforms.

Competitive Neutrality

The principle of competitive neutrality is that government businesses should not enjoy a competitive advantage or disadvantage, simply as a result of their public sector ownership.

Competitive Neutrality should apply to all significant business activities which generate a user-pays income of over \$200,000 per annum unless it can be shown it is in the public interest.

A public benefit test is used to determine if competitive neutrality is in the public interest. This involves assessing the benefits of implementing competitive neutrality against the costs. If the benefits exceed the costs, competitive neutrality should be implemented.

Structural Review of Public Monopolies

- There were no instances where structural reform principles were applied during the reporting period; and
- There were no instances where structural reform was considered but not applied in the reporting period.

Legislative Review

The Annual Report is to include a statement of which local laws have been reviewed, the conclusions of those reviews and a forward strategy for all local laws still to be reviewed. Local Laws are required by legislation to be reviewed every eight years.

During 2023/2024 the Shire of Kojonup Cat Local Law, from the previous year, was sent back to the Council for further edits and the Council was required to agree on an undertaking related to managing cats in public spaces. It is now in effect with those undertakings agreed to by Council.

Disability Access and Inclusion Report

The Shire of Kojonup reports all DAIP activities against outcomes in its DAIP Strategy. During the 2023/2024 reporting period:

- 1. New disability parking bays were created at The Kodja Place and Black Cockatoo café to improve accessibility for community members with disability.
- 2. The toilets in Kodja Place were renovated to include accessible sinks and bathrooms. The Kodja Place bathrooms hand dryers were placed lower for easy access by people with disability especially in wheelchairs.
- 3. Part of the Shire's Ten Year Footpath Improvement / Replacement Program, took place by improving footpaths on Soldier road (leading to the cemetery and Myrtle Benn Nature Reserve) and Benn Parade (leading to the Kojonup Sport Precinct). These upgrades will ensure improved accessibility throughout the community.

- 4. The Shire of Kojonup recently completed the new Electric Vehicle Charging station with 6 charging bays. These charging bays were designed to have improved ramps and pathways for accessibility. The build of the ramp to the pay meter has been designed to give easy wheelchair access. This charging station has increased the accessibility to a public facility to minimise any lost opportunities by those with a disability.
- 5. Disability awareness training was provided to team members in July 2023. Annual staff performance reviews provide staff with the opportunity to discuss further training requirements specific to their role. These activities mean that staff are now better equipped to provide services to people with disability.
- 6. The Shire of Kojonup recently launched a new accessible website for the Kojonup Shire which now meets WCAG 2.0 standard, Level A using high contrast and text re-sizing options. These upgrades allow people with disability especially those with vision impairments to have better access to the Shire's online information. The Shire of Kojonup ensures that all public information regarding community groups and Health Services Providers are updated and available on the website.



Related Party Disclosures

There were nil Related Party Disclosures during the 2023/2024 period.

State Records Act 2000

The Shire of Kojonup is responsible for managing the Shire's records in accordance with the *State Records Act 2000* and the Recordkeeping Plan RKP2015028/1.

The Shire of Kojonup has a legislatively current Recordkeeping Plan, and Information Management Policy, and has in place Procedure, Risk Assessment and Records Training (Tips & Tricks) documents.

The Shire is now focused on Privacy & Responsible Information Sharing (PRIS) regulations formulated by State Government under the *Privacy & Responsible Information Sharing Act 2024* (PRIS Act). The legislation broadly aligns to the following:

1. guiding privacy principles and a framework to govern the collection, use, disclosure and security of personal information across the public sector;

- 2. a mandatory information breach notification scheme, requiring agencies to notify the Information Commissioner and affected individuals of serious information breaches involving personal information;
- a statutory mechanism for WA public sector agencies to share information only when adhering to new stringent standards for risk assessment, decision making, governance and transparency; and
- 4. a mechanism that supports Aboriginal data governance in WA, by requiring that Aboriginal people and communities are involved or consulted when government information that primarily affects Aboriginal people is shared.

Freedom of Information

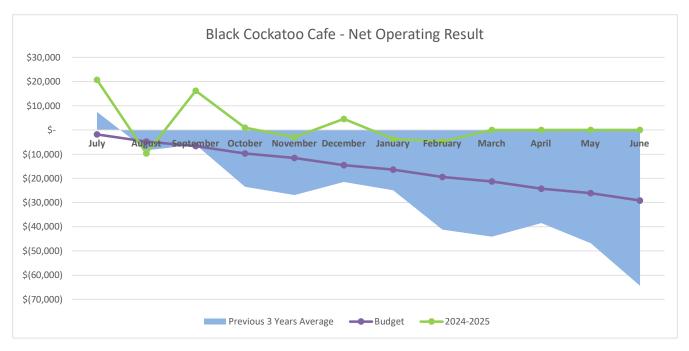

- DN100 and DN200 unslotted pipe made from polypropylene of stiffness grade SN8 and Class 400 complying with AS 2439.1.
 - (Vinidex Draincoil pipes are a suitable product range for the above applications.)
- DN225 SCJ Stormwater pipe with a stiffness grade of SN8 complying with AS1260:2017

Alternative pipe product ranges will be allowed if they are equivalent in function, quality etc. to the approval of the Principal.

Joints, couplings, elbows, tees, and caps shall comply with AS2439.1 and only the manufacturer's recommended fittings shall be used.

6.2. Envelope Material (Aggregate) - Slotted Pipe

The envelope material shall consist of 5-7mm washed granite (blue metal). The material shall be sourced from a reputable supplier and shall be free of any vegetation, debris, rubbish, and clay.

The Contractor shall provide to the Superintendent a Particle Size Distribution (PSD) and a sample of the proposed material for approval prior to importing to site.

6.3. Imported Material General Requirements – Unslotted Pipe

All imported material supplied by the Contractor shall not contain any of the following:

- material susceptible to volume change, including marine mud, soil with a liquid limit exceeding 65% or a plasticity index exceeding 25%.
- clay and collapsible soils.
- peat, vegetation, timber, organic, soluble, or perishable material.
- dangerous or toxic material or material susceptible to combustion.
- metal, rubber, plastic, or synthetic material.

SPECIFICATION 5 of 15

diseased vegetation (including dieback), seeds or weeds.

6.4. Geotextile Filter Sock

Geotextile filter sock shall NOT be used in these works.

6.5. Installation

6.5.1. Set Out

The Contractor shall set out new drainage works in accordance with the Drawings and set out information provided.

The alignment and inspection locations shall be clearly marked out and approved by the Project Superintendent prior to trenching commencing.

6.5.2. Design Changes

Design changes must be approved by the Project Superintendent in writing.

6.5.3. Pipework General

All pipe installation work shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and AS/NZS 3500:2003 Plumbing and Drainage.

All jointing shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

All pipes and fittings supplied shall be new and free from cracks, chips, dents, deformities, and all other defects.

The nominal diameter of all pipes and fittings shall be in accordance with the drawings.

Handling, transporting and storage shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

Trenches shall be excavated to the line, level and grade indicated in the drawings.

The trench depth in relation to the invert of the pipe shall be sufficient to allow for bedding or envelope material.

6.5.4. Pipework Slotted

The minimum thickness of envelope material under and around pipes shall be in accordance with the Drawings and shall consist of 5mm washed granite.

All pipe laying shall commence from the downstream end. Care shall be taken to ensure that the joints are free from dirt or other obstructions.

Lawn sand shall be installed to fill the remainder of the trench flush with the existing surface.

Prior to the placement of lawn sand, the Contractor shall survey the installed pipe work.

New turf to be installed and compacted within 24 hours of harvest.

6.5.5. Pipework Unslotted

The minimum thickness of clean fill sand under and around pipes shall be in accordance with the Drawings.

All pipe laying shall commence from the downstream end. Care shall be taken to ensure that the joints are free from dirt or other obstructions.

Lawn sand shall be installed to fill the remainder of the trench flush with the existing surface.

Prior to the placement of lawn sand, the Contractor shall survey the installed pipe work.

New turf to be installed and compacted within 24 hours of harvest.

6.5.6. Excavated Material

All excavated material shall be disposed of offsite by the Contractor.

The Contractor shall indicate to the Superintendent where any excavated pavement material, spoil, oversized or unsuitable material will be disposed of offsite.

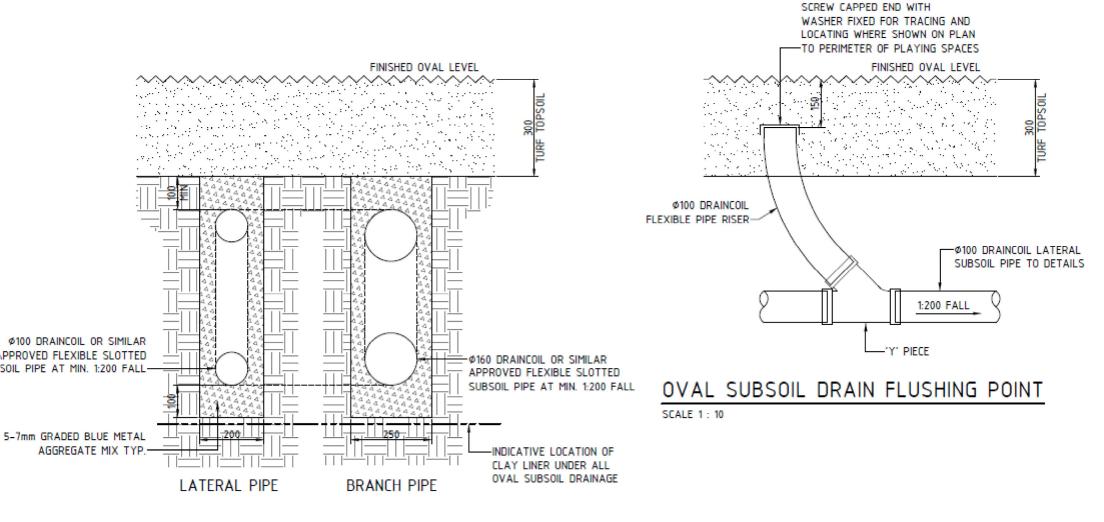
6.5.7. On-Site Stockpiles

The Contractor shall store only sufficient materials on-site as are necessary to allow timely and efficient progress of the work and shall locate stockpiles of excavated or imported material where they cause no interference to the public, drainage system or vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

Stockpiled material shall not:

- a. obstruct clear lines of sight for drivers.
- b. come into contact with structures, fences, trees, or other property.
- c. be positioned under overhead electrical conductors.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

AUDIT & RISK COMMITTEE

Established under Section 7.1 of the *Local Government Act 1995 (Act)* - every local government must have an Audit and Risk Committee (ARC).

Terms of Reference

ARC is responsible for assisting and independently advising Council in recommending appropriate actions and controls with regards to audit, risk oversight, governance, finances and systems of internal control.

Its role is to provide oversight related to significant risk exposures and control issues, including fraud risks, governance issues and other matters as necessary or requested by the CEO or Council. This is to ensure the Shire's activities are fully compliant with legislation, regulations, accounting and reporting Standards and that the Shire is executing its responsibility to the community in efficiently utilising their assets.

The ARC is not responsible for the executive management of these functions. The ARC will engage with management in a constructive and professional manner in discharging its advisory responsibilities and formulating its advice to Council.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Members of the ARC are expected to observe the legal and regulatory obligations of the Local Government.

Committee members must not use or disclose information obtained through the ARC except in meeting the ARC's responsibilities, or unless expressly agreed by the President of the Shire.

Committee Members must adhere to the Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates and demonstrate behaviour which reflects the Shire's desired culture.

ARC Members are expected to:

- 1. act in the best interests of the Shire as a whole;
- 2. apply good analytical skills, objectivity and good judgement;
- 3. express opinions constructively and openly, raise issues that relate to the ARC's responsibilities and pursue lines of enquiry in relation to the "Risk Controls" the Shire has in place;
- 4. contribute the time required to meet their responsibilities; and
- 5. exercise due care, diligence and skill when performing their duties.

Member Duties/Responsibilities:

- Oversee the Shire's risk management, through:
 - a) Biennial review of the Shire's Risk Management Policy;
 - b) Recommending and reviewing the Shire's Risk Appetite Statement in order to recommend the organisation's Risk Tolerance to the Council;
 - c) Reviewing reports on the movement of the Shire's current strategic risks, and the emergence of new strategic risks;
 - d) Overseeing strategic risks which sit outside of the Shire's Risk Appetite; and
 - e) Monitor and receive reports concerning the development, implementation and on-going management of the Shire's Risk Management Plan and the effectiveness of its Risk Management Framework;
 - Overseeing the Shire's processes for managing fraud and corruption, by:
 - a) Performing oversight responsibilities and advising Council;

- b) Enquiring with the CEO and the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) about whether they are aware of any actual, suspected, or alleged fraud or corruption affecting the Shire; and
- c) Reviewing summary reports from the CEO on communication from external parties including regulators that indicate problems in the internal control system or inappropriate management actions.
- Overseeing the Shire's financial management and legislative compliance, by:
 - a) Reviewing the Shire's annual Compliance Audit Return and reporting the results of that review to Council, in accordance with the Local Government (Audit) Regulations 1996;
 - b) Receiving and reviewing reports from the CEO regarding the appropriateness and effectiveness of the Shire's legislative compliance and ensuring any non-compliances are rectified on a timely basis;
 - c) Considering and recommending adoption of the annual financial report to Council;
 - d) Receive and review the biannual reports from the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) regarding the appropriateness and effectiveness of the Shire's risk management, internal controls and legislative compliance and make recommendations to Council; and
 - e) Consider and recommend adoption of the Annual Financial Report to the Council;
- Overseeing the internal audit function, by;
 - a) Assessing and making a recommendation to Council on an Internal Audit Plan to ensure that it comprehensively covers material business risks that may threaten the achievement of strategic objectives and which identifies key risks and control mechanisms;
 - b) Reviewing the quality and timeliness of internal audit reports;
 - c) Monitoring the implementation of internal audit recommendations; and
 - d) Considering the implications of internal audit findings on the organisation, its risks, and controls.
- Fulfilling responsibilities pertaining to external audit, by:
 - a) Reviewing reports from the OAG, including auditor's reports, closing reports and management letters;
 - b) Reviewing management's response to OAG findings and recommendations;
 - c) Monitoring the implementation of recommendations from external audits;
 - d) Reviewing results of relevant OAG audit reports and better practice publications for guidance on good practices, including any assessment by the CEO; and
 - e) Examine the reports of the auditor after receiving a report from the CEO on the matters and:
 - a. determine if any matters raised require action to be taken by the Shire; and
 - b. ensure that appropriate action is taken in respect of those matters.

Seek information or obtain expert advice through the CEO on matters of concern within the scope of the Committee's terms of reference following authorisation from the Council.

Membership

Four (4) Councillors; and

Two (2) Community Members

Supporting Team Members

Manager Financial and Corporate Services Governance and Rates Officer Chief Executive Officer or delegated nominee

Meetings

Quarterly for ordinary meetings and as required related to audit functions.

Open to Public: No

Voting: Voting is in accordance with Section 5.21 of the Act.

Confidentiality: All Committee members will be required to adhere to the Shire's confidentiality requirements as per the Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates.

Conduct of Meetings: ARC Meetings will be held in accordance with the *Act*, subsidiary legislation, and the Shire's Standing Orders.

Committee Sitting Fees and Reimbursements

The Shire is prohibited under Section 5.98-5.99 of the Act, and Regulation 30 of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996, to pay a council member a fee for attending the ARC.

Currently, the Shire is prohibited from remunerating independent committee members; however, reimbursement of approved expenses for independent members may be paid to each independent external member in accordance with Section 5.100 of the *Act*.

The rules regarding remuneration for independent committee members are currently under review as part of the Local Government Reforms (2023). These guidelines are subject to any legislation changes.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider the 2023/2024 Audited Annual Financial Report, incorporating the Audit Report and associated correspondence and consider whether to recommend to the Council to adopt the 2023/2024 Audited Reports.

BACKGROUND

Each local government is to prepare an annual financial report for each financial year. The report is a record of the Shire of Kojonup's (Shire) activities for the financial year and is an integral part of the accountability principles established for local governments in Western Australia.

COMMENT

The Audit Report and Annual Financial Report will be considered by the Council at its 25 February 2025 Ordinary Meeting. The Auditor's Management Letter is provided as additional information to the Committee and Council for transparency and full disclosure. It is suggested that the Audited Annual Financial Report, incorporating the aforementioned documents, be considered by Council at an Ordinary Council Meeting to be called for 3.00pm, Tuesday, 25 February 2025.

The Annual Electors Meeting must be held within 56 days of the Council accepting the Annual Financial Report, with appropriate time being allowed after adoption to give notice of the meeting, say 14 days. This effectively means that the Annual Electors Meeting needs to be held by 22 April 2025. In previous years, the Annual Electors Meeting has been held in the evening following the Ordinary Council Meeting (OCM). However, as the OCM is in late April it is recommended that the Annual Electors Meeting be held on Wednesday 9 April 2025 at the Kojonup Sporting Complex.

The Annual Electors Meeting will be publicised in the Great Southern Herald, on the Shire website and Shire Facebook page as soon as possible after the date is set, and in the next available Kojonup News and Shire mediums.

Key to ratings

The Ratings in this management letter are based on the audit team's assessment of risks and concerns with respect to the probability and/or consequence of adverse outcomes if action is not taken. We give consideration to these potential adverse outcomes in the context of both quantitative impact (for example financial loss) and qualitative impact (for example inefficiency, non-compliance, poor service to the public or loss of public confidence).

Significant - Those findings where there is potentially a significant risk to the entity should the finding not be addressed by the entity promptly. A significant rating could indicate the need for a modified audit opinion in the current year, or in a subsequent reporting period if not addressed. However, even if the issue is not likely to impact the audit opinion, it should be addressed promptly.

Moderate - Those findings which are of sufficient concern to warrant action being taken by the entity as soon as practicable.

Minor - Those findings that are not of primary concern but still warrant action being taken.

Contained within the 2023/2024 Audit Report were matters identified as significant by the Auditor. The matters raised as significant by the Auditor were as follows:

1. Employee related provisions

Finding

This issue was first raised in 2023.

From our review of employee long-service leave provisions at 30 June 2024 we noted

provisions balances still exist for 76 employees that are no longer employed by the Shire. The estimated overstatement of the Shire's long service leave provision was \$162,721 at 30 June 2024. Subsequently this finding was corrected in the financial report.

Rating: Significant (2023 Significant)

Implication

Where inaccurate employee data is used to estimate the Shire's employee related provisions, there is an increased risk of material errors occurring in the annual financial report.

Recommendation

The Shire should review the employee data used to develop and recognise employee related provisions and ensure this is current and up to date each year. Adjustments should be recognised to reduce the liability balances for any entitlements paid or where the entitlement is no longer required to be recognised.

Management comment

The Shire will enforce an exit process and checklist when employees leave the Shire to ensure their entitlements are removed from the payroll system. In 2025 the Shire intends to hire a Human Resource Coordinator to coordinate with payroll on exiting the employee from the Shire.

2. Credit card transactions not reported to council

Finding

During our review of the minutes from the Shire Council meetings, we observed that the accounts paid listing presented to the council did not include transactions made using credit cards or purchasing cards. This omission is not in compliance with Section 13A of the Local Government Act (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, which mandates that all accounts paid, including credit card transactions, must be listed. We did not identify any fraudulent transactions in our review of credit card or purchasing card transactions.

Rating: Minor

Implication

The exclusion of credit card and purchasing card transactions constitutes a Non-compliance with the Local Government (financial management) Regulations 1996 requirements and limits visibility into these transactions, increasing the risk of undetected errors, misuse, or fraud.

Recommendation

All corporate credit and purchasing card transactions be submitted to the council for review and approval at the meeting immediately following the payment of these cards. This practice will ensure compliance with the Local Government Financial Management Regulations and enhance transparency and accountability to both the council and the public.

Management comment

The Shire recognises that more information is required to be reported and will improve the reporting process to include the data in the agenda report for Council at the same time the monthly payment listings are provided.

3. Asset register – land & buildings

Finding

During our review asset records and the asset register we noted the following:

- We were unable to identify or locate the following properties in order to confirm ownership via Landgate online enquiry:
 - LB0097 Harper Road Townsite (\$38,000)
 - LB0236 Lot 19 Bowler Place Townsite (\$14,000).
- The following properties are included in the Shire's asset register, but are not owned by the Shire:
 - LB0221 33 Newstead Road Townsite (\$35,000)
 - o LB0235 Lot 107A Albany Highway Townsite (\$500).
- Land additions totalling \$10,661 that were included in the general ledger were not reflected in the additions to the asset register.

The lots identified above have been reported as uncorrected errors in the management representation letter and should be subject to further review & adjustment if required in 2024-25.

Rating: Moderate

Implication

Asset transactions that are not recorded correctly or in a timely manner can result in the misstatement of asset values in the financial report.

Recommendation

Management should ensure that asset records and registers are regularly reviewed and movements during the period have been appropriately reflected on the registers. Where assets that are not owned by the Shire are identified, they should be removed from the asset register using the appropriate accounting treatment. We also recommend that adequate detail be included for all assets in order to enable these assets to be identified easily.

Management comment

The Shire will implement a verification process of ownership. Once ownership determined the Shire will either remove them from the asset register or confirm Shire ownership. Secondary the Shire will implement a review process for the asset register to verify the Shires assets at least once per financial year or as required when assets are purchased or disposed of.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for the Audit and Risk Committee to consider, and recommend to Council, the adoption of the Compliance Audit Return for 2024.

BACKGROUND

Completion of the Compliance Audit Return (CAR) is mandatory for each local government. Regulations 14 and 15 of the *Local Government (Audit) Regulations 1996* require a local government to carry out a compliance audit for each calendar year. A local government's Audit and Risk Committee must review the CAR and report same to Council to adopt after which a certified copy, together with a copy of the section of Council minutes adopting the CAR plus any other relevant information, must be submitted to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (Department) by 31 March each year.

Items of note for the Committee in the previous 2023 CAR included the following:

- all relevant persons to have lodged an annual return by 31 August annually;
- delayed receipt of the Shire's Audit Report;
- the need to complete a report on the training completed by Council members in the 2022/2023 year, by 31 July 2023; and
- the need for Council to adopt and publish a policy dealing with attendance of Council members and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) at events.

It should be noted that all of the above matters were dealt with accordingly. A policy dealing with Councillor and CEO attendance at events was adopted by Council at its 12 December 2023 Ordinary Meeting (CM 141/23).

COMMENT

The 2024 CAR has been completed following a review of processes and documentation for each activity/area in which compliance is being assessed against the *Local Government Act* 1995 and its associated regulations.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to review the Shire of Kojonup's (Shire) Volunteer Handbook.

BACKGROUND

The Shire's Volunteer Management Handbook (Handbook) was originally produced in 2016 in line with Council's adoption of its Volunteer Management Policy (Policy 2.3.8). Significant changes were made in November 2018 to form a less cumbersome and more user friendly Handbook and further reviews have been undertaken on an annual basis.

With the exception of volunteer firefighters who are recognised and supported via the Bush Fire Advisory Committee and relevant legislation, the Handbook represents a detailed point of reference for other Shire volunteers, provides guidance to managers overseeing volunteer programs and recognises volunteers as an integral part of our organisation. The provision of a Handbook for volunteers is also in keeping with Work Health and Safety best practice principles, working to protect the employer and the volunteer.

The Shire has many different activities that volunteers engage in (mainly at the Kodja Place precinct, the Kojonup Library and as Friends of Myrtle Benn) working alongside staff to deliver and enhance services and initiatives offered by the Shire. Without the support and contribution provided by volunteers, some of these services and initiatives would be difficult to sustain into the future.

COMMENT

The main suggested updates as of this review are to remove references to Springhaven Lodge as a place to volunteer for the Shire, as this is now directly through Hall and Prior (attachment 11.3.1).

TERMS OF REFERENCE

ROADS AND TECHNICAL SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE (RTSAC)

Terms of Reference

To oversee and make recommendation to the Council on all matters pertaining to the long term planning of civil and technical services to assets and roads, and on all matters concerning the capital upgrades and to the maintenance of those assets. This includes roads and all civil or technical works.

RTSAC is not responsible for the operational and executive management of Works and/or Technical Services as per the *Local Government Act 1995*. The RTSAC will engage with the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Manager Works and Services, and/or Manager Financial and Corporate Services in a constructive and professional manner in order to discharge its advisory responsibilities and formulate its advice to Council.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Members of RTSAC are expected to observe the legal and regulatory obligations of local government.

RTSAC members must not use or disclose information obtained through the RTSAC except in meeting the RTSAC's responsibilities, or unless expressly agreed by the President of the Shire.

RTSAC Members must adhere to the Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates, and demonstrate behaviour which reflects the Shire of Kojonup's (Shire) desired culture.

Members are expected to:

- 1. act in the best interests of the Shire as a whole;
- 2. apply good analytical skills, objectivity and good judgment;
- 3. express opinions constructively and openly, raise issues that relate to the RTSAC's responsibilities and pursue lines of enquiry in relation to Roads and Technical Services; and
- 4. exercise due care, diligence and skill when performing their duties.

Members Duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Oversee the Shire's Road and Technical Management Strategies and Plans, through:
 - a) Advising Council on Works & Services long term plans for civil works in the Shire;
 - b) Receiving the 10 year Plant & Equipment Plan, the 10 year Road Capital and Maintenance Plan and recommending adoption to Council;
 - c) Overseeing the inputs and specifications required for future road and depot projects across the Shire;
 - d) Reviewing reports on the level of the Shire's current road funding risks, and the emergence of road and technical services strategic risks; and
 - e) Monitor and receive performance reports concerning the performance of tenders and contractor works, specifications and the effectiveness of the Shire's Road & Technical Services Management Framework.
 - 2. Discuss and recommend naming frameworks for roads.
 - 3. Oversee the Shire's financial management of road contracts, by:
 - a) Reviewing the Shire's road and technical services actual financials against the long term plans including reviewing benchmarks for performance;
 - b) Receiving and reviewing reports from the CEO and Manager Works & Services regarding the appropriateness and effectiveness of the Shire's Road and Technical Services Management Framework and ensuring any non-compliances are rectified on a timely basis; and
 - c) Consider and recommend the adoption of the Roads & Technical Services Annual Operating

Plans & Budget to the Council.

These reported fires provide a vital argument when the Shire requires extra funding or there is a need for extra resources to be allocated to this area. All fires need to be reported to DFES Communications Centre. This allows a record of incidents which can be utilised for resource allocation.

11 GENERAL ITEMS

11.1 CESM – Shane Harris

- Note less fires in this 2024/2025 season than compared to previous season.
- Introduces Group Call from DFES and recommends that Shire of Kojonup Brigades start to use this Group Call. This will be at no cost to the Shire.

COMMITTEE DECISION

The Committee recommends to Council to adopt the DFES Group Call as presented at this meeting.

Moved: Nick Trethowan, Second: Ross Fryer Smith Carried 10/0

- Harvest Vehicle Movement Bans Chief Bush Fire officer does not have the power to shut down working plant / factories if they are working between four walls. Request from Chief Bush Fire Officer to implement stronger rules from the Shire of Kojonup side to stop these plant/factories from operating on Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban Days.
- A closer look will take place on the next Fire Break Notice to adjust the language on Harvest Vehicle movement Bans, and a check list as per Derek Jones suggestion will be created.
- Local Government Grant Scheme are open for the 2025/2026 season. If brigades wants to send their requests especially under \$1500.00. In the current 2024/2025 year the Shire was abled to put in new Cell Fi's in the two trucks (Muradup and Kojonup) as well as thermal imaging cameras.

- Policies discussions for the Shire of Kojonup Policy manual Hazard Reduction Burning by Brigades and Bush Fire Mitigation. Policies will be discussed at May 2025 meeting.
- Introduction of PAFTAC forms to use at a Bush Fire incident. The incident control officer should complete the form and then can use the data when they call Comms Centre. This will assist DFES to make decisions on how/where to send their resources. Negative feedback given regarding another checklist document, and that the incident control officers will not have the time / capability to complete the PAFTAC form.
- Alerts and Warnings are important to alert the public.

11.2 DFES – Derek Jones

- Notes attached (refer to 9.4.9.8 Kojonup BFAC DFES Notes February 2025)
- CEO requested a checklist to understand how the "high risk" areas are being established. Shire of Kojonup has more than 500 assets and is considered as "high risk".

11.3 Shire of Kojonup – Executive Officer - Grant Thompson

- Refer to letter received from community member at Muradup regarding their concerns about Bush fire mitigation control. The Shire is currently busy investigating and planning the next spraying season for Muradup to minimize the risk. The need for a community meeting to discuss the risks and to educate and give options should take place. (refer to 9.4.9.7 – Letter – Paul Grant)
- Local Emergency Management Committee request a desk top exercise to take place in the first week of May, to assist all participants to understand their roles in an emergency.
- Message media over two hundred new mobile numbers were added this season to message media from contractors, truck drivers and new community members. This is an important way of informing our community of any threats and emergencies. However, these texts do cost \$0.12 each and messages should be limited to emergencies only.
- Mitigation Activity Funding of \$45,000.00 was approved for mitigation in specific reserves. This
 project has three parts/treatments that will need to take place and they are dependent on
 weather and certain times of the year.

11.4 Kojonup Volunteer Bushfire Brigade – Chief Bushfire Control Officer – Tony Fisher

- Please to update that the new bushfire tower is working great.
- Some brigades got more radios that what they need, decision made to get them removed and placed in other brigade utes where they will be used. This will safe us money and will be discussed at the April 2025 AGM.
- Quite concerned about other Shire's non-compliance.

- Shire of West Arthur Moody Lake, campers are allowed to light a camping fire in the prohibited period. They have fires right through the summer in campfire pits.
- Upon questioning the Bush fire Chief replied they do have an exemption.
- **Action:** CEO to call Shire of West Arthur CEO and have a discussion regarding the exemption especially on our border.
- **Action:** CEO to call Shire of Boyup Brook CEO and ask their policy and criteria for calling a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban.
- Protective burning should be discussed to prevent fires and the burning of people's assets. Shire of Woodanilling recent fire used as an example.
- Action: The Shire need to look at the Fire Break order if there can be changes to the setup to stop plant/factories from operating in High Fire danger rating weather or during Harvest Vehicle Movement Bans.
- A lot of protective burning could not take place due to the aerial inspections not taking place for this season.
- Need to make sure that the text messages that goes out are correct and that there is no need to resend. This will save the Shire money to afford the aerial inspection.
- Only a few fires this year that escaped from heaps that was not put down/out correctly.
- Myrtle Ben there has been a few incidents from lightning or header fires from nearby properties. If a fire starts in Myrtle Benn it will go straight into town from a Norwest direction, and will affect the town's aged care and hospital precincts.
- Woodanilling fire has highlighted the need to undertake protective or prescribed burning.
- Myrtle Benn has raised the issue of bushfire putting the town at risk. CBFCO stated the Shire
 has done nothing wrong in managing the firebreaks at Myrtle Benn and doesn't understand
 what the issue is.
- President explained that the issue was not whether the firebreaks were right or wrong but that
 it appears the Shire did not follow the correct process under the regulations. Our haste does
 not supercede our regulatory obligations.
- This was a situation where our heightened risk and timeframe prompted us to act.
- A question was asked whether mitigation of all reserves will require us to work through this process?
- The onus is on the owner or manager of the reserves to ensure the process is robust and compliant.

- A query was raised that DFES should take responsibility for the information and advice given to the Shire.
- DFES stated it was not their responsibility to confirm the Shires obligations under the regulations.
- The President interjected and stated this was not a blame game and no individual is to blame. The Shire needs to take the responsibility for its actions and any failure of process that is identified.

11.5 Kojonup Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade – Digby Stretch

 Not a lot of feedback for this meeting, did like that the three institutes could come together to discuss a joint venture for an Emergency Shed (St Johns, Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade and the Bushfire Advisory Committee).

11.6 Kojonup Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service – Matthew Crabb

- A red fire ute was received, and still awaiting the new Fire Truck arrival.
- The emergency call number on the Shire of Kojonup's website not working anymore, will be replaced on the signs in town as well.

12 OTHER ITEMS

- Cr. Mathwin raised the issue of increasing weather stations for the Shire of Kojonup.
 - O Discussion held on whether the Shire needs new stations or we can access the data from stations that are located close to the Shire and we can use that data.

Action: The Shire to follow up with DPIRD and other departments to determine what the optimal use of these stations could be.

- Cr. Mathwin raised a number of items to be discussed. (refer to 9.4.9.3 Notes Meeting Recommendations to BFAC M Mathwin)
 - Burning up to 150ha per permit was discussed.
 - Support amongst BFAC members was limited for increasing the Hectarage.
 - Further feedback was suggested to go back to the brigades for their feedback.
 - Further discussions required.
- CBCFO No permits will be given until the weather changes and dry fuel load risk is reduced.

Action: Shane Harris to follow up on the amount of fuel load in Kojonup with photos from different sectors and 4 locations around the Shire.

All of these ideas are discussion points and things to be implemented to make it easier for new people coming into the role of 'Zulus' and FCOs

- Burning stubbles is generally done for one or more of three management reasons; pest, disease or weed.
- It is important that growers are able to implement this strategy before seeding commences.
- Seeding is commencing as early as late March.
- 1. Currently, a single permit issued during the restricted burning period allows for a maximum of 100 ha to be burned over three days. If someone needs to burn more than 100 ha, then they need to apply for a new three day permit. This requires the brigade FCO to issue another permit which creates an extra workload and more permits in the system.
 - It would simplify the procedure if 3 day permits were changed to allow a maximum of 300 ha per permit with no more than 150ha of stubble or pasture to be burnt per day, with current permit restrictions applying for each area.
 - Motion: That permits allow for an area not exceeding 300 ha per three day permit to be burnt with a maximum of 150 ha to be burnt on any single day.
- 2. Currently, there is no real action taken if a controlled fire escapes from a permitted burn area. Permit holders ought not be punished if a fire escapes, but there should be consequences for negligence.
 - Motion: That if a fire is allowed to escape from a permitted burn area, then a warning will be issued to the permit holder. If the same permit holder allows a second escape, then no further permits will be issued to them for that season.
- 3. A number of fires have started in crops from heaps that were lit late winter or early spring.
 - Recently permits have not allowed heaps to be lit during the restricted burning period which has led to heaps being lit in August and September.
 - To try and mitigate this problem heaps should be allowed to be lit during the restricted burning period.
 - Motion: That timber heaps which are more than 40 metres in from a fire break can be burnt if they are within the same paddock as a permit has been issued to burn stubble or pasture.
- 4. Currently, regardless of how big the controlled burn is, the minimum requirement for a permitted fire is 2 fire units with at least 600 litres capacity and two able bodied persons.
 - Motion: 4(a) Review the minimum fire control requirements for permit fires.

4(b) Change "able bodied" in the permit to "capable".

5. Unless there are exceptional reasons, the prohibited burning period should finish at or near the advertised date.

BOM releases four day fire danger rating forecasts every morning with updates during the day.

Let the fire danger rating do its job.

Motion: That the Autumn restricted burning period be opened as soon as reasonably possible.

- 6. Recommend that a fast fill pump or adequate quick water supply be available nearby for permitted fires.
- 7. There are many data collecting weather stations across the state that measure temperature, wind direction and speed, and humidity. This information is stored and can be accessed online for any individual station.

This data could be analysed with the plan that eventually the information would allow the CBFCO and others to have confidence to use this data to make decisions around burning permits.

Motion: Shire to investigate collecting and collating data from DPIRD (or other) weather stations.

OBJECTIVE

Within Bush Fire Brigades, there are various officers appointed by Council to undertake different roles and responsibilities. The person occupying these positions, although volunteers, are nonetheless officers of the Council and are appointed by the Council (under section 38 of the Bush Fires Act 1954) upon their nomination by the Brigade and endorsement by the Bush Fire Advisory Committee.

This policy provides the eligibility criteria for a person to be appointed as a Bush Fire Control Officer.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is:

- To ensure that a person has the relevant competence and capability necessary to hold the position of Bush Fire Control Officer
- To ensure that the competence and capability is maintained by the appointed Bush Fire Control Officer
- Follow the Shire of Kojonup's core values at all times

POLICY

- To be eligible for appointment as a Bush Fire Control Officer a person must have completed the Fire Control Officer course provided by DFES prior to appointment.
- Nominations of Bush Fire Control Officers are forwarded through the Bush Fire Advisory Committee as a recommendation to Council for appointment.
- A Bush Fire Control Officer, other than the Chief or Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, must not issue a Permit to Burn for land within another Bush Fire Brigade district unless agreed upon by Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

OBJECTIVE

As part of their charter to protect local communities from risk of bush fires, brigades undertake hazard reduction burns on both private and public lands. Such burning is usually done for a fee to recover costs and as a way of raising funds for the Brigade.

This policy specifies the persons who are authorised to approve hazard reduction burns carried out by Bush Fire Brigades on private and public property in accordance with Section 33(6) of the *Bush Fire Act 1954* wherein Council is requested to undertake the works by the landowner, and then effectively sub-contracts the Brigade(s) to carry out work.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is:

- To specify which persons are authorised to approve hazard reduction burns and
- To ensure that the cost of the hazard reduction burn is received prior to the burn taking place.

POLICY

That the following officers are authorised to approve hazard reductions burns to be carried out by Bush Fire Brigades:

- Chief Executive Officer
- Chief Bush Fire Control Officer
- Community Emergency Services Manager

All applications for hazard reduction burns shall be made on an application form determined by the Shire.

SPRAYING VERGES/COMPLIANCE/FIRE SEASON

In regards to notifications to residents regarding spraying of verges or not, is it possible to send a letter (as many residents in Muradup do not have email), mid August and set out clearly that if they choose not to get sprayed by the Shire that they need to mow there verge all during fire season to mitigate fire risk, and not just mow it once.

I suggest the Shire starts spraying early October on verges and all other relevant areas within Muradup.

I suggest fire inspections start earlier than previous years and an earlier follow up to any notifications sent out to ensure compliance by residents in a timely manner. Additionally it may be prudent to organise contractors in advance so that the non compliant properties are able to be dealt with in a timely manner than in previous years.

Any repeat offenders may need a more timely follow up to encourage compliance and may need follow up immediately at the end of the notice period by the Council.

I live at 46/47 Haggerty Street, Muradup and have been following up the Shire constantly for five years without much result. Trying to keep my property fire safe on all four sides has been a challenge.

41-45 Haggerty Street, I have had to organise contractors myself after receiving permission from the Shire for five years. This is why having the contractors organised in advance by the Shire would make this process more timely.

The DOLA block behind my back land, I organised and paid for it to be cleared as it was a disgrace.

The old school yard has been a fire hazard which prompted three locals, myself, Mick Costello and Gary Kinniburgh to clear the site to protect our properties from fire risk. In excess of 100 hours was put into making this fire safe, clearing fallen trees, mowing and disposing of the refuse. This should be a Council responsibility.

I think there are still areas in need of attention at this present moment, including the old railway station area.

I look forward to receiving a response to this letter.

1 Regional Update

- Since entering prohibited season, the region has experienced a few skirmishes of a few days duration.
- Until recently the typical summer troughs, lightning bands have been relatively absent. Just starting to make an appearance in more recent times.
- Given we are in high threat period the regional focus has been on response. As summer tapers off we start to move to training, preparation, review the non-response activities which support overall service delivery.

2 Soil Moisture levels - Update

- Regionally very dry drier than 5yr averages.
- BOM Katanning site is also registering well above 5yr dryness measures.

3. Information to Comcen

- Critical role as gives the Commissioner oversight of what is happening in area he is responsible for.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

AUDIT, & RISK & IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE (ARIC)

Established under Section 7.1 of the *Local Government Act 1995 (Act)* - every local government must have an Audit and Risk & Improvement Committee (ARIC).

Terms of Reference

ARIC is responsible for assisting and independently advising Council in recommending appropriate actions and controls and improvements with regards to audit, risk oversight, governance, finances and systems of internal control.

Its role is to provide oversight related to significant risk exposures and control issues, including fraud risks, governance issues and other matters as necessary or requested by the CEO or Council. This is to ensure the Shire's activities are fully compliant with legislation, regulations, accounting and reporting Standards and that the Shire is executing its responsibility to the community in efficiently utilising their assets.

The <u>ARCARIC</u> is not responsible for the executive management of these functions. The <u>ARCARIC</u> will engage with management in a constructive and professional manner in discharging its advisory responsibilities and formulating its advice to Council.

The ARIC is an independent Committee of Council, advising Council on required improvements to ensure compliance.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Members of the <u>ARCARIC</u> are expected to observe the legal and regulatory obligations of the Local Government.

Committee members must not use or disclose information obtained through the <u>ARCARIC</u> except in meeting the <u>ARCARIC</u>'s responsibilities, or unless expressly agreed by the President of the Shire.

Committee Members must adhere to the Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates and demonstrate behaviour which reflects the Shire's desired culture.

ARCARIC Members are expected to:

- 1. act in the best interests of the Shire as a whole;
- 2. apply good analytical skills, objectivity and good judgement;
- express opinions constructively and openly, raise issues that relate to the <u>ARCARIC</u>'s
 responsibilities and pursue lines of enquiry in relation to the "Risk Controls" the Shire has in
 place;
- 4. contribute the time required to meet their responsibilities; and
- 5. exercise due care, diligence and skill when performing their duties.

Member Duties/Responsibilities:

- Oversee the Shire's risk management, through:
 - a) Biennial review of the Shire's Risk Management Policy;
 - b) Recommending and reviewing the Shire's Risk Appetite Statement in order to recommend the organisation's Risk Tolerance to the Council;

- c) Reviewing reports on the movement of the Shire's current strategic risks, and the emergence of new strategic risks;
- d) Overseeing strategic risks which sit outside of the Shire's Risk Appetite; and
- e) Monitor and receive reports concerning the development, implementation and on-going management of the Shire's Risk Management Plan and the effectiveness of its Risk Management Framework;
- Overseeing the Shire's processes for managing fraud and corruption, by:
 - a) Performing oversight responsibilities and advising Council;
 - b) Enquiring with the CEO and the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) about whether they are aware of any actual, suspected, or alleged fraud or corruption affecting the Shire; and
 - c) Reviewing summary reports from the CEO on communication from external parties including regulators that indicate problems in the internal control system or inappropriate management actions.
- Overseeing the Shire's financial management and legislative compliance, by:
 - a) Reviewing the Shire's annual Compliance Audit Return and reporting the results of that review to Council, in accordance with the Local Government (Audit) Regulations 1996;
 - b) Receiving and reviewing reports from the CEO regarding the appropriateness and effectiveness of the Shire's legislative compliance and ensuring any non-compliances are rectified on a timely basis;
 - c) Considering and recommending adoption of the annual financial report to Council;
 - d) Receive and review the biannual reports from the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) regarding the appropriateness and effectiveness of the Shire's risk management, internal controls and legislative compliance and make recommendations to Council; and
 - e) Consider and recommend adoption of the Annual Financial Report to the Council;
- Overseeing the internal audit function, by;
 - a) Assessing and making a recommendation to Council on an Internal Audit Plan to ensure that it comprehensively covers material business risks that may threaten the achievement of strategic objectives and which identifies key risks and control mechanisms;
 - b) Reviewing the quality and timeliness of internal audit reports;
 - c) Monitoring the implementation of internal audit recommendations; and
 - d) Considering the implications of internal audit findings on the organisation, its risks, and controls.
- Fulfilling responsibilities pertaining to external audit, by:
 - a) Reviewing reports from the OAG, including auditor's reports, closing reports and management letters:
 - b) Reviewing management's response to OAG findings and recommendations;
 - c) Monitoring the implementation of recommendations from external audits;
 - d) Reviewing results of relevant OAG audit reports and better practice publications for guidance on good practices, including any assessment by the CEO; and
 - e) Examine the reports of the auditor after receiving a report from the CEO on the matters and:
 - a. determine if any matters raised require action to be taken by the Shire; and
 - b. ensure that appropriate action is taken in respect of those matters.

Seek information or obtain expert advice through the CEO on matters of concern within the scope of the Committee's terms of reference following authorisation from the Council.

- Fulfilling responsibilities pertaining to reviewing and advising on service area and process changes (Continuous Improvement) to ensure compliance, by:
 - f) Reviewing reports and reviews by the CEO on key service processes within the Shire;

- g) Reviewing management's response to OAG findings and recommendations;
- h) Monitoring the implementation of recommendations;
- i) Reviewing results of relevant OAG audit reports and better practice publications on good practice, including any assessments by Management.

Membership

One (1) Independent Chair Role (Presiding Member of Committee);

One (1) Independent Deputy Presiding Member Role;

Four (4) Councillors; and

Two (21) Community Members.

The independent roles will be advertised and selected by Council.

Supporting Team Members

Manager Financial & Corporate Services Governance & Rates Officer Chief Executive Officer or delegated nominee

Meetings

Quarterly for ordinary meetings and as required related to audit functions.

Open to Public: No

Voting: Voting is in accordance with Section 5.21 of the *Act*.

Confidentiality: All Committee members will be required to adhere to the Shire's confidentiality requirements as per the Code of Conduct for Council Members, Committee Members and Candidates.

Conduct of Meetings: ARCARIC Meetings will be held in accordance with the *Act*, subsidiary legislation, and the Shire's Standing Orders.

Committee Sitting Fees and Reimbursements

The Local Government Amendment Act 2023, assented to on 18 May 2023, changes the Local Government Act 1995 to provide for independent committee members to receive meeting fees. An independent committee member is a committee member who is not an elected member or an employee of the local government.

The Salaries and Allowances Tribunal (SAT) has issued a Determination to allow for the payment of meeting fees to independent committee members. Local governments will have the ability to set appropriate fees, within a specified range as determined by the SAT.

The Council will determine the amount of fees payable for independent members when it considers the budget fees and charges on an annual basis.

At this point in time the meetings fees are \$0 (Zero). The Shire is prohibited under Section 5.98-5.99 of the Act, and Regulation 30 of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996, to pay a council member a fee for attending the ARC.

Currently, the Shire is prohibited from remunerating independent committee members; however, remunerating independent members may be paid to each independent external members in accordance with Section 5.100 of the Act.

The rules regarding remuneration for independent committee members are currently under review as part of the Local Government Reforms (2023). These guidelines are subject to any legislation changes.







Local Government Amendment Bill 2024

Introduction

The Local Government Amendment Bill 2024 (the Bill) proposes to change the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) to provide for various reforms, including the establishment of a new Local Government Inspector (the Inspector) and monitors that can provide for early intervention and assist local governments in resolving dysfunction.

In addition to the <u>Inspector and monitor reforms</u>, a range of other second tranche reforms are being introduced that focus on good governance and decision-making at council and committee meetings:

- Revising the roles and responsibilities for the council, council members and local government chief executive officers (CEOs) to clarify the separation of powers and duties within local governments.
- Improving rules for closing part of a council or committee meeting to the public, to ensure greater transparency and that these meetings are held openly wherever possible.
- Changing audit committees to have an improved focus as "audit, risk and improvement committees" that are independently chaired, with greater clarity on how council committees should operate.

Roles and responsibilities

The role of councils is to lead and represent their communities. Councils do so by engaging with their community, making decisions and setting the strategic direction of a local government. The administrative arm of the local government is responsible for implementing decisions and plans made by council.

The roles of the council, mayors or presidents, council members and the CEO have been further clarified in the second tranche of reforms. These changes ensure there is a clear distinction between the functions and responsibilities of a council and a CEO.

All council members are expected to:

- Represent the interests of electors, ratepayers and residents of the district as well as consider the interests of other persons who work in or visit the district.
- Participate in the decision-making process of the local government at council and committee.
- Facilitate communication with the community about the local government's decisions.
- Facilitate and maintain good working relationships with other council members and the CEO.
- Observe the separation of roles of the council and CEO.
- Make decisions on merit, evidence and law, conscious of the capacity of the local government and with consideration of the local government's finances and resources.
- Promote an organisational culture that respects employees.
- Maintain and develop the requisite skills to effectively perform their role.

As the leader of the local government council, mayors or presidents perform the following roles in addition to their council member role:

- Provide leadership and guidance to the council and its members, including guidance about their roles.
- Act as the principal spokesperson of the local government, including at ceremonial and civic functions, in a manner consistent with the resolutions of the council.
- Preside at meetings of the council, maintaining order at those meetings and ensuring that those meetings are conducted in a manner consistent with the Act.
- Promote and facilitate positive and constructive working relationships among council members.
- Liaise with the CEO regarding the local government's affairs and performance of its functions.

The CEO is responsible for the administration and operation of the local government, including:

- Causing council decisions to be implemented.
- Managing the provision of the services and facilities that the council has determined the local government will provide.
- Determining procedures and systems to implement the local government's policies and managing the local government's administration and operations.
- The employment, management, supervision and direction of other employees.
- Ensuring that records and documents of the local government are properly kept.
- Advising and procuring advice for the council in relation to the local government's affairs and performance of its functions.
- Ensuring that the council has the information and advice it needs to make informed and timely decisions.
- Keeping the minutes of council meetings.

The CEO liaises with the mayor or president on the local government's affairs and performance of its functions and may speak on behalf of the local government, with the mayor or president's agreement.

Role clarity is vital when different roles work to achieve the same objectives. When people understand their roles, better decisions can be made and implemented more effectively, resulting in improved use of ratepayer funds.

As a minor reform, local governments will now be required to advise the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) when vacancies on the council arise.

Roles of the council and local government staff



Meetings behind closed doors

By default, under the reforms, council and committee meetings must be open to the public. In certain circumstances, part of a meeting may be closed to deal with specific information where there is a clear public interest for that information to remain confidential.

The reforms provide a much stronger definition of the limited reasons to close a meeting.

Matters where a meeting must be closed include:

- a committee of the Parliament advising the local government to be confidential
- the recruitment or employment of the CEO or a senior employee, including termination or review of the CEO's performance.

Examples of the types of information to be considered that may provide a basis for closing part of a meeting include:

- Legal advice or other matters which legal professional privilege extend to.
- Information relating to the personal affairs of an individual.
- Information contained in a tender received by the local government where that information is the tendered price or the tendered methodology for calculating that price.
- Information contained in a tender where the information discloses any technology, technology, or any manufacturing, industrial or trade process, that the tenderer proposes to use in performing the contract and which is not public (and if made public would have an adverse effect on the tenderer's business interests).
- Information which would endanger the security of the local government property or operations, including cybersecurity matters.
- Information which could impair the effectiveness of an investigation or that deals with a contravention or possible contravention of the law.

The reforms clarify that:

- A decision to close part of a meeting must be made in an open part of a meeting.
- The local government is to record the reason for closing part of a meeting, including the type of information that is to be considered.
- The minutes must include a description of how the local government has sought to maximise the degree of information available to the public about the matter being considered.

The Bill also contains a new section to define irrelevant reasons for closing part of a meeting. These include:

- the information to be considered would cause embarrassment to the local government, council, or any individual
- the matter is controversial
- making the information public would result in criticism.

The new Inspector will be able to review a decision to close part of a meeting to the public.

From 1 January 2025, all local governments will be required to audio record parts of a meeting that are closed to the public. Additionally, as proposed in the Bill's reforms, the Inspector will be able to order that the local government release the audio recording to the public if the Inspector determines that the meeting was not closed in accordance with the Act or regulations.

Audit, risk and improvement committees

Audit committees will be revised as audit, risk and improvement committees (ARICs). ARICs must have an independent presiding member to ensure a level of neutrality and impartial oversight in chairing these meetings. An independent presiding member must be a person who is not a council

member of a local government or an employee of the local government. If a deputy presiding member is appointed, they must also be independent.

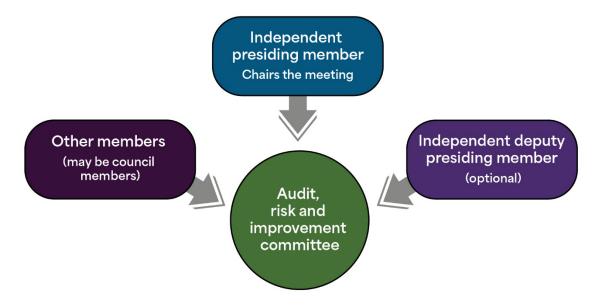
The introduction of an independent presiding member provides an opportunity for increased community confidence in a local government's financial and risk management. Local government operations may also benefit through appointing an independent chair with risk and financial management expertise that may otherwise be unavailable.

This reform reflects modern governance practices in State Government authorities and agencies as well as private corporations.

In relation to the current Act, an audit committee is required to be established comprising 3 or more persons appointed by absolute majority by a local government. Most of the members must be council members. The CEO or a local government employee cannot be a member.

Audit, risk and improvement committee model

The new audit, risk and improvement committee will comprise the following roles, with a total of 3 or more members.



Under the proposed amendments in the Bill, an ARIC now requires an independent presiding member. A local government can choose to appoint an independent deputy presiding member to chair the meeting if the independent presiding member is unable to do so.

If a local government chooses not to nominate a deputy presiding member, the council will need to appoint an independent proxy to chair the meeting should the need arise.

Smaller local governments may also now choose to share an ARIC to reduce the burden on their resources.

Council committees

The Bill includes changes to allow for greater transparency and clarity on how council committees operate.

Council can now establish committees that have either an advisory or decision-making function and are generally open to the public.

The appointment process for the presiding member and deputy presiding member has also been simplified. Councils will appoint these roles, instead of the committee electing those roles by secret ballot.

Local governments are still able to establish informal working groups, which are not committees, to engage with their community or develop ongoing networks.

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SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES ACT 1975

DETERMINATION VARIATION

PREAMBLE

The Local Government Amendment Act 2023, assented to on 18 May 2023, changes the Local Government Act 1995 to provide for independent committee members to receive meeting fees. An independent committee member is a committee member who is not an elected member or an employee of the local government. The Salaries and Allowances Tribunal has issued a Determination to allow for the payment of meeting fees to independent committee members. Local governments will have the ability to set appropriate fees, within a specified range.

DETERMINATION

The Local Government Chief Executive Officers and Elected Members Determination No. 1 of 2023, issued on 6 April 2023, under sections 7A and 7B(2) of the Salaries and Allowances Act 1975, as amended from time to time, are hereby varied by a Determination set out below.

- Under Part 1.4 Terms used, insert the following:
 Independent committee member means a person who is a committee member but who is neither a council member nor an employee.
- Under Part 6.1.2, insert the following:
 - "3. Pursuant to section 5.100(2)(b) and (3)(b) of the LG Act, a committee member who is not an elected member or employee of the local government, who attends a committee meeting or (at the request of the local government or regional local government) a meeting of a type prescribed in regulation 30(3A) of the LG Regulations is entitled to be paid the fee set by the local government or regional local government within the range determined in section 6.3 of this Part for attending committee meetings or, as the case requires, meetings of that type.
- Delete Part 6.3 and insert the following:
 - 6.3 Committee Meeting and Prescribed Meeting Attendance Fees Per Meeting
 - (1) The ranges of fees in Table 6 apply where a local government or regional local government decides to pay a council member or independent member a fee referred to in –
 - section 5.98(1)(b) of the LG Act for attendance at a committee meeting; or
 - section 5.98(2A)(b) of the LG Act for attendance at a meeting of a type prescribed in regulation 30(3A) of the LG Regulations.
 - o section 5.100(2)(a) of the LG Act for attendance at a committee meeting

 section 5.100(2)(b) of the LG Act for attendance at a meeting of a type prescribed in regulation 30(3A) of the LG Regulations.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR ADVISORY COMMITTEES OF COUNCIL

KOJONUP KENEANG NOONGAR ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Established under Section 5.8 of the *Local Government Act 1995* to advise Council on matters and projects related to the Keneang Noongar Community in the Shire of Kojonup.

The Committee is not responsible for the executive management of these functions. The Committee will engage with management in a constructive and professional manner in discharging its advisory responsibilities and formulating its advice to Council.

Roles of the Committee Members:

- To volunteer and encourage other community volunteers to support the Council in its strategic purpose
- Advise the Council on all matters related to Keneang Noongar Community

Membership

- six (6) Community Representatives as selected and endorsed by Council
- Three (3) Councillors

Supporting Team Members:

- Chief Executive Officer or delegated nominee
- Governance and Rates Officer
- Community Development Officers as directed by the CEO

Meetings

The Kojonup Keneang Noongar Advisory Committee shall meet as deemed appropriate by the Chairperson, and at least four times per year.

The Shire of Kojonup is committed to working with the Keneang Noongar people of Kojonup to promote a greater understanding throughout the community of Aboriginal and Non Aboriginal people's history and culture.

The Shire of Kojonup recognise the cultural and spiritual links that Noongar people have to the land.

The Shire of Kojonup acknowledges local Aboriginal people live according to their traditional values, subject to the law, and will respect Noongar places of cultural significance.

In developing the Terms of reference the following broad subject areas were identified to give direction to this committee on what it may advise Council on:

- Keneang Noongar Cultural aspects of the Shire of Kojonup
- Keneang Noongar Community issues
- Cross cultural awareness;
- Consultative mechanisms and liaison;
- Social and economic planning;

- Environment;
- Local history and site conservation;
- Employment, Education and Training;
- Young Keneang Noongar people.

Terms of Reference

The Committee is to recommend and advise Council on appropriate partnership arrangements to more effectively align Aboriginal Culture and Community values.

The Committee's role is to guide the Council on the areas where research will enhance the economic, environmental, cultural and social outcomes within the Shire.

Aims and Objectives

To work collaboratively with the community under the following five (5) main areas:

Cross Cultural Awareness & Understanding

- <u>To improve awareness and understanding of Keneang Noongar Aboriginal culture and customs amongst Elected Members and the Shire of Kojonup</u> Team Members.
- <u>To improve the status and recognition of Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people</u> within the community.
- <u>To raise awareness of Keneang Noongar Aboriginal cultural issues within the broader community.</u>
- <u>To consider and advise Council on a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) within the Shire of Kojonup</u>

Consultation

- To provide an ongoing avenue of liaison and consultation between Council and the Keneang Noongar Aboriginal Community.
- <u>To ensure that Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people are consulted on all relevant issues.</u>

Social & Economic Planning

- To provide Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people with an opportunity to be actively involved in social and economic planning processes of the Shire of Kojonup.
- <u>To increase the involvement of Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people in civic and community affairs.</u>

Environment

- To recognise the traditional and cultural links that Aboriginal people have with the environment and to ensure those links continue.
- <u>To ensure that Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people are given an ongoing involvement in the management of the environment.</u>

• <u>To raise awareness of the significance of indigenous flora and fauna to traditional Keneang Noongar Aboriginal culture.</u>

Local History & Site Conservation

- <u>To increase awareness and understanding of local Keneang Noongar</u> Aboriginal history.
- <u>To ensure that sites that are culturally significant to Keneang Noongar</u> Aboriginal people are treated with dignity and respect.

Employment Education & Training

- <u>Discuss and advise on improving employment opportunities for Keneang</u> Noongar Aboriginal people.
- <u>Discuss and advise on improvements to the retention of young Aboriginal people in primary, secondary and tertiary education.</u>

Young People

- <u>To advise on methods to increase the involvement of young Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people in recreational activity.</u>
- <u>To advise on methods to enhance the employment prospects of young Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people.</u>
- <u>To advise on methods to help reduce the incidence of crime and anti-social</u> behaviour involving young Keneang Noongar Aboriginal people.

Advise on the Management of the Spring and other culturally sensitive sites.

Provide leadership within the Keneang Noongar Aboriginal and broader community;
