## **BUSHFIRE ADVISORY COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE**

Established under Section 67 of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

### **Terms of Reference**

The Bush Fire Advisory Committee is established for the purpose of:

- a) Advising the Shire regarding all matters relating to the preventing, controlling and extinguishing of bush fires;
- b) The planning of the layout of firebreaks in the district;
- c) Prosecutions for breaches of this Act;
- d) The formation of bush fire brigades and the grouping thereof under group brigade officers (in accordance with any local laws);
- e) Recommendations on Fire Control Officer positions;
- f) Feedback on the Council's Fire Break Notice;
- g) Specific requirements from each brigade with regard to:
  - Protective Personal Equipment;
  - Equipment and vehicles resources required; and
  - Training Requirements;
- h) The ensuring of cooperation and coordination of Bush Fire Brigades in their efforts and activities; and
- i) Any other matter relating to bush fire control whether of the same kind as, or a different kind from, those specified in this subsection.

## Other:

- a) The Bush Fire Advisory Committee shall include an elected member of the Council;
- b) The committee shall elect one of their members to be chairman;
- c) The quorum required for the transaction of business at meetings of the committee is set at 50%

These reported fires provide a vital argument when the Shire requires extra funding or there is a need for extra resources to be allocated to this area. All fires need to be reported to DFES Communications Centre. This allows a record of incidents which can be utilised for resource allocation.

## 11 GENERAL ITEMS

## 11.1 CESM - Shane Harris

- Note less fires in this 2024/2025 season than compared to previous season.
- Introduces Group Call from DFES and recommends that Shire of Kojonup Brigades start to use this Group Call. This will be at no cost to the Shire.

## **COMMITTEE DECISION**

The Committee recommends to Council to adopt the DFES Group Call as presented at this meeting.

Moved: Nick Trethowan, Second: Ross Fryer Smith Carried 10/0

- Harvest Vehicle Movement Bans Chief Bush Fire officer does not have the power to shut down working plant / factories if they are working between four walls. Request from Chief Bush Fire Officer to implement stronger rules from the Shire of Kojonup side to stop these plant/factories from operating on Harvest Vehicle Movement Ban Days.
- A closer look will take place on the next Fire Break Notice to adjust the language on Harvest Vehicle movement Bans, and a check list as per Derek Jones suggestion will be created.
- Local Government Grant Scheme are open for the 2025/2026 season. If brigades wants to send their requests especially under \$1500.00. In the current 2024/2025 year the Shire was abled to put in new Cell Fi's in the two trucks (Muradup and Kojonup) as well as thermal imaging cameras.

- Policies discussions for the Shire of Kojonup Policy manual Hazard Reduction Burning by Brigades and Bush Fire Mitigation. Policies will be discussed at May 2025 meeting.
- Introduction of PAFTAC forms to use at a Bush Fire incident. The incident control officer should complete the form and then can use the data when they call Comms Centre. This will assist DFES to make decisions on how/where to send their resources. Negative feedback given regarding another checklist document, and that the incident control officers will not have the time / capability to complete the PAFTAC form.
- Alerts and Warnings are important to alert the public.

## 11.2 DFES - Derek Jones

- Notes attached (refer to 9.4.9.8 Kojonup BFAC DFES Notes February 2025)
- CEO requested a checklist to understand how the "high risk" areas are being established. Shire of Kojonup has more than 500 assets and is considered as "high risk".

## 11.3 Shire of Kojonup – Executive Officer - Grant Thompson

- Refer to letter received from community member at Muradup regarding their concerns about Bush fire mitigation control. The Shire is currently busy investigating and planning the next spraying season for Muradup to minimize the risk. The need for a community meeting to discuss the risks and to educate and give options should take place. (refer to 9.4.9.7 Letter Paul Grant)
- Local Emergency Management Committee request a desk top exercise to take place in the first week of May, to assist all participants to understand their roles in an emergency.
- Message media over two hundred new mobile numbers were added this season to message media from contractors, truck drivers and new community members. This is an important way of informing our community of any threats and emergencies. However, these texts do cost \$0.12 each and messages should be limited to emergencies only.
- Mitigation Activity Funding of \$45,000.00 was approved for mitigation in specific reserves. This project has three parts/treatments that will need to take place and they are dependent on weather and certain times of the year.

## 11.4 Kojonup Volunteer Bushfire Brigade – Chief Bushfire Control Officer – Tony Fisher

- Please to update that the new bushfire tower is working great.
- Some brigades got more radios that what they need, decision made to get them removed and placed in other brigade utes where they will be used. This will safe us money and will be discussed at the April 2025 AGM.
- Quite concerned about other Shire's non-compliance.

- Shire of West Arthur Moody Lake, campers are allowed to light a camping fire in the prohibited period. They have fires right through the summer in campfire pits.
- Upon questioning the Bush fire Chief replied they do have an exemption.
- **Action:** CEO to call Shire of West Arthur CEO and have a discussion regarding the exemption especially on our border.
- Action: CEO to call Shire of Boyup Brook CEO and ask their policy and criteria for calling a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban.
- Protective burning should be discussed to prevent fires and the burning of people's assets. Shire of Woodanilling recent fire used as an example.
- Action: The Shire need to look at the Fire Break order if there can be changes to the setup to stop plant/factories from operating in High Fire danger rating weather or during Harvest Vehicle Movement Bans.
- A lot of protective burning could not take place due to the aerial inspections not taking place for this season.
- Need to make sure that the text messages that goes out are correct and that there is no need to resend. This will save the Shire money to afford the aerial inspection.
- Only a few fires this year that escaped from heaps that was not put down/out correctly.
- Myrtle Ben there has been a few incidents from lightning or header fires from nearby properties. If a fire starts in Myrtle Benn it will go straight into town from a Norwest direction, and will affect the town's aged care and hospital precincts.
- Woodanilling fire has highlighted the need to undertake protective or prescribed burning.
- Myrtle Benn has raised the issue of bushfire putting the town at risk. CBFCO stated the Shire has done nothing wrong in managing the firebreaks at Myrtle Benn and doesn't understand what the issue is.
- President explained that the issue was not whether the firebreaks were right or wrong but that it appears the Shire did not follow the correct process under the regulations. Our haste does not supercede our regulatory obligations.
- This was a situation where our heightened risk and timeframe prompted us to act.
- A question was asked whether mitigation of all reserves will require us to work through this process?
- The onus is on the owner or manager of the reserves to ensure the process is robust and compliant.

- A query was raised that DFES should take responsibility for the information and advice given to the Shire.
- DFES stated it was not their responsibility to confirm the Shires obligations under the regulations.
- The President interjected and stated this was not a blame game and no individual is to blame. The Shire needs to take the responsibility for its actions and any failure of process that is identified.

## 11.5 Kojonup Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade - Digby Stretch

- Not a lot of feedback for this meeting, did like that the three institutes could come together to discuss a joint venture for an Emergency Shed (St Johns, Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade and the Bushfire Advisory Committee).

## 11.6 Kojonup Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service - Matthew Crabb

- A red fire ute was received, and still awaiting the new Fire Truck arrival.
- The emergency call number on the Shire of Kojonup's website not working anymore, will be replaced on the signs in town as well.

## 12 OTHER ITEMS

- Cr. Mathwin raised the issue of increasing weather stations for the Shire of Kojonup.
  - O Discussion held on whether the Shire needs new stations or we can access the data from stations that are located close to the Shire and we can use that data.

**Action**: The Shire to follow up with DPIRD and other departments to determine what the optimal use of these stations could be.

- Cr. Mathwin raised a number of items to be discussed. (refer to 9.4.9.3 Notes Meeting Recommendations to BFAC – M Mathwin)
  - O Burning up to 150ha per permit was discussed.
  - O Support amongst BFAC members was limited for increasing the Hectarage.
  - o Further feedback was suggested to go back to the brigades for their feedback.
  - Further discussions required.
- CBCFO No permits will be given until the weather changes and dry fuel load risk is reduced.

**Action:** Shane Harris to follow up on the amount of fuel load in Kojonup with photos from different sectors and 4 locations around the Shire.
