Tracey provided Council with the background of her career and aims and objectives as CEO for Southern Dirt especially in regards to making a difference by creating sustainable agricultural opportunities via, for example, a Farm to Table Strategy that brands/markets us to others. How to maximize technology, how we use it, why we need to use it, what are benefits, etc.? Looking at land degradation, climate change, salinity, value adding, water security, Agri tourism, building partnerships, research & development opportunities, exploring			

		opportunities for scientists/engineers to be more involved in farming following the resources boom in WA.  Tracey was receptive to Natural Resource Management combining with Southern Dirt although their office was too small and ideally they would like an alternative location in the medium term. Farmers tend to focus on short term but the problem(s) has to be viewed from a larger perspective to attract funds and achieve a return on investment.  Southern Dirt appreciates Council's sponsorship as it means they can focus efforts on farmers staying in the region. There are also synergies with the Kojonup School Farm and with universities. Tracey conducted a business icon program for 8 years with universities which provided benefits both ways.
