I have sought answers to my queries of the proponent of the development $\,$.In excess of ,a month has now elapsed and no answers have been received $\,$.I anticipate that further queries will arise if and when I receive answers to my legitimate questions and which were invited by the proponent in their media statements $\,$.

Can you please advise of the status of the application and what consultants reports you have received as well as the likely timeframe for the Council to make a decision and whether any opponents will be given the opportunity to make detailed submissions especially in light of the Senate Enquiries findings ,recent medical information that has come to light in relation to low frequency infrasound ,recent legal cases on Town Planning Schemes on loss of amenity and zoning issues ,
