10.1 COMMUNICATIONS TOWER

Since the Technical Work Group meeting on 8 March 2017, discussions have been undertaken with Telecommunications consultant – John Dent and the Shire's Manager Corporate Services regarding the need for an audit of existing Telecommunication Towers – Telstra, WA POL. Council to ascertain the extent of coverage, gaps and shadows in Kojonup and surrounding shires. Advice has also been received (Refer below) from Department of Commerce of the new Lumeah Telstra tower which WA POL are co locating equipment onto.

"Hi Rick

Thanks for your call this morning. Telstra will be seeking DA approval from the Shire shortly for a 60 metre mast at Lumeah to expand mobile coverage under the Mobile Black Spot Program Round 1. They expect the tower will on air in the second half of June 2017. The location has shifted slightly from the coordinates we discussed in late 2015 due to tenure constraints.

The new coordinates are: -33.960015, 117.26515

Under the contract with Telstra, the Shire has the option to install two VHF dipole (smd1) antennas and one UHF dipole antenna (yb10) on the Lumeah tower, rent free until 1 February 2031. WA Police acts as the central coordinator for all emergency services organisations. It is also co-locating equipment on the Lumeah tower and will coordinate placement and timing with Telstra on the Shire's behalf too.

Hi Darryl and Tim

This is to introduce you to one another.

Tim – Darryl is the Shire's technical consultant, on mobile 0429 389 259. Darryl – Tim is the main contact point at WA Police, on 9370 7324 or 0419 947 462.

I'll leave it to you both to touch base on the Shire's requirements. WAPOL also has a 55-metre guyed mast at -33.857794, 117.164956 that may be of interest to the Shire.

I hope these arrangements are of benefit to the community. Please let me know I can help with anything else.

Council will consider a Memorandum of Understanding with Stacy and Melissa Williams for the existing Tower at next week's Council Meeting.

Whilst the Bushfire Advisory Committee appreciates the opportunity from Telstra to utilise their new tower, this does not comply with the previous Council decision that the bushfire tower will be placed on land managed solely by the Shire of Kojonup and would only be considered if investigations clearly demonstrated a 'gap' in coverage that would not otherwise be achieved without the Telstra Tower.

10.2 RESERVES MANAGEMENT – FIRE STRATEGY FOR AUTUMN

Opportunity to discuss any planned burning to manage reserves during autumn if weather conditions allow.

All brigades are to formulate a list of areas of concern and have this list provided to Mr Cowie recognising that when weather conditions prevail we would need to act and mobilise promptly after a 24 hour notice period.

SUMMARY

To achieve a clear direction of how to make an abandoned house/homestead that does not comply with the fire break order comply without starting a fire in fire season, who would be responsible if we sent contractors in and a fire did start.

BACKGROUND

Kinghurst is an abandoned homestead and is a major fire risk, it is situated in the midst of a tree plantation. The property owner was instructed that the advisory committee agreed that all abandoned houses must comply.

I advised that he comes to the next advisory meeting to put his views forward in regard to exemptions.

COMMENT

I have concerns about forcing a non-compliant property owner to slash in the middle of fire season as the chance of a spark is high in dry grass. The perimeter is overgrown and not clean and often littered with bits of machinery and junk.

RECOMMENDATION.

That the Bushfire Advisory Committee recommends that the Shire of Kojonup allow the Senior Ranger in consultation with the Chief Bushfire Control Officer to enforce the installation of a firebreak for properties where there is an unacceptable risk. An infringement shall be raised against the owner and firebreaks shall be installed at the first suitable time by the owner or the Shire shall organise for the work to be carried out at the cost of the owner.

The meeting decided that the Ranger already has the powers available to him under the Bushfires Act 1954 so the Officer's Recommendation was not required to be voted on.

- a. Clarification of the wording in respect to the following points:
 Urban/residential firebreak requirements contained within the Firebreak Order over 4000M2. What about property adjacent to sheds, etc.?
- b. Advice required from the Committee regarding the requirements when driving the DFES supplied Fire Trucks as tabled at the AGM are sufficient and whether training of future drivers would be required.
- c. Responsibility for repairs of non-WAERN radios should remain with individual not the Shire!
- d. Advice to the Brigade Captains regarding the use and auditing of the Fuel Cards
- e. How the radio skeds are to be handled. Is this not responsibility of CBFCO and Zulu's?

- 12/17 Moved Roger House, seconded Geoff Gale that the unconfirmed minutes of the Kojonup Volunteer Bushfire Brigade Annual General Meeting held 3 April 2017 be received and that:
 - 1. The Kojonup Volunteer Bushfire Brigade be advised that the Committee is recommending the following to Council:
 - a) That the diagrams from the Firebreak order be removed and that the wording will remain;
 - b) The existing road laws remain applicable to any fire truck driver operating for the Shire of Kojonup or within the Shire boundary as 20 kilometres per hour over the speed limit is not justifiable even in an emergency; and
 - c) That the Shire be requested to write to all brigades advising that individuals are responsible for repairs to non-WAERN radios.
 - 2. All other points are an operational matter and are to be handled as such by the Zulus.

REASON FOR CHANGE: The Bushfire Advisory Committee wished clarify the steps to be taken with Council post receiving the Volunteer Bushfire Brigade minutes for the following reasons:

- 1a) Removing the diagrams from the Firebreak order will remove any ambiguity surrounding the issue of firebreaks.
- 1b) A fire truck travelling to a grass, bush or crop fire is predominantly trying to protect assets and not necessarily human life. Fire trucks are generally bulky, not easy to manoeuvre (carry over 1000 litres of water) and not built for speed. The risk of an accident occurring due to excess speed for a vehicle of that size is significant and drivers should not be putting their own lives at risk by breaking the speed limit even in the event of an emergency.
- 1c) Notification needs to be provided to brigades advising them of each member's individual responsibility for repairing non-WAERN radios which are no longer the main method of approved communication.
- 2) Responsibility falls to the Zulus to handle operational matters and they should be able to do so unimpeded.
