MCS has been asked to ensure Mr. Dent briefs council on his investigations ASAP as up to 5 new Telecommunication towers are being erected in the shire and Council and Rural Fire requirements need to form part of the process so as not to duplicate unnecessary infrastructure in order to achieve total coverage for our area and immediate neighbours. Shire President: The Biggest Morning Tea at Springhaven was well supported and superbly catered. Congratulations to all involved! Memorial Hall – invitation should be extended to Nikki Stretch on behalf of the Theatrical Society to review internal ball
	 on behalf of the Theatrical Society to review internal hall improvements which form the basis of a \$300k application to Lottery West. Outlined forum discussions with Minister Alana McTiernan held in Albany last Friday. New State Government was focused on meeting election commitments given Albany was a marginal seat which effectively meant the upper Great Southern missed out as it was held by the National party and does not have a population base that would influence election outcomes. A review of Royalty for Regions submissions and approval announcements made by the Liberal Government prior to the March 2017 election is being undertaken and there is no guarantee that the Great Southern Housing Initiative will proceed despite 9 local governments submitting a business plan that recognizes the need and economic stimulus, employment approximation.
	employment opportunities such a project would provide. Funding elements of the Kodja Place, Sports Precinct and Main Street Master Plans will need to look at other external grant opportunities in particular the Commonwealth's Building Better Regions Fund however leveraging will be minimal if there is no state funding. CEO advised that eastern colleagues refer to WA as "wait awhile" but now even community members are



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


