COUNCIL MEETING – 20 FEBRUARY 2018 OUTCOMES:

Natural Resource Management/LandCare

Council agreed to add an additional goal: 'To improve biosecurity by managing flora and fauna pests' to the Natural Resource Management Committee's Terms of Reference."

Neighbouring Shires face a similar issue of addressing flora and fauna pests with finite resources and try to work collaboratively with land owners, Landcare, State Government agencies and volunteers. Ultimately some shires risk matrix may necessitate higher priorities in other core areas such as road maintenance and re-sheeting at the expense of improved biosecurity leaving land owners to manage their own properties and boundaries. The challenge is striking a balance!

Upgrade of Kojonup Airstrip Lighting

Council endorsed the Chief Executive Officers signing of the Funding Deed between the Minister for Transport under the Regional Airports Development Scheme (RADS) 2017-19 to upgrade the runway lights to L.E.D. at Kojonup Airport. The Shire will contribute \$48,500 ex GST while the RADS Grant will contribute \$47,870 towards the supply and installation of new L.E.D. AGL light fittings with new bases.

THE KODJA PLACE UPDATE

Council's aim is to achieve the following key objectives for Kodja Place;

- Be sustainable financially, socially and culturally
- 2. Be a place of community pride and engagement
- 3. To nurture our future storytellers and makers

Unfortunately, nothing is as clear cut as it we would like it to be. Council has a legal responsibility to focus on preventing further degeneration of the building structure and to address identified risks which the Shire is legally bound to address.

Council have agreed that this is their priority for The Kodja Place Precinct for the balance of the 2017/2018 and the 2018/19 financial year.

While Council's budget for Kodja Place is still significant it needs to be noted that the budgeted amount includes \$195,000 in depreciation which is not an actual cash cost. It also includes salaries which are not exclusive to the Kodja Place but, of which, a percentage goes to overall community development, promotion and events.

The budget also includes a number of costs relating to Visitor Information provision and grounds maintenance, including the Rose maze, which would be a cost to the Shire regardless of whether Kodja Place existed.

The past two financial years we have also faced a number of unexpected expenses in relation to the Kodja Place Cafe which, following urgent upgrades, is now operating very well under new management.

Your Council is being proactive in assuring future cost reduction by securing funding to install a pipeline from the disused south town dam to the tank near Kodja Place, in order to water the Rose Maze and lawns including Apex Park.

We continue to seek efficiencies and are pleased that with growing visitation, especially tour bus groups, we are increasing our revenue. Kodja Place has a very wide appreciation and recognition both Nationally and Internationally and has increasingly become a 'must stop' for tour organisers.

I encourage all locals to come down and view the many wonderful comments recorded in our visitor books.

While Tourism will never be Kojonup's core business, it definitely value adds to existing businesses. This value can be measured in both social and financial return. Kodja Place, however, is much more than tourism - it is your (the community's) Place and Story.

MEDICAL CENTRE

Council in consultation with the community undertook a comprehensive review of the 2013 – 2023 Community Strategic Plan (CSP) and adopted the Kojonup 2027+ SMART Possibilities Community Strategic Plan at its meeting held 25 July 2017. This document is reflective of community views, collected from targeted and comprehensive community consultation.

Running concurrently with the CSP, Council implemented a Building Assessment Framework which was adopted at the 25 July 2017 Council Meeting.

This framework defines the methodology that the Shire implements for undertaking a qualitative assessment of all Shire building assets against an agreed set of criteria to identify which assets should remain on the Shire's inventory and which assets should be considered for replacement, rationalisation/disposal or re-purposing.

Council, at the same meeting, also adopted the Asset Management Plan 2017 including 12 recommendations contained within the plan. This process also aligned with recommendations contained in the NAJA Health Precinct Report from 2016.

The Asset Management Plan (AMP) specifically states:

"The most significant recurring issue for all local government organisations is the sustainability concerns related to financing the renewal gap. Ageing community infrastructure, cumulative infrastructure renewal backlog and changing community expectations for the assets being replaced contribute to an industry wide challenge."

The Shire of Kojonup has limited resources and is the custodian of a large number of assets. Therefore, when making decisions in relation to infrastructure assets, the Shire is committed to the philosophy of renewing assets before acquiring new assets. In addition, where possible, rationalising and consolidating assets that are no longer used or do not provide the agreed level of service.

In relation to the building of a new medical centre, Council has to ensure that sufficient funds are set aside for whole of life costs including building renewal and operating costs over the effective life of the new asset which could be upwards of 50 years. In this case, the Council will be reliant on annual rental and ratepayer funds to meet these requirements.

Such considerations may be balanced by demonstrated community need however if the current Medical centre is able to expand its existing premises the necessity to seek additional funds is not required.

There will be the ongoing need for a physical building and Council has to consider whether funding can be found and what the ongoing cost implications to rate payers would be of building a new facility as opposed to significantly improving the existing site at a much reduced cost.

Based on previous quantity survey costings (on an approx 300sq m commercial building) Council will need to secure \$1.4 million in addition to Mr Church's bequest to build a new Medical Centre on a Greenfield site that complies with Australian Standards.

A minimum of \$40,000 per annum would need to be set aside for Asset Management to cover building maintenance/renewal for a new \$2 million building.

If Council does not borrow \$1.4 million specifically for a new Medical Centre the net effect to the Long Term Financial Plan is annual savings of \$140,000 for years 1 - 10 (the equivalent of an annual rate rise of 3.78%) before any other budget items aligned to the Community Strategic Plan are considered.

A unanimous Council decision in April 2015 included a commitment to review Aged Care, Medical and Health Services and Infrastructure in the 2018/19 financial year at which time all of the above will be duly considered.

Kojonup Youth



LANDCARE UPDATE

WEEDY WATTLE REMOVAL DAY

A few volunteers joined the Shire of Kojonup, on Wednesday 7 February 2018, to remove weedy wattle species from the area bounded by Tunney, Soldier and the Old Rubbish Tip roads. Over 6 Ha of the varieties Acacia pycnantha (Australian Golden Wattle), Acacia decurrens (Black Wattle),

Acacai iteaphylla (Flinders Range Wattle) and Acacia longifolia ssp. Longifolia (Sydney Golden Wattle) as well as a few garden plants and Tagasaste (Tree Lucerne) were routed from the reserve.

Many thanks to Sue O'Halloran, Chris Evans and Cr Ned Radford for diligently hand-sawing and chainsawing weeds as well as Marina Murray and the garden crew from the Shire of Kojonup for the equipment and extra people-power.

GRANT MONEY COMING KOJONUP'S WAY

The Shire of Kojonup has been successful in obtaining funding from the Western Australian Government's State NRM Program, supported by Royalties for Regions, to revegetate and infill areas with native plant varieties on David McFall's Temple Farm. Over 15 Ha of farmland will be planted, with an aim to 'manage erosion and create new distributed and connected habitat linkages higher in the landscape'. Incorporated in the funding is the participation of students in the School National Tree Day on Wednesday 27 June

More funding has been received from the Australian Governments National Landcare Program's 20 Million Trees. The 20 Million Trees Program is part of the national stream of the National Landcare Program, and has four strategic objectives:

- 20 Million Trees 20 million trees and associated understorey planted by 2020.
- Environmental Conservation support local environmental outcomes by improving the extent, connectivity and condition of native vegetation that supports native species
- Community Engagement work cooperatively with the community
- **Carbon Reduction** contribute to Australia reducing its greenhouse gas emissions.

The Shire of Kojonup has been successful in securing funds to direct seed native species in an unused gravel pit along the Collie-Changerup Road and, using local Indigenous groups, to plant native species seedlings in the Old Speedway, north of the Kojonup Showgrounds.

CLEAN COMMUNITY GRANTS

Up to \$500 is available to volunteer groups or individuals that participate in the Clean Communities initiative by collecting and separating waste for recycling.

Clean Communities contributes to the objectives of the Western Australian waste strategy: Creating the Right Environment by providing collection bags to volunteer community groups.

The bags allow the community groups to enable separation of the waste they collect and are consistent with Australian Standard bin colours.

Community groups and individuals that collect waste for recycling and composting through the

program, can receive up to \$500 based on the number of bags that they fill.

NATIONAL LANDCARE PROGRAM ENVIRONMENT SMALL GRANTS

The program will provide a total of up to \$5 million in grants in 2017-18 to community, environment, and other groups to undertake eligible natural resource management activities that improve the quality of the local environment. The program will support projects that address the following National Landcare Program objective:

 to protect and conserve Australia's water, plants and animals and the ecosystems in which they live and interact, in partnership with local communities.

The intended outcomes of the program are an:

- increase in the protection, rehabilitation and restoration of environmental assets
- increase in the natural resource management community delivering biodiversity and natural resources practice.

The grant will be up to 100 per cent of eligible project expenditure.

- The minimum grant amount is \$5,000.
- The maximum grant amount is \$50,000.

The maximum grant period is 12 months.

To be eligible to apply you must:

- be a legal entity that can enter into a grant agreement with the Commonwealth
- have an Australian Business Number (ABN)
- be 18 years of age or older, if you are applying as an individual.

WA WASTE AUTHORITY SEMINAR

On Wednesday 7 February the Shire of Kojonup attended a seminar with other stakeholders in Albany on the future of waste (rubbish collection/recycling). Coordinated by the Waste Authority for Western Australia, the focus was two-fold: review what WA does successfully and secondly, to identify goals to aim for in the future.

The Government is seeking to make Western Australia into a sustainable low-waste society in which human health and the environment are valued and protected. The Western Australian Waste Strategy: Creating the Right Environment, published in 2012, set a long-term strategic direction and identified priorities for waste in the State.

The State Government is now reviewing its waste strategy and invites community consultations with stake-holders to work out how to shift our focus from limiting how much waste each household and industry creates and encouraging recycling toward identifying and developing strategies that will assist us to move toward using our recycled

waste innovatively. For example, encouraging start-up enterprises to use recycled materials in programs for Art, roadworks and in other brilliant ways.
