Sports Complex Tender

Council at its meeting held 15 May 2018

- Accepted the tender offer from Civil Kerbing Contracting Pty Ltd for a total of \$319,722.44 (including GST) for the construction of the retaining wall, ramp and stairs at the Sporting Complex in accordance with Shire of Kojonup tender specification 06/2017.
- Acknowledged that the gas bottles are to be retained in their current position.
- Allocate any unspent portion of accounts C203 and C278 to be transferred to the Sporting Facilities Reserve Account at the end of the 2017/018 financial year.

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Works commence 4 June 2018 over a 13 week staged construction period to enable Complex access. Completion date of 31 August 2018.

REGULATORY SERVICES

KEVIN O'HALLORAN MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL

Remedial work to repair a section of the pool concrete floor where a water leak was discovered and replacement of some sections of sealant to construction joints, has now been completed by Councils appointed contractor, Wetdeck Pools.

Two hydrostatic valves have also been installed in the pool floor which will enable proper emptying of the pool to undertake maintenance work such as repair or replacement of defective tiles and repainting of the pool which is generally carried out every 5-7 years.

The valves also enable us to control the level of ground water surrounding the pool walls and underneath the pool floor which is imperative when emptying the pool to ensure we equalise the pressure inside and outside the pool before emptying so as to not cause undue pressure and resultant structural damage of the concrete pool floor, often referred to as "floating" which was evident in one section of flooring recently checked for water leaks.

It's planned to repaint the pool as part of our winter maintenance schedule prior to commencement of the next swimming season.

A consultant's report has also been received following an assessment of the condition of the concrete walls and floors of both the main pool and toddlers pool. The report indicates that both pools which were built in 1969, are showing some signs of deterioration, but are generally in good condition for their age. The report will be used as a guiding document for Council in deciding the extent to which any upgrade or refurbishment of the pools may be carried out in the near future.

After a most successful first season our Swimming Pool Manager Gavin Bunbury is currently enjoying a well-deserved break holidaying overseas before returning for the new season which will commence the first week in November.





