COUNCIL BRIEFS

Sports Precinct – Stage 2

A concept design workshop was held in the Sporting Complex on 25 June between Councillors and user groups to consider options for the upgrading of key sporting facilities. A grant application will be submitted in September for the major items. Concepts being developed include:

- Upgrade netball court area (covered roof and court surface);
- Improve football oval lighting;
- Playground and outdoor gym structures;
- Improve kitchen facilities;
- Improve audio-visual equipment; and
- Extend toddler pool shade structure.

Robust discussions and a project designed with key users will ensure that the upgraded facilities serve the needs of Kojonup now and into the future.

Council extends its appreciation to past members of the Potts Committee and Building Maintenance Coordinator- Paul Retallack for the work undertaken to install lighting of the Potts Statue and walk bridge.

'Be Connected' IT information session

ST JOHN AND CBH WORK TOGETHER TO SAVE LIVES

The community of Kojonup received a life-saving defibrillator courtesy of CBH and the grain growers of Western Australia, in a partnership with St John WA's Community First Responder program. The defibrillator provides victims of sudden cardiac arrest with a much better chance of survival and empowers people to potentially save someone's life in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest.



The device is very easy to use even if you haven't got any knowledge of first aid training. A defibrillator is a device which delivers a therapeutic dose of electrical energy to a person's heart when it has stopped pumping.

The new defibrillator is facilitated via St John WA's Community First Responder (CFR) program, a service that aims to get defibrillators to cardiac arrest victims in the vital minutes before an ambulance arrives and the defibrillators will be available to the Community 24/7.

CBH Group Chairman Wally Newman said the funding was part of a total \$250,000 donated to 13 different charities through the co-operative's Harvest Mass Management Scheme (HMMS). The HMMS was developed in conjunction with Main Roads WA, seeking to reduce the frequency of overloaded grain trucks arriving at CBH receival sites. CBH is committed to safer roads and supporting rural communities, and through HMMS, growers are extending their support for charities that play a key role in their backyard.

Community First Responder is a St John program that enables community members to provide help before an ambulance arrives. The First Responder system is operating in 3,500 locations across Western Australia and continues to grow.



Have Your Say On The Future Of Road Safety In WA

The Shire of Kojonup would like to encourage all community members to take part in the upcoming consultation process which will help shape the next state road safety strategy for Western Australia. This is an important step in the journey towards zero deaths and serious injuries.

The consultation process calls on the community to imagine zero deaths on Western Australian roads. This is an opportunity to help set the agenda for the future and save the lives of drivers, passengers, motorcyclists, cyclists and pedestrians.

The Road Safety Commission is asking all Western Australians to think about your loved ones and reflect on what you are prepared to do to support to improve road safety. Your input will guide the Road Safety Council when making the draft recommendations to the State Government.

Last year more than 2,200 people were killed or seriously injured on our roads. About 70% of crashes involve someone just like you or me, making a mistake, being distracted or having a lapse in judgement.

Kojonup Visitor Centre, Counter

If you've been into the Visitor Centre recently you may have noticed that stage one of the work has commenced in installing the new Visitor Centre Counter. Last month part of the original counter was removed and given to the Men's Shed to make way for the new counter to be put in with the carpet from this area also removed. The next stage is for the electrical cabling works to be completed and the remaining carpet together with the second portion of the original counter removed before the floor covering can be installed. For this work to be completed the Visitor Centre may be required to be closed and community and visitors will be advised accordingly if this is the case.

FERAL CATS 'OFFICIALLY' DECLARED A PEST SPECIES IN WA



Four years ago, a meeting of the state and commonwealth Environment Ministers endorsed a national declaration of feral cats as pests. As part of this declaration the various jurisdictions agreed to review their arrangements as to how they classify and manage feral cats.

WA has now officially declared feral cats a pest in an effort to protect vulnerable native wildlife from extinction. This means further funds can be accessed to ensure strategic management of feral cats within public and private lands.

Sharp Rush Demonstration Sites Update

In 2017 the Natural Resource Management Advisory Committee set up demonstration sites for Sharp Rush Control along the Collie-Changerup Road and Kojonup-Broomehill Road. These sites were sprayed in September 2017 with Glyphosate 360 Bioactive (10/100L) and Pulse (2/1000L), and again in 2019. Most plants have died but the sites will be re-visited again this year as there are seedlings and some re-sprouting to control.

Citrus Gall Wasp

Citrus Gall Wasp, a pest of citrus trees in commercial orchards and home gardens, arrived in WA in 2013 and is spreading rapidly. This wasp poses a threat to the citrus industry in WA.

While the wasp has only been found in the Perth Metropolitan area to date, we are keen to keep this pest out of commercial orchards for as long as possible and require the assistance of your residents to do this.

Residents are encouraged to check their trees and use the department's MyPestGuide Reporter app (mypestguide.agric.wa.gov.au/reporter) to report its presence or absence. These reports help us to keep track of the wasps spread.

The wasp could move into your area on infested trees from the Perth Metropolitan area. It is important to keep a close eye on any recently purchased or relocated trees and act quickly if galls appear.

REGULATORY SERVICES

Lot 85 John Street – Surveying Works

The Shire has engaged the services of licensed surveyors 35 Degrees South to undertake surveying work to assist with planning for a future subdivision of Lot 85 John Street. This requires consideration of servicing, specifically the provision of sewer. The surveyors, along with Water Corporation representatives, will be accessing sewer manholes to check pipe levels. These works are planned to be conducted during the week from the **8** to the **12 July 2019**, with general feature surveys of the site and downstream drainage infrastructure also being collected during this time.

Ratepayers who are the holder of a Pensioner Concession Card, State Seniors Card or Commonwealth Seniors Health Care Card may be eligible for a rebate on current rate and emergency service levy charges. The rebate percentage will vary dependent upon individual circumstances and which cards are held.

To be eligible you must be the holder of one the abovementioned cards, have been the owner or part owner of the property as at 1st July and you must live at the property. Furthermore you must be registered with the Shire.





Landmark Local Government Reform Brings Councils into the 21st Century

Thursday, 27 June 2019 – Media Statement

- New reforms passed by Parliament will see more local government information available online
- All candidates for the 2019 local government elections will be required to do an induction
- Third major piece of local government reform legislation for McGowan Government

Landmark local government reforms passed by State Parliament will bring councils into the 21st century as the first reforms resulting from the Local Government Act review.

These reforms target key priority areas identified by the community and local government sector to better prepare council members for their challenging role, strengthen governance, empower councils to communicate with residents using modern technology and expand the amount of information available to the public online.

Commencing at the 2019 ordinary local government elections in October, all candidates will be required to have completed an online induction. This free, online module will be available on the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries' website in July.

Building the capacity of council members further, all council members will be required to complete a training program following their election covering key areas such as conflicts of interest, understanding financial reports and budgets, and serving on council.

Reforms will also:

- Improve standards of behaviour through a mandatory code of conduct for council members and candidates;
- Introduce new standards for CEO recruitment and performance management to help elected members select a CEO and assess their performance;
- Provide clarity for elected members to manage real and perceived conflicts of interest related to gifts; and
- Require local governments to publish information on their website such as local laws, approved council policies and all documents contained within a meeting agenda allowing instant access to council information for everyone 24/7.

Comments attributed to Local Government Minister David Templeman:

"The McGowan Government is committed to transforming local government by empowering local governments to better deliver for the community.

"This first set of reforms will ensure that all council members are equipped to take on their vital but challenging role, and that local government is able to leverage on modern technology to communicate with the public and ratepayers alike.

"The public has high expectations of government at all levels and these reforms represent an important step forward in making local government agile, smart and inclusive.

"The McGowan Government has achieved more reform in local government in two years than the Barnett Government did in eight and a half years.

"I am committed to delivering to Western Australians a modern, responsive and effective local government system."

The draft Strategy, identifies high priority infrastructure investments and regulatory improvements to help enhance efficiency, safety and economic growth of our key agricultural regions.

Specific infrastructure projects proposed in the Strategy will be subject to further cost benefit analysis over time, with ongoing input from industry required.

The Strategy identifies 10 key challenges relating to the movement of high volume agricultural freight in the project area throughout the Mid West, Wheatbelt, Great Southern and Goldfields-Esperance. These challenges are addressed by five key methods.

Illegal Dumping



Two recent media releases from the office of Hon Stephen Dawson MLC, Minister for Environment; Disability Services; Electoral Affairs, indicated that hefty fines had been imposed for illegal dumping and littering, by six men resulting in fines totalling \$34,000 plus court cost (\$16,000 in fines for dumping and littering offences in a known hotspot north-east of Perth and \$18,000, for illegally dumping waste in State Forest in the Perth Hills).

Covert surveillance was used to capture four men, each driving on separate occasions last year with vehicles loaded with waste. On each occasion, Department of Water and Environmental Regulation inspectors discovered the waste discarded at a site in Jandabup.

In the second case, the court heard the men were employed to dispose of the contents and fittings from a Northbridge restaurant which had closed down. Internal security camera footage from the restaurant persons removing the shop's contents and fittings on January 19, 2018. A few weeks later, on February 9, 2018, Water Corporation staff discovered discarded waste within a priority one drinking water source area in State Forest near Albany Highway.

The officers photographed the waste and contacted the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. An investigation by the department traced the waste back to the restaurant and notified the owner. The owner confirmed that the waste was from his restaurant and that he had paid to have it removed and legally however, the pair opted to illegally dispose of the waste.

Environment Minister Stephen Dawson said the fines should act as a serious warning that offenders will face significant penalties. "The use of cameras and surveillance are just two of the tools used to protect our environment against illegal dumping, and these convictions and fines should serve as a warning.

"People illegally dumping may think they are saving money, however, it will ultimately cost them a lot more when they are caught and convicted by the courts. "These fines send a strong message that offenders will not get away with it lightly.

"Waste has the potential to cause health hazards and environmental harm, and should be disposed of appropriately."
