## COUNCIL BRIEFS

### Local Government Elections 2019

Local government elections play an important role in Western Australia's democratic system. Ordinary local government elections are held on the third Saturday in October every two years. This year, **Elections will be held on Saturday, 19 October 2019**, if more nominations are received than vacant positions. The Shire of Kojonup runs "In-Person" voting elections so please ensure you are enrolled to vote. For more information on how to enrol please click this link: <https://www.aec.gov.au/enrol/>

Amendments to the new *Local Government Act 1995* require existing and new councillors to complete training within the first 12 months following the election. The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries has excellent reference material including Fact Sheets for individuals who are considering nominating as candidates. <https://www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/localgovernment/forcommunity/Pages/Council-Elections.aspx>

Candidates can lodge completed nominations papers in the prescribed form, with the Returning Officer, CEO Mr Rick Mitchell-Collins from 5 September 2019. Nominations close at 4.00pm on Thursday 12 September 2019.

The Shire of Kojonup will have four vacancies with current Councillors Judith Warland, Jill Mathwin, Graham Hobbs and Ian Pedler all completing four year terms however, they are each eligible to renominate.

This event will not proceed if registrations are not received.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM

### Funding Boost to Support Community Sport in the Regions

The McGowan Government announced this week that they are increasing Active Regional Communities (ARC) grants program allocation from \$125,000 to \$180,000 to assist country athletes and a range of sporting initiatives to regional communities.

The program works to increase community participation in sport, build the capacity of local people involved in running sport and recreation in their communities, and help localities host regional competitions.

ARC grants can be used to support and stage initiatives such as:

- Hosting events;
- Conducting programs;
- Coaching clinics;
- Volunteer training;
- Coaching accreditation courses, and
- Referee or umpire accreditation courses.

### Grants of up to \$5,000 is available with applications now open.

### Warning Over 'Free Groceries' Scammers



An urgent warning has been issued to WA shoppers over a sophisticated Facebook scam involving the Woolworths chain. Recent media reports have noted that scammers have been targeting Western Australian shoppers through an unauthorised Woolworths Fans Facebook page where fake posts offering the chance to win free groceries for a year and other giveaways have been appearing in exchange for liking and sharing the page to others. The site has over

25,000 followers and is not affiliated with Woolworths

Fake posts like this can be online phishing scams that seek to imitate well-known brands to trick people into thinking they are dealing directly with the company (in this case Woolworths). By "liking" or "sharing" the post to others you could be compromising your own and friends' data security as these sites can obtain personal information to make direct contact.

Woolworths have confirmed that this is not an authorised Woolworths Facebook page and is not affiliated with them in any way. We encourage everyone to be vigilant of online phishing scams, and to never pass on your personal or banking details to any unsolicited communications.

# KOJONUP NIGHTFIELDS



“The Night Fields 5-week pilot program has been very well received in Kojonup and despite some very cold and sometimes wet conditions, was well attended. In total 44 young people participated in the program experiencing sports that some have never had the opportunity to play before. This figure does not include any under school aged children accompanying parents that may have joined in on the day. The final session on Friday was followed with a celebratory food and music with many of the parents joining in to enjoy the food and social chatter,” Kojonup Shire President, Ronnie Fleay said.

The Friday afternoon sessions quickly developed into a fun, structured social gathering of children who not only were picking up new sporting skills and being physically active but more importantly looked like they were having a great time. Each week they also get the opportunity to win some giveaways including a signed football, by Stephen Michael.

The program would have been difficult to implement without the support and involvement of Kojonup District High School staff and Kojonup's sporting clubs like Squash and Hockey who were quick to respond to the call and provide coaches and access to their equipment.

Week 4 of the program provided a bonus for the young participants with a surprise visit organised by the Kojonup Squash Club by professional WA squash coach, Mike Cornish who undertook an afternoon coaching session with the kids.

The Shire would like to thank local businesses; Kojonup IGA and the Kojonup Bakery who also got behind the program, donating some of the food to feed the very hungry mouths each week as well as the involvement and support of our local police for the program.

Moving forward, the Shire has met with the Stephen Michael Foundation and the working group to evaluate the outcomes and benefits of the pilot program and will be considering ways to further involve the community in order to enable the program to continue.

More information about the program will be released in the next edition of E-News.

Here are some stats from program:

- 14.25% of the children attended every session with 28.5% attend 3 or more sessions
- Every week there was a child who had not attended before
- Boys still dominated the program making up 64% of the numbers but it was great to see that over 1/3 (36%) were girls.

## WORKS AND SERVICES

The Parks and Gardens crews have been busy with the following:

- The softfall at Apex Park will be completed on Wednesday 10 July. This was scheduled to be completed prior to school holidays but unfortunately could not be installed in wet weather.



- The gardening crew are hedging the Rose Maze and Mysine hedge, with our wonderful volunteers undertaking the pruning and tying up of the climbing roses.
- In conjunction with NRM/Landcare 4000 seedlings have been received which will be used to plant in our sundry reserves in town, Old Landfill, existing landfill, road verges etc.
- We have started and will continue re-vegetating with an assortment of native plants, along Tunney Rd from Soldier Rd to Mather Rd.
- The Old Landfill site has been sprayed and ripped and will be planted with an assortment of re-vegetation native species.
- Planning and works are being undertaken at the Barracks, pruning trees, removing unwanted plants and tidying garden beds.
- We will be trialling a new herbicide which is made from natural ingredients, Localsafe, in the mainstreet as an alternative to Glyphosate.
- The cemetery area has been sprayed for weeds.

## REGULATORY SERVICES

### Burning Garden Refuse

There are many methods of hazard reduction available to residents. Reduction of fuel does not have to be as drastic as removing all vegetation. Burning garden refuse is one option available at certain times of the year.



Garden refuse may be burnt without a permit now, subject to:

- A 5m wide area clear of flammable material surrounding the pile;
- Only one heap being burnt at any one time;
- At least one capable person stays with the fire until it is completely extinguished;
- There being a means of extinguishing the fire available at all times (eg garden hose, knapsack spray or fire unit);
- Neighbours are informed of your intention to burn;
- The smoke does not cause a nuisance to neighbours;
- The smoke does not create a traffic hazard;
- Household or commercial waste, or any noxious materials are not burned.

**Council Rates**

*Rates notices will be posted out on 26 July 2019*

**Instalment Options**

*Ratepayers will have the opportunity to pay by one of the following methods.*

- *Payment in full by the due date.*
- *Payment by 2 instalments (NB: The first instalment will include all arrears unpaid as at the due date). The minimum instalment amount is \$200.*
- *Payment by 4 instalments (NB: The first instalment will include all arrears unpaid as at the due date).*

**Alternative Arrangements**

*Ratepayers experiencing financial hardship in paying rates and charges should contact Council's Rates Section prior to the due date to discuss alternative arrangements. NB Interest will be charged on outstanding rates at the overdue interest rate.*

**Pensioners**

*If you meet the following criteria as at 1st July of this financial year, you may be entitled to register your property for a concession on council rates and Emergency Services Levy (E.S.L.):-*

- *You are the owner or part owner of the property as at 1st July.*
- *You live in the property*
- *You hold either a current pensioner concession card or state concession card - as at 1st July.*

*Depending upon individual circumstances concessions available are:*

- *Rebates of up to 50% of current council rates and E.S.L.*
- *Deferment, without interest, of up to 100% of current rates*

*Note: This concession scheme is funded by the Western Australian State Government under the provisions of the Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992 (as amended). Concessions on Council Rates are not currently available to Senior Card Holders.*

*In order to obtain a concession on your current rates account, you MUST register at the Council Administration office before the due date for payment, shown on the Annual Rate Notice.*

# Chlorpyrifos

On 24 June 2019, it was [announced that there was a proposed decision](#) to remove all uses of chlorpyrifos in domestic and home garden products, and in certain public spaces such as parks and footpaths. The proposed decision is to suspend uses of these products after 28 days and cancel these uses after three months.

## The issue

Chlorpyrifos is an insecticide used to control different kinds of pests, including ants, termites and mosquitos. Products containing chlorpyrifos are used in and around the home, in home gardens, in public spaces, and in agriculture.

Based on credible scientific evidence of risks to human health and the environment, [we have been taking progressive action](#) by restricting the use patterns of products containing chlorpyrifos for a number of years.

On 24 June 2019, we announced a proposed decision to remove all uses of chlorpyrifos in domestic and home garden products, and in certain public spaces such as parks and footpaths. The proposed decision is to suspend uses of these products after 28 days and cancel these uses after three months.

This decision is the result of a comprehensive review of the chemical's health and environmental impacts.

Chlorpyrifos products can continue to be used in agricultural settings and under permit only if used according to label instructions. This includes the appropriate use of protective equipment.

We are consulting with the agriculture and biosecurity sectors ahead of our assessment of these use patterns. This will help us more fully understand the critical uses of chlorpyrifos before we make a Proposed Regulatory Decision on these categories. A critical use is one with no other alternative.
