### OUTCOMES FROM 17 SEPTEMBER 2019, COUNCIL MEETING:

### Disability Access and Inclusion Plan - Review and Committee Renewal

- 1. A Disability Access & Inclusion Advisory Committee (DAIC) be established consisting of elected members and community members. The Committee to meet a minimum of twice yearly to meet its terms of reference and also be requested to:
  - (a) Urgently review the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) in accordance with the legislative requirements;
  - (b) Update the DAIP Implementation Plan with new strategies and progress existing strategies; and
  - (c) Report back to the Council on points (a) and (b) before 30 June 2020.
- 2. The minor amendments made to wording and content of the 2014-2019 DAIP (as per attachment 10.1.1) be adopted;
- 3. The progress assessment of the DAIP Implementation Plan (traffic light indicators as per attachment 10.1.2) be endorsed; and



4. The terms of reference for the Disability Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee (DAIC) be as follows:

### <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of the DAIC is to advice the Council on:

- Technical/working advice relating to the implementation of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP), including seeking access to funding opportunities;
- Community and agency feedback relating to the implementation of the DAIP;
- The review and reporting of the DAIP;
- Issues relating to disability access and inclusion in the Shire; and
- Methods to raise awareness and community input about matters relating to disability access and inclusion in the Shire.

### Membership

Membership of the DAIC will be set at nine (9) as follows:

- Community members the community will be represented by up to three community members with relevant interest and experience;
- Community organisations up to four Carers/Service providers who work with people covered by the DAIP and will be represented by one representative of each;
- Elected members the Council will be represented by at least one Councillor, and a proxy delegate;
- Chief Executive Officer or delegate will act as Chair;
- Council staff Council staff will attend as observers/administration support only including one staff member from Community Services and one from Works and Services.

#### Meetings

Meetings of the DAIC will ordinarily take place on a six monthly basis in April and October.

  - Playground and outdoor gym:
    - Indicative Cost Estimate = \$489,300 ex GST;

  - Kitchen upgrade:
    - o Indicative Cost Estimate = +- \$250,000 ex GST; and
  - Audio-visual equipment:

The paper outlines key issues facing Western Australia across 11 areas in transitioning to the 'net zero emissions in WA by 2050' target recently announced by the State Government.

# FREE ONLINE TRAINING OPPORTUNITY: NATIONAL PRINCIPLES FOR CHILD SAFE ORGANISATIONS

The Australian Government through the Human Rights Commission has released a series of free online training courses to help groups understand the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations.

The principles were developed by the Commission and other entities and are aimed at people working or volunteering in all organisations of various sizes that engage with children and young people.

The modules support the training required to implement the ten National Child Safe Principles endorsed by COAG in February and include an introductory module that gives an overview of the development and content of the National Principles and separate modules on each of the ten National Principles.

The <u>11 e-learning modules</u>, are designed to be used on a desktop computer, laptop or tablet. Each module takes around 20 minutes to complete.

#### WESTERN AUSTRALIA 'I NEED AN INTERPRETER CARD'

Did you know that the WA Interpreter Card is free and available to anyone who finds it difficult to communicate in English. These cards are used to inform government agencies that you need an interpreter and in what language.



Western Australians who may require assistance to communicate effectively include people who are Deaf or hard of hearing, Aboriginal people and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

The Shire of Kojonup supports a linguistically diverse community and under our Disability Access and Inclusion Plan seeks to ensure that members of our community with limited competence in the English language do not find it a barrier to accessing services. Proposal to rectify Westcourt Road anomalies (Dedication of land as road/Closure of road)

Notice is hereby given that the Shire of Kojonup, in accordance with sections 56 and 58 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* (Act), proposes to simultaneously:

- 1) Dedicate the existing road formation known as Westcourt Road as road; and
- 2) Close the Westcourt Road Reserve in its current location.

Sections of Westcourt Road that are currently located on Reserve 16076 will become designated road reserve and sections of existing road reserve not containing any road formation will become part of Reserve 16076. The sections of existing road reserve that contain Westcourt Road formation will not change.

Subject to any submissions received and a further report to the Council, a request will be made to the Minister for Lands to consider the proposal to rectify the Westcourt Road boundary anomalies. A licensed surveyor's drawing of the proposed changes is available at the Shire Administration Office and members of the public are invited to comment before the Council determines the proposal.

The Shire of Kojonup has received an application to use and/or develop land for the following purpose and public comments are invited:

Proposal: To continue the existing sand extraction activities at Lot 104 (No. 465) Mission Road Cherry Tree Pool.


