13 <u>LATE ITEMS</u>

• Fire Period Signs

Rob Cowie reported that he is progressing with the new signs. Has had discussions
with Manager of Corporate and Community Services regarding quotes and
integration with the electronic signage for the Shire.

• Kojonup Volunteer Fire Shed

- Rob Cowie raised that he along with Paul Retallack and other Shire staff have been looking at the possibility of moving the Kojonup 2.4 fire truck shed. Currently it is situated at the Works Depot with access from Bilston St. The preferred option is constructing a new shed (2 bays preferred) in the South West Boundary of the Works & Services Depot with direct access onto Blackwood Rd utilising LGGS funding. The new location alleviates the need to gain access into Council's Depot but allows access to power, water, sewer and improved off street parking. Rob will progress this over the coming months.
- The possibility of requesting a new Fire truck was raised with initial suggestions to locate this towards the north part of the Shire. Bob Francis suggested that we would be better served if this was co-located in the Kojonup shed as this would be utilised for all fires in the Shire rather than just the fires to the North. This will be considered in the fire shed discussion with Department of Fire & Emergency Services.

Bushfire Radio Tower

- Ned Radford requested that the Shire provide the BFAC with an update on the Radio Tower progress.
 - Rob Cowie to organise with MCCS and relevant parties.

• Correct Paperwork

- Rob Cowie raised that since the introduction of the Fire Incident Reporting System (FIRS), there has been a lack of 'Primary' reports lodged with DFES. The 'Primary' reports need to be completed for all incidents that are attended by the Volunteer Bushfire Brigades. Once completed by the FCO for the primary brigade, they are responsible for submitting this to DFES. This can be done by fax, email or bringing them into the Shire office for staff to submit.
 - If we report all incidents that happen, we will increase the chances of receiving funding for the new truck and shed.
- All conditions on Fire Permits need to be adhered to. This will minimise the chances
 of escaping fires this season. It was raised that all Fire Permits need to be requested
 prior to the morning Radio checks. Any that are requested after 6:45am should be
 refused.

There is currently work happening on producing an online Fire Permit. This will comply better with the Shire's record keeping requirements. This will be investigated over the next season and hopefully implemented for the 2019/20 season.

• Dual Fire Control Officers

The Shire of West Arthur have requested that one of the designated FCO's from their Shire be nominated within our Shire as a Dual FCO.
 In the past, this authority has been delegated to the CEO for ratification, but since 2014 these requests have been submitted to Council for their approval.
 It is proposed that the BFAC recommend to Council that the approval for Dual FCO's be reinstated as a Delegated Authority for the CEO, with consultation from the Current Chief BFCO and Presiding Member of the BFAC, to approve.

COMMITTEE DECISION

Moved Ross Fryer-Smith, seconded Paul Retallack that the Bushfire Advisory Committee recommend to Council that the approval of requests from neighbouring Shires Dual Fire Control Officers' be reinstated as a Delegated Authority for the CEO, with consultation from the Current Chief BFCO and Presiding Member of BFAC, to approve.
