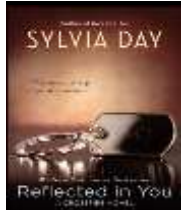

Hope to see you all here soon.

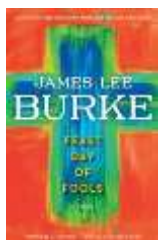

New Books to our Library



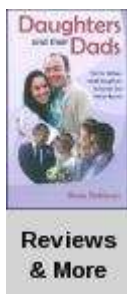

TIPS ON HOW TO RECYCLE RIGHT

Good news, Plastic shopping bags *are* recyclable, as long as they are loose.

For safety reasons, staff at the recycling center cannot open plastic bags containing recyclables as the contents may be dangerous or dirty and these bags have to be sent to landfill. So ensure that all your items are kept loose, in the wise words of Matthew Webb, Kojonup's Material Recovery Centre Manager, "the looser the better".

KEEPING OF ROOSTERS WITHIN THE TOWN SITE

In response to a number of recent complaints relating to noise caused by crowing roosters the following information is provided for residents of the Shire of Kojonup.

Councils Local Laws relating to "Keeping of Poultry & Pigeons" restricts the keeping of roosters within the town site and may only be kept with the written approval of Council. Where such permission is granted, certain limitations or conditions may apply. The Council may also refuse an application to keep a rooster and revoke any existing approval if a rooster is causing a nuisance.

If council officers receive any complaints of noise caused by roosters, the matter is investigated and appropriate action is taken to resolve the matter, including advice to the owner to seek written approval from Council to keep a rooster on the property, or assistance is provided in the rehousing of the rooster.

Council officers have been successful recently in the housing of a rooster by relocating it to a farm property which is more suited to housing such birds where crowing does not cause disturbance to neighbours.
